To amend The Inspection of Education and Training (Wales) Regulations 2001 to introduce a six year inspection cycle from September 2004, compared to the existing 5 year cycle, with regard to the extended functions of the chief Inspector of Education and Training in Wales provided for under section 75 of the Learning and Skills Act 2000. The change is required to align with the new Common Inspection Framework being introduced by Estyn from September 2004 on which there has been full consultation.
2. To amend the specified periods for the issue of inspection reports and preparation of action plans prescribed in the 2001 Regulations to provide a single time scale whether inspection reports and action plans are required in one language or in English and Welsh. The change will mean that inspection reports must be produced within 70 working days from the completion of an inspection in every case (compared to existing provisions which prescribe 55 working days or, where it is necessary to provide a translation into Welsh or English

Currently, our guidance (in Circular $1 / 2004$ ) confirms that the level of proof for making a decision to exclude, where the exclusion is based on an accusation that the pupil has committed a criminal offence, is the criminal standard of beyond reasonable doubt. The intended effect of the regulation is to remove the excessive burdens on schools and PRUs to collect sufficient evidence to establish facts using the standard of beyond reasonable doubt. The regulations will ensure parity of legislation between Wales and England.
3. To provide that the Governing Body must consider whether an excluded pupil should be reinstated and in addition consider whether the pupil should be reinstated immediately, reinstated by a particular date or whether it would not be practical for the Governing Body to give a direction to the head teacher requiring the .
reinstatement of the pupil.
The intended effect of the regulations is to clarify the responsibility of the Governing Body to consider whether a pupil should be reinstated, regardless of the practicality of reinstatement.
4. The accompanying guidance will clarify existing regulation regarding the responsibility of the Governing Body to call a metingof the Pupil Discipline Committee where a pupil has been excluded for more than 15 days within a term. The guidance clarifies that where further exclusions take place within the term, the Pupil Discipline Committee is required to meet in relation to each
exclusion to assess the effectiveness of the support plans put in place for that pupil. The intended effect of the regulation is to provide the Pupil Discipline Committee with an opportunity to review the support plans for pupils who are experiencing difficulties to ensure that the support provided is appropriate and effective.
