Title: Delayed Transfers of Care relating to Mental Health for the March 2004 Census

Purpose

1. To provide the Health and Social Services Committee with a breakdown of the 267 delayed transfers of care recorded for the March 2004 census point that related to mental health, including the incidence of elderly mentally ill people. This information was requested by the Committee on 5 May 2004.

Background

2. The number of delay transfers of care recorded at the March 2004 census point was 1010. Of this figure 267 (26%) related to delays recorded on mental health wards. The following table provides a breakdown of these delays by age and delay reason category.
