## **Cwestiynau i'r Prif Weinidog Questions to the First Minister**

### **Datblygu Polisi Policy Development**

**C1 Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** A wnaiff y Prif Weinidog ddatganiad am ei gyfrifoldeb dros ddatblygu polisi yn y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol? (OAQ22312)

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Yr wyf yn gyfrifol am ddatblygu polisiau a chydlynau materion trawsbynciol. Yr wyf hefyd yn cadeirio is-bwylgorau'r Cabinet ar ddatblygu cynaliadwy, Corus, a Chymru a'r byd. Yr wyf yn cydlynau polisiau mewn perthynas â'r Gogledd, ac yr wyf yn arwain ar y berthynas rhwng Cymru a gweddill y Deyrnas Unedig.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** Yn ogystal â'r cyfrifoldebau penodol hynny, fel Prif Weinidog, yr ydych yn gyfrifol am yr holl feysydd polisi. Beth yw eich barn am y sefyllfa ym maes polisi iechyd? Dywed y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol fod y gost ychwanegol o hyd at £15 miliwn sydd ei angen ar gyfer ailstrwythuro'r gwasanaeth iechyd yn gost niwtral; dywed y meddyg parchus, cydnabyddedig Dr Maurice Slevin fod y gwasanaeth iechyd drwy Brydain ar fin hunanddinistro; mae prif weithredwyr ymddiriedolaethau yng Nghymru yn derbyn mwy o gyflog nag yn unrhyw le arall ym Mhrydain. A dderbyniwch fod y sefyllfa allan o reolaeth ac mai chi sydd â'r cyfrifoldeb o ddatrys y *shambles* hwn?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Mae'n hawdd defnyddio geiriau di-ystyr fel *shambles*. Pan af o amgylch ysbtyai Cymru, gwelaf fod y staff yn gweithio'n galed a'u bod yn cael mantais o'r buddsoddiadau a wnaethom: mae nifer o staff ychwanegol yn cael eu hyfforddi ar hyn o bryd, a bydd codiadau syfranol yn y nifer o ddoctoriaid a nysrys pan fyddant wedi gorffen eu hyfforddiant. Mae bron pob ysbty yr ymwelaf ag ef, fel yr ysbtyai ym Mhen-y-bont ar Ogwr a Threforus y bu imi ymweld â hwy yn ddiweddar, yn manteisio ar y buddsoddiadau enfawr a wnaed—weithiau

**Q1 Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** Will the First Minister make a statement on his responsibility for policy development in the National Assembly? (OAQ22312)

**The First Minister:** I am responsible for developing policies and for co-ordinating cross-cutting issues. I also chair the Cabinet sub-committees on sustainable development, Corus, and Wales and the world. I co-ordinate policies in relation to north Wales, and I lead on the relations between Wales and the rest of the United Kingdom.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** In addition to those specific responsibilities, as First Minister, you are responsible for all policy areas. What is your view on the situation that exists in relation to health policy? The Minister for Health and Social Services states that the additional cost of up to £15 million, which is needed to restructure the health service, is cost neutral, while the acclaimed and respected Dr Maurice Slevin states that the NHS throughout the UK is about to self-destruct. The chief executives of trusts in Wales receive higher salaries than their counterparts elsewhere in Britain. Do you accept that the situation is out of control and that it is your responsibility to sort this shambles out?

**The First Minister:** It is easy to use meaningless words such as 'shambles'. When I visit the hospitals of Wales, I find that staff are working hard and that they are benefiting from the investments that we have made: more staff are currently being trained, and there will be a massive increase in the number of doctors and nurses when they complete their training. Almost every hospital that I visit, such as those in Bridgend and Morriston which I visited recently, has benefited as a result of these massive investments—£10 million here, £2 million

£10 miliwn, dro arall £2 filiwn—er mwyn gwella'r cyfleusterau yn ein hysbytai.

**Alun Pugh:** The protection of children has been an important aspect of policy development; we have created the Children's Commissioner for Wales. Do you share my concerns about the covert use of camera mobile phones in children's changing rooms, and will you consider offering guidance to local authorities to prevent paedophiles from abusing this latest piece of information and communications technology?

**The First Minister:** I want to consult with the four chief constables of Wales on that matter to see if they share the same concerns as you, Alun. I have read about your concerns in the press, and other people have made similar comments. Before I take this matter up officially, I will consult with specialists in the four police forces in Wales who deal with matters relating to paedophiles.

**Arweinydd yr Wrthblaid (Ieuan Wyn Jones):** Sylwais eich bod yn mynd ar daith o amgylch ysbytai Cymru o bryd i'w gilydd, fel pob Aelod o'r Cynulliad. Yr wyf yn siŵr eich bod yn gwybod y cyhoeddwyd heddiw fod prif weithredwyr ysbytai yng Nghymru yn ennill cyflogau o £110,000 y flwyddyn, sydd yn uwch nag unrhyw ran arall o'r Deyrnas Gyfunol. A allwch gyflawnhau'r cyflogau hynny, ac, os gallwch, beth yw eich neges i nyrsys Cymru sydd wedi derbyn codiad cyflog yn unol â chwyddiant yn unig?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Ni wnaethoch ddyfynnu'r ffigur o ran codiadau cyflog y prif weithredwyr. Efallai y gallech ysgrifennu ataf gyda'r ffigur hwnnw. Ni allwch gymharu'r ffigur o ran codiadau cyflog nyrsys gyda'r ffigur o ran cyflog y prif weithredwyr: mae honno'n gymhariaeth anghywir. Pan ailddarllenwch yr hyn yr ydych newydd ei ddweud, bydd yn rhaid ichi dderbyn hynny. Mae'n bwysig ein bod yn gosod canllawiau i'r ymddiriedolaethau iechyd ynglŷn â maint cyflogau eu prif weithredwyr. Fodd bynnag, eu cyfrifoldeb hwy yw reciwtio prif weithredwyr a thalu cyflogau sydd yn deilwng yn eu tyb hwy, ac sydd yn dilyn ein canllawiau. Dywed y canllawiau hynny y dylid ystyried cyflogau staff wrth osod

there—to improve the facilities in our hospitals.

**Alun Pugh:** Bu amddiffyn plant yn agwedd bwysig ar ddatblygu polisi; bu inni greu'r Comisiynydd Plant i Gymru. A rannwch fy mhryderon ynghylch defnyddio ffonau symudol â chamera yn y dirgel mewn ystafelloedd newid i blant, ac a wnewch ystyried cynnig cyfarwyddyd i awdurdodau lleol i atal pedoffiliaid rhag camddefnyddio'r dechnoleg gwybodaeth a chyfathrebu ddiweddaraf hon?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Dymunaf ymgynghori â phedwar prif gwnstabl Cymru ar y mater hwnnw i weld a ydynt yn rhannu'r un pryderon â chi, Alun. Yr wyf wedi darllen am eich pryderon yn y wasg, a gwnaeth eraill sylwadau tebyg. Cyn imi godi'r mater hwn yn swyddogol, ymgynghoraf ag arbenigwyr yn y pedwar heddlu yng Nghymru sy'n ymdrin â materion sy'n gysylltiedig â phedoffiliaid.

**The Leader of the Opposition (Ieuan Wyn Jones):** I noticed that you visit the hospitals of Wales from time to time, as do all Assembly Members. I am sure that you know that an announcement was made today that chief executives of hospitals in Wales are paid salaries of £110,000 per annum, which is higher than any other part of the UK. Can you justify those salaries, and, if you can, what is your message to nurses in Wales who have only been offered pay increases that are in line with inflation?

**The First Minister:** You did not quote the figure for the pay increase that chief executives received. Maybe you could write to me with that figure. You cannot compare pay increases for nurses with the chief executives' salaries: that is an erroneous comparison. If you re-read what you have just said, you would have to accept that. It is important that we set guidelines for the health trusts as to how much they pay their chief executives. However, the trusts are responsible for recruiting chief executives and paying salaries that they consider to be appropriate and that comply with our guidelines. Those guidelines state that trusts must take staff salaries into account when determining chief executives' salaries, and

**The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne):** You are on record as saying that top-up fees, and the way in which we deal with them, will be a major test for how we handle devolution when working with Westminster. You said that top-up fees are hugely important. Can you outline the details and timescale of talks that you and the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning will have with Peter Hain and Charles Clarke? Contradictory and confusing messages have been sent out to parents, students and our universities. The matter needs clarifying. Can you confirm that top-up fees will not be put on the growing list of matters that are to be kicked into touch until after the Assembly elections?

**The First Minister:** I do not know of any messages that were sent out to parents on top-up fees. The talks are underway, but it is difficult to predict when they will be completed. You need to predict the cost of transferring to a top-up system, and what the benefits and disbenefits would be in transferring responsibility for student finance.

The benefits of wider access and an excellence agenda in the Welsh higher education sector would be easier to achieve if we had control over student finances. At present we do not have that control. The cross-border flow of students—there are 21,000 full-time students from Wales studying in England, and 27,000 from England studying in Wales—has to be bottomed-out before we reach a position where we can make recommendations. The Assembly will be the first to know when we have reached a firm position, and when we have collected and agreed the facts and figures with the Department for Education and Skills.

**Arweinydd Ceidwadwyr Cymru (Nick Bourne):** Yr ydych wedi dweud ar goedd y bydd ffioedd ychwanegol, a'r modd yr ymdriniwn â hwy, yn brawf o bwys am y modd y trafodwn ddatganoli wrth weithio gyda San Steffan. Dywedasoch fod ffioedd ychwanegol yn bwysig dros ben. A allwch amlinellu manylion ac amserlen y trafodaethau a gewch chi a'r Gweinidog dros Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes gyda Peter Hain a Charles Clarke? Anfonwyd negeseuon anghyson a dryslyd at rieni a myfyrwyr ac i'n prifysgolion. Mae angen egluro'r mater hwn. A allwch gadarnhau na roddir ffioedd ychwanegol ar y rhestr gynyddol o faterion sydd i'w rhoi o'r neilltu tan ar ôl etholiadau'r Cynulliad?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Ni wn am unrhyw negeseuon a anfonwyd at rieni am ffioedd ychwanegol. Mae'r trafodaethau'n mynd rhagddynt, ond anodd yw proffwydo pa bryd y'u cwblheir. Mae angen proffwydo'r gost o drosglwyddo i system o ffioedd ychwanegol, a pha fanteision ac anfanteision a gedi wrth drosglwyddo cyfrifoldeb dros gyllid myfyrwyr.

Byddai'n haws sicrhau manteision mynediad ehangach ac agenda rhagoriaeth yn sector addysg uwch Cymru pe byddai gennym reolaeth dros gyllid myfyrwyr. Nid yw'r rheolaeth honno gennym ar hyn o bryd. Rhaid mynd at waelod y rhesymau dros y llif o fyfyrwyr sy'n croesi'r ffin—mae 21,000 o fyfyrwyr llawn-amser o Gymru yn astudio yn Lloegr, a 27,000 o Loegr yn astudio yng Nghymru—cyn y byddwn mewn sefyllfa i allu gwneud argymhellion. Y Cynulliad fydd y cyntaf i gael gwybod pan fyddwn wedi ffurfio barn bendant, a phan fyddwn wedi casglu a chytuno ar y ffeithiau a'r ffigurau gyda'r Adran Addysg a Sgiliau.

### Gwelyau mewn Cartrefi Gofal Care Home Beds

**Q2 David Melding:** Will the First Minister make a statement on the provision and availability of care home beds in Cardiff? (OAQ22329)

**C2 David Melding:** A wnaiff y Prif Weinidog ddatganiad am y ddarpariaeth o welyau mewn cartrefi gofal yng Nghaerdydd a'r nifer sydd ar gael? (OAQ22329)

**The First Minister:** Between April 2002 and January 2003, 19 care homes closed and no new care homes opened in the Care Standards Inspectorate for Wales's Cardiff region. This, along with variations to the number of beds registered in existing care homes, has resulted in a total loss of 131 beds. The current total number of beds is 2034. That is roughly a 6.5 per cent loss. None of the closures have resulted from enforcement action taken by CSIW.

**David Melding:** That was a frank answer that did not hide behind statistics. We have lost about 10 per cent of our residential homes. We have lost 10 per cent of the nursing care beds; roughly, the number of beds has dropped from 825 to 750. That is a worrying trend. There are knock-on affects, such as providing care in a hospital setting, which is much more expensive for the public purse. Is it not time for the fee levels to be reviewed in the nursing and residential home sector?

**The First Minister:** You and your party have an unhealthy obsession with the matter of fee levels, David. The fee levels taken together with the provision of services for domiciliary care is the issue. When domiciliary care is made available for people who would otherwise be in nursing or residential homes, then that would provide an alternative to nursing care homes. Probably 90 per cent of people would prefer that alternative. Sometimes domiciliary care is expensive; it can be more expensive than nursing care homes. Domiciliary care is the choice that a majority of people would make for themselves or on behalf of frailter members of their family. We aim to achieve a level playing field where choice is made on the basis of what is best for the patient, and not what numbers or statistics say what is best. That is the holy grail of managing care in the community.

**Kirsty Williams:** The statistics that you gave are similar across Wales and show that the numbers of care home beds are falling. Is it not inappropriate that the Government in London is considering fining any local

**David Melding:** Yr oedd hwnnw'n ateb gonest nad oedd yn cuddio y tu ôl i ystadegau. Yr ydym wedi colli tua 10 y cant o'n cartrefi preswyl. Yr ydym wedi colli 10 y cant o'r gwelyau gofal nyrsio; yn fras, mae nifer y gwelyau wedi gostwng o 825 i 750. Mae hwnnw'n duedd sy'n peri gofid. Ceir sgil-effeithiau, fel darparu gofal mewn ysbytai, sy'n ddrutach o lawer i'r pwrs cyhoeddus. Onid yw'n bryd adolygu lefelau'r ffioedd yn y sector cartrefi nyrsio a phreswyl?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Mae gennych chi a'ch plaid obsesiwn afiach â mater lefelau ffioedd, David. Lefelau'r ffioedd ynghyd â'r ddarpariaeth o wasanaethau ar gyfer gofal yn y cartref yw'r mater pwysig. Pan fo gofal yn y cartref ar gael ar gyfer pobl a fyddai mewn cartrefi nyrsio neu breswyl fel arall, yna byddai hynny'n cynnig dewis arall yn lle cartrefi gofal nyrsio. Mae'n debyg y byddai'n well gan 90 y cant o bobl gymryd y dewis hwnnw. Mae gofal yn y cartref yn ddrud weithiau; gall fod yn ddrutach na chartrefi gofal nyrsio. Gofal yn y cartref yw'r hyn a ddewisai'r rhan fwyaf o bobl drostynt eu hunain neu ar ran aelodau mwy eiddil o'u teulu. Ein nod yw sicrhau sefyllfa gyfartal lle y dewisir ar sail yr hyn sydd orau i'r claf, ac nid ar sail yr hyn y dywed rhifau neu ystadegau sydd orau. Dyna sy'n ddelfrydol wrth reoli gofal yn y gymuned.

**Kirsty Williams:** Mae'r ystadegau a roesoch yn debyg ledled Cymru ac yn dangos bod niferoedd y gwelyau mewn cartrefi gofal yn gostwng. Onid yw'n amhriodol bod y Llywodraeth yn Llundain yn ystyried dirwo

authority that has difficulty in placing patients in care home beds following their discharge from hospital? Should not the Assembly reject similar proposals for fining Welsh local authorities?

**The First Minister:** I understand your strong feelings on this. It is known as following the Swedish model. Normally, that is what happens when there is a Volvo in front of me. However, that system appears to work in Sweden and acts as a disincentive to local authorities and other agencies, which have the job of trying to accommodate people properly at home, or, if that is not possible, in a nursing or old people's home. There is a difference of opinion on whether or not a system of issuing fines would work in the UK. We are following one route and the Department of Health in London proposes to follow another. We have no proposals to follow either the Swedish model or its variant—the Department of Health model—in Wales.

**Owen John Thomas:** We are losing a huge number of care beds per year in Wales while hospital buildings in the Cardiff region such as the Cardiff Royal Infirmary, Sully Hospital and the Royal Hamadryad Hospital could be used for post-treatment care. Can you think of a better use for the Cardiff Royal Infirmary?

**The First Minister:** That is institutional care on a massive scale. No-one, apart from you, has proposed that the Cardiff Royal Infirmary should become a huge old people's home with 500 beds. That does not make a great deal of sense. I have never heard anyone suggest that. For example, those who have been campaigning to restore Cardiff Royal Infirmary have never suggested that; they want it to be a hospital.

You mentioned a huge loss of care home beds, but the figures that I gave indicated a loss of around 6.5 per cent in an eight-month period, which would translate into a 10 per cent loss over a 12-month period. That reduction is related to the current housing boom. As a result of the boom, people who had converted large Victorian and Edwardian

Fodd bynnag, ymddengys fod y system honno'n gweithio yn Sweden ac yn wrthanogaeth i awdurdodau lleol ac asiantaethau eraill, sy'n gyfrifol am geisio cartrefu pobl yn briodol yn eu cartrefi, neu, os nad yw hynny'n bosibl, mewn cartref nysrio neu gartref hen bobl. Mae gwahaniaeth barn yngylch a fyddai system dirwyo yn gweithio yn y DU ai peidio. Yr ydym yn dilyn un llwybr ac mae'r Adran Iechyd yn Llundain yn bwriadu dilyn un arall. **Owen John Thomas:** Yr ydym yn colli nifer enfawr o welyau bob blwyddyn yng Nghymru, tra gellid defnyddio adeiladau ysbyty yn rhanbarth Caerdydd fel Ysbyty Brenhinol Caerdydd, Ysbyty Sili a'r Ysbyty Hamadryad Brenhinol ar gyfer gofal ar ôl triniaeth. A allwch feddwl am well defnydd i Ysbyty Brenhinol Caerdydd?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Dyna ofal sefydliadol ar raddfa anferth. Nid oes neb, heblaw chi, wedi awgrymu y dylai Ysbyty Brenhinol Caerdydd ddod yn gartref hen bobl anferth gyda 500 o welyau. Nid yw hynny'n gwneud fawr o synnwyr. Ni chlywais neb arall yn awgrymu hynny erioed. Er enghraift, nid yw'r rhai a fu'n ymgyrchu dros adfer Ysbyty Brenhinol Caerdydd wedi awgrymu hynny erioed; maent am iddo fod yn ysbyty.

Gwnaethoch sôn am golli nifer enfawr o welyau mewn cartrefi gofal, ond yr oedd y ffigurau a roddais yn dangos colled o tua 6.5 y cant mewn cyfnod o wyth mis, a fyddai'n rhoi colled o 10 y cant dros gyfnod o 12 mis. Mae'r gostyngiad hwnnw'n gysylltiedig â'r cynnydd presennol ym mhrisiau tai. Oherwydd y cynnydd hwnnw, mae rhai a

houses—of which we have many in Cardiff—into old people's homes are now reversing those conversions. It was possible to make a great deal of money by converting large houses into homes because they were too big for your average family. However, converting these houses into flats and putting them back into residential occupation can now generate more money. That happens during a housing boom. We are experiencing the biggest housing boom for 13 or 14 years. When the boom is over, the factor that drives that process will cease.

### Amseroedd Aros Diweddaraf mewn Ysbytai Latest Hospital Waiting Times

**C3 David Lloyd:** A wnaiff y Prif Weinidog ddatganiad am yr amseroedd aros diweddaraf mewn ysbytai? (OAQ22307)

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Mae'r nifer o gleifion sy'n aros dros 18 mis am driniaeth orthopedig a thros bedwar mis am lawdriniaeth ar gataractau wedi gostwng. Ar lawdriniaeth y galon, mae'r gwasanaeth wedi cyrraedd a chadw at y targed pwysig lle nad oes unrhyw glaf yn aros mwy na 12 mis. Mae'n symud tuag at sicrhau, o ddiwedd mis Mawrth 2003 ymlaen, na fydd rhaid i unrhyw glaf aros mwy na chwe mis am eu harchwiliad angiograffeg. Ar driniaeth orthopedig, mae'r nifer o bobl sy'n aros dros 18 mis wedi gostwng o 1,700 yn ystod y 12 mis diwethaf. Mae bron pob ymddiriedolaeth yng Nghymru, gan gynnwys Ymddiriedolaeth NHS Gwent, wedi cyflawni'r targed o sicrhau na fydd unrhywun yn gorfod aros dros 18 mis am driniaeth fewnol.

**David Lloyd:** Mae tystiolaeth fod nyrssys yn gorfod dioddef dicter, llid a cherydd cynyddol gan gleifion a'u perthnasau oherwydd eu bod yn gorfod aros mor hir am driniaeth ar restrau aros diderfyn. Sut ydych yn ymateb i hyn?

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Ni chlywais am enghreifftiau o'r fath. Yn sicr mae'n annheg i bobl geryddu nyrssys neu feddygon yngylch materion y tu allan i reolaeth staff y GIG. Mae bron pawb â phrofiad o driniaeth yn y GIG, yn bersonol neu drwy eu perthnasau, yn

**Q3 David Lloyd:** Will the First Minister make a statement on the latest hospital waiting times? (OAQ22307)

**The First Minister:** The number of patients waiting over 18 months for orthopaedic treatment and over four months for cataract surgery has decreased. On cardiac surgery, the service has reached the important target that no patient waits longer than 12 months and has sustained that success. It is on schedule to ensure that, from the end of March 2003, no patient will have to wait longer than six months for an angiography investigation. On orthopaedic treatment, the number of people waiting for during 18 months has reduced by 1,700 over the past 12 months. Almost all trusts in Wales, including Gwent NHS Trust, have met the key target of ensuring that no-one will have to wait more than 18 months for in-patient treatment.

**David Lloyd:** There is evidence that nurses have to face increasing criticism, resentment and rage from patients and their families because they have to wait so long for treatment on endless waiting lists. How do you react to this?

**The First Minister:** I have not heard of such examples. It is certainly unfair of people to criticise nurses or doctors about matters that are outside the control of NHS staff. Almost everyone with experience of NHS treatment, either personally or through their relatives,

**The First Minister:** Yes I will. I read the report last week. It is comprehensive, but simple to read and easy to understand, which I found helpful. Discussion of the challenges faced by Gwent NHS Trust and the best solutions to those challenges, in the short, medium and long term, with some observations on the similar problems of the orthopaedic waiting lists for joint replacements and so on in the Cardiff area—the south-east Wales problem as distinct from the Gwent problem. I understand that Jane Hutt, the Minister for Health and Social Services will, be presenting the Assembly Government's response to the next Health and Social Services Committee at the end of this month.

**Nick Bourne:** Glyn Jones, who lives in Powys, must wait six months longer than English patients at the same hospital to get his hip operation. He is not the only one, and it is because of Labour's dogma. His anger was summed up when he said that he paid as much as his English counterparts towards the health service, that it was a disgrace that he must wait six months longer because he lives in Wales and that he was being discriminated against. What do you say to Mr Jones, First Minister, and how do you justify the second-class treatment that patients are getting in Wales, compared with England?

**The First Minister:** There are many areas where they will receive faster treatment.

are pleased with that treatment. However, those individuals state that not enough treatment is available. Despite that, there has been a number of advances in the types of treatments and technologies used today, many of which were not available five years ago. People are satisfied by the standard of treatment that they receive.

There are variations between different parts of the United Kingdom because of the differing commissioning priorities of the health authorities and local health boards. That is unavoidable. It will occur in England and it will occur between Scotland and England and between Wales and England. Sometimes it appears to benefit the patient one way on this side of the border and sometimes it does not. I would be grateful if you could pass the letter on to me, and I will consider whether there is any basis to your allegation.

**Nick Bourne:** I will pass on the details of that case. However, there are many others. If you have contrasting cases, I would be interested in seeing evidence of them because, as far as I can see, they are apocryphal. Even the Secretary of State for Wales, Peter Hain, has said that the waiting list record in Wales is not as good as it should be, and that is a Labour perspective. In England, NHS patients will be given a six-month deadline to be dealt with in hospital. If that does not work, they can go elsewhere, which is similar to a previous Welsh Conservative policy. However, we welcome sinners who come to repent, as it is a good policy. Will you announce a similar one for the people of Wales, or can we expect the same abysmal record and growing waiting list crisis that currently exist?

**The First Minister:** In my answer to Dai Lloyd's original question—which you obviously did not pick up—I listed the areas where improvements had been made and the key priority areas as regards cardiac surgery and long waits on orthopaedics. I agree with Peter Hain, and with everybody in Wales, that the long waiting lists in orthopaedics are unacceptable. They will be reduced. We are training additional medics and nurses, who will be able to carry out the expansion in the treatment capacity of the NHS. The increase in the medical school intake in Wales is currently 89 per cent, and it would be even higher if lecturers could be hired, but they cannot. Nobody can ensure a faster rate of increase than that. It never happened under the Conservatives, and, unfortunately, for doctors to be available now, they would have

**Q4 Cynog Dafis:** Will the First Minister make a statement on how his Government's policies have impacted on rural communities in Wales? (OAQ22323)

**The First Minister:** We have introduced a wide range of measures that will help to promote sustainable rural communities. These include support for agriculture and food processing, and measures to try to broaden the rural economy and tackle social exclusion in the countryside. In addition, Andrew Davies, the Minister for Economic Development, visited Cardigan last Thursday to announce the huge scheme to revitalise the west Wales economy in the Cardigan and Fishguard areas, which suffered so much as a result of the closure of the Dewhirst sewing factories.

**Cynog Dafis:** Two years ago, the Welsh Development Agency gave around £1 million to try to save KTH Wales Ltd in Llanidloes. It was announced today that that factory is to close, leading to a loss of 250 jobs. That is sombre news for the community, and it is also a sombre reflection on the economic development policy of the Assembly Government and the UK Government, and you should acknowledge that. How will you respond to this disaster?

**The First Minister:** If you want to be taken

Will you also join me in condemning the Jonahs of the apocalypse party whose principal joy is to spread bad news and undermine the Government's good work?

**The First Minister:** I also commend the drawing-up of the regeneration plan for the north Pembrokeshire and south Ceredigion coastal areas in partnership with the two local authorities concerned. The plan includes exciting projects, such as Theatr Mwldan in Cardigan, the Blaenannerch technology park in nearby Aberporth, and the proposal for the marina-based expansion at Fishguard. Some of these projects are underway, some are reasonably straightforward and others require further work before they can proceed. They are all part of the £60 million plan that Andrew Davies announced last Thursday, and which I saw for myself in part on a private visit on Friday. It demonstrates the Assembly Government's ability to respond to crises such as that which occurred when,

seriously as someone with sensible ideas on the economy, you should have welcomed the fact that, two years ago, we helped save this company from closure by providing £1 million to refurbish the factory and so on. At the time, the factory employed 120 people. That has risen to 250 people over the past two years, but, unfortunately, Triplex Components Group Ltd now says that there is no way that the factory can continue. It may have increased the number of workers in the factory too quickly—I am not sure, but that is one of the theories as to what went wrong. However, the Assembly Government does not run factories. We can help, and we did help, but, unfortunately, that did not lead to a desirable outcome, after two years of growth. I have never said that we, or anyone else, can prohibit factories from closing. Factories fail, and when they do, it is not our fault. We made the effort to help this factory once and we succeeded for two years, but, unfortunately, the factory has now failed.

**C5 Elin Jones:** A oes gan y Prif Weinidog gynlluniau i adolygu'r targedau a nodwyd yn y ddogfen strategol ‘Cynllun i Gymru 2001’? (OAQ22311)

**Y Prif Weinidog:** Nid oes gennyf gynlluniau helaeth ond yr ydym yn gwneud ambell newid bach drwy godi neu ostwng targedau. Fodd bynnag, mae'r egwyddorion yn parhau i fod yn berthnasol.

**Elin Jones:** Mae'r ffigurau masnach diweddar ar gyfer y Deyrnas Gyfunol yn drychinebus, ac mae'n glir mai polisiau Gordon Brown sydd ar fai. Er bod ‘Cynllun i Gymru 2001’ yn dweud y byddwch yn cynyddu'r nifer o gwmniau sydd yn allforio erbyn 2003-04, bu cwmp o 10 y cant mewn allforion o Gymru y llynedd, tra bu cynnydd o 1 y cant mewn allforion o'r Deyrnas Gyfunol yn gyffredinol. Dywedasoch wrth Geraint Davies ychydig o wythnosau yn ôl nad oeddech wedi trafod gyda Gordon Brown effaith niweidiol ei bolisiau ar weithgynhyrchu yng Nghymru ers sbel. **Y Prif Weinidog:** Os ystyriwch y patrwm y tu ôl i'r gostyngiad o 10 y cant yn ein allforion rhwng Medi 2001 a 2002, gwelwch faint o'r cwmp hwnnw y gellir ei egluro gan y cwmp mewn allforion o Aerospace Wales i'r Unol Daleithiau yn enwedig. Ein cwmni mwyaf o ran allforion yw Airbus yn etholaeth Tom Middlehurst, ac, yn anffodus, ar ôl digwyddiadau 11 Medi 2001, cafwyd gostyngiad enfawr mewn allforion awyrennau, gan gynnwys yr adenydd, o'r Gogledd i'r Unol Daleithiau. **Q5 Elin Jones:** Does the First Minister have plans to review the targets in the ‘Plan for Wales 2001’ strategic document? (OAQ22311)

**The First Minister:** I do not have any wide-ranging plans but we do make a few minor changes in revising the targets upwards or downwards. However, the principles remain relevant.

**Elin Jones:** The latest UK trade figures are disastrous, and Gordon Brown's economic policies are clearly to blame. Although the ‘Plan for Wales 2001’ says that you will increase the number of companies exporting by 2003-04, there was a 10 per cent drop in exports from Wales last year, while there was an increase of 1 per cent in exports from the UK as a whole. You told Geraint Davies some weeks ago that you had not discussed with Gordon Brown the detrimental effect of his policies on manufacturing in Wales for some time. When do you intend to discuss this with Gordon Brown so that we can see a change in the exchange rate? You may not be responsible for running factories, but one of your responsibilities is to stand up for Wales and to take action for the benefit of Wales.

**The First Minister:** If you consider the pattern behind the reduction of 10 per cent in our exports between September 2001 and 2002, you will see how much of it is explained by the fall in exports from Aerospace Wales to the USA in particular. Our largest exporting company is Airbus in Tom Middlehurst's constituency, and, unfortunately, after the events of 11 September 2001, there was a massive reduction in the export of aeroplanes, including the wings, from north Wales to the USA. The fact that this is such a large company affects the pattern, and you would see that if you considered the details behind

the figures.

**Alun Cairns:** The last six days have been appalling in terms of economic data published by independent sources. The First Minister mocked my question to the Minister for Economic Development last Wednesday on the Confederation of British Industry's report on output. Another CBI report has since stated that smaller firms are feeling the heat of the manufacturing downturn more than most. Today, KTH Wales Ltd announced 250 redundancies. I appreciate that surveys are predictions, but the announcement on KTH is a reality. Although we like the First Minister's jokes and like to see him heckle questioners now and again, if he cannot accept economic reality, what hope can he offer those 250 people who have lost their jobs? What plans does he have to review the economic strategy, because it clearly is not working after four years?

**The First Minister:** You must not misunderstand what I said to Cynog earlier. I regret enormously the loss of 250 jobs resulting from the closure of KTH in Llanidloes, particularly given our involvement in saving the factory two years ago. The factory has doubled in size since then, so, had we not become involved, there would not have been 250 jobs there in the first place—in fact, nobody would have been working there. Naturally, that makes one feel the blow, though not as much as those directly affected. However, to say that our intervention two years ago, which saved 120 jobs and led to the creation of a further 130 jobs, indicates that our economic policy is a failure is absurd. I presume that, as free-

I accept that the pound has been too strong compared to the euro over the last six or seven years, but it is beginning to weaken. It has not fallen far enough in my view, but at least the euro has been worth 66p since the start of the year, compared to 58p two years ago and 62p last year. I would like to see the euro return to its launch level of 70p. You would then see a reasonable increase in exports from the manufacturing sector in Wales.

There are procedures for ensuring that money is paid out for proper purposes and is repaid. It is a matter for the chief executive of ELWa, as the accounting officer, to ensure that the money is used properly. The repayment that I have just described to you—you have not responded to that—will include interest where appropriate.

ELWa gave out money for a particular purpose, and the Avanti group was not able to use it for that purpose because the council changed its mind about what was to happen to the property. Previously the group had been able to proceed on the basis that the former Pioneer supermarket would be available for this project. Rhondda Cynon Taf may well have had good reasons for changing its mind; I am not criticising Pauline Jarman or her council. However, I am criticising your attempt at a smear in the Chamber and the implication that something naughty is going on. Money is being repaid to ELWa because it was not possible to use it for the designated scheme due to factors entirely outside the control of ELWa and the Avanti group. They simply could not proceed with the scheme, and as a result the money is being paid back.

**Pauline Jarman:** First Minister, will you apologise for accusing a local authority of having a part to play in ELWa funding and the retention of money by companies it sought to fund? You know that there is no truth in that. The local authority had no part to play in the granting of £4 million to the Avanti group. I would like you to apologise publicly. You are quick enough to make

**The First Minister:** It was made available on 29 August 2002.

**Richard Edwards:** While I accept that a report of 119 pages can easily get lost in the middle of a pile of documents, is it not the case that the report shows conclusively that contamination from genetically-modified crops cannot be contained; that separation distances are a nonsense; that cross-contamination threatens the integrity of conventional and organic farming alike; and that had the National Institute of Agricultural Botany's report been shown to Members before 18 December 2002, the draft regulations that were carried on that day might have been rejected because they were not restrictive enough? Many of us expressed grave reservations at that time, even without the benefit of the report. Would you not agree, therefore, that the regulations should now be brought back to the Assembly for further debate and tightening up?

**The First Minister:** That is a legal and procedural issue on which I do not feel qualified to comment. Provided that you could translate the conclusions of the NIAB report—which went to the Advisory Committee on Releases to the Environment on 5 September—to the situation in Wales, it would have fortified the views expressed here on 18 December. There is a question as to whether, given that the report pointed in the same direction, it would have altered those views. It might have strengthened them. However, that depends on what view people took of whether you can translate the experience with oilseed rape, of which we have little in Wales, to other crops of which we have more experience. I do not feel qualified to answer on that. You may want to take this up as a matter of procedure, in terms of guessing what would have happened if the report had been available on 18 December and whether there is a remedy available. However, I will discuss this matter with Carwyn Jones.

**William Graham:** Considering the chronology of the handling of the NIAB report I expect that you share my gratitude to the *Independent on Sunday*, *The Western Mail* and to GM Free Cymru for bringing this matter to public attention, otherwise your deputy might have continued in blissful ignorance. What arrangements have you made to ensure that this sort of event does not occur again?

**The First Minister:** Everyone has been sensitised to the matter of ensuring that Ministers' attentions are drawn to documents on the basis of their possible political sensitivity, even if their agricultural sensitivity is judged to be minor in Wales. I doubt that there is a single official working for the Assembly Government who has not drawn that conclusion from this unhappy story.

**Q7 Gwenda Thomas:** What discussions has the First Minister had with the Secretary of State for Wales in relation to the implications for Wales of the Victoria Climbié report? (OAQ22325)

**The First Minister:** I have not had any discussions with the Secretary of State on this matter. However, there was a discussion on some of the significant issues raised by the Laming inquiry report on this appalling and tragic case in the meeting of the Cabinet sub-committee for children and young people last week. The Assembly Government will issue a response as soon as possible.

**Gwenda Thomas:** If accepted, recommendation 6 of the Victoria Climbié report will mean that every local authority with responsibility for providing social services will have to establish a committee for children and families, comprising council members and lay people. It will have to ensure that services for children and families are co-ordinated properly and that the inter-agency dimension of the work is managed effectively. Do you agree that the Assembly would be well advised to require local authorities in Wales to take that action in any case?

**The First Minister:** There are many recommendations in the Laming report and there has already been a partial response to

**The First Minister:** I think that GM Free Cymru came to the same conclusion, because the research was published on a website some 18 months ago, in May. The conclusions were there for all to see; they were not in the form of a specific report, but they lead to the same conclusion. You have to try to second guess what would have happened in the debate on 18 December had we officially received that report through DEFRA and ACRE mechanisms: would it have made a difference or would it just have strengthened the tendency towards which we were all leaning anyway?

Do we not now need to see real improvements in the provision of social services by Cardiff County Council? A recent report highlighted that children's services were not reviewing cases often enough and that young children had been left in high-risk environments. When will the Government be able to update the Assembly as to what progress the authority has made?

One of those meetings has already taken place and another is due to be held fairly soon.

**The First Minister:** Train operator performance figures and commentary are published in the Strategic Rail Authority's six monthly publication *On Track*—essential reading for everyone. The latest published data for Wales and Borders Trains as at 30 September 2002 shows 80.1 per cent of trains arriving on time. I believe that 'on time' in that context means within 10 minutes of the published time.

**Peter Rogers:** We aim to reduce traffic congestion on our roads and make rail a more attractive alternative form of transport. Do you not agree that more funding from the transport grant settlement should be allocated to our railways?

**The First Minister:** I am not sure what more we can do; we are pumping a lot of additional money into the rail system. We are doing that with regard to the Wales and borders franchise, which will ensure an all-Wales franchise with the exception of the two mainline services. We are also investing in improvements to the Valley lines in the Cynon valley and the Llynfi valley, with increased frequency of services. There are also the projects to reopen the Vale of Glamorgan line and the Ebbw valley line to passenger services. We have also been working closely with the SRA to restore Sunday services to the central Wales line.

**Christine Chapman:** You mentioned the agreement with the SRA to secure half-hourly services between Cardiff and Aberdare. Do you agree that that has been much anticipated and is vital in order to open up jobs and amenities in Cardiff to Valley communities? I thank you, First Minister, and Sue Essex, for your persistence in ensuring that this project is delivered for the people of Cynon valley.

**The First Minister:** You are right to draw the Assembly's attention to the problems that might have arisen, but which fortunately will

The service has been a great success and it was essential to progress to a half-hourly service. Had we spent the money on the capital and then not got the revenue funding, that would not have been good. Fortunately, it now looks as though the problem is solved.

**Q9 David Davies:** Will the First Minister give an assurance that no centres for asylum seekers will be developed in Wales without proper public consultation? (OAQ22308)

**The First Minister:** You were no doubt pleased with the publication at lunchtime today of the list of the asylum accommodation centres, which no longer includes the former Sully Hospital. You will also be interested in the application that has been made to develop an immigrant appellate hearing centre in Langstone, just east of Newport. Although the Home Office is exempt from the provisions of land use planning legislation, it is going through a similar planning process. Newport County Borough Council has objected to the application and as a result it has been referred to the Assembly for determination. The next step will be to hold a public inquiry, before the final decision is taken by an Assembly planning decision committee.

**David Davies:** You will be aware that there has rightly been much public concern about the large numbers of people entering the country claiming asylum-seeker status when they are in fact seeking a better way of life. No-one can blame them for doing so, but the Government should be doing more to stop it. Do you agree that there is concern over the Government's suggestion that it will use

**The First Minister:** You are using the ‘apocalypse now’ trick; I thought Alun Cairns had a monopoly on that in your group. You would have done well not to have just read out what you had prepared but to have listened to my comments about Sully Hospital and the immigrant appellate hearing centre at Newport. Unfortunately, you are on a wild goose chase about a matter that does not pertain to Wales.

**John Griffiths:** The people of Newport East are grateful that a public inquiry will be held on the proposed asylum seeker appeals centre in Langstone in my constituency. They are also grateful for the way in which the Assembly has handled the matter to date. Do you agree that politicians and other public figures should be careful about public statements on asylum seekers, given the sensitivities involved and the problems of hostility towards, and physical attacks on, asylum seekers? Such problems have, unfortunately, occurred and are more likely to do so in future if public figures are not guarded in their comments.

**The First Minister:** I agree. Perhaps it is too much to ask David Davies to be the still, small voice of calm and conscience when discussing this issue. However, it behoves all of us to be careful in commenting on such issues, as what we say could be misinterpreted as applying to anybody and everybody who was not born in this country or who are of a different ethnicity to the person making the comments. We must be careful if we are to preserve good race relations at this difficult time.

**Q10 Helen Mary Jones:** Will the First Minister make a statement on overseeing the adherence to the ministerial code of conduct? (OAQ22324)

**The First Minister:** Cabinet Ministers are personally responsible for complying with the provisions of the Ministerial Code. I take whatever action is necessary to ensure the policing of that code.

**Helen Mary Jones:** I am glad to hear that. I draw your attention to section 8.3 of the code, which refers to a Minister's responsibility to make as much information as possible available to Committees. In light of your earlier response to Ieuan Wyn Jones about grave financial and other mismanagement at Education and Learning Wales, I remind you that the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning has admitted that she knew in May 2002 of at least some of the concerns. She has never made a full report to Committee about those concerns. Under the code, will you investigate what she knew, when she knew it and what she did with that information? Do you agree that, if she had even a partial knowledge of what was going on and failed to make a full report on that to Committee, she has breached the code? Do you further agree that, if she did not know what was going on in ELWa, she is incompetent?

**The First Minister:** You are wide of the mark. It is absurd to suggest that the Minister knew at an early stage that there was a breach of the normal standards of spending that we expect to be upheld—which is the responsibility of ELWa's chief executive—and withheld that information from the Committee. A Minister may know of a problem, and may discuss it with the chair, board or chief executive of the quango. However, until the full picture is available and it is clear that something has gone wrong and that money has been spent in an unauthorised way, there is nothing further that the Minister can do other than to keep

close tabs on the situation and to inform the overall accounting officer—that is, the Permanent Secretary—so that he can keep an even closer eye on it. You cannot report an allegation to a Committee. The Audit Committee is the only Committee that can investigate matters of probity, on the basis of a National Audit Office report. That is the Committee's work. Assembly Ministers are not responsible for policing the probity of expenditure by quangos or civil servants; we are responsible for implementing the policies. However, we must ensure that public money is being properly spent when the NAO draws to our attention the fact that something has gone wrong. There is a procedure to deal with that once the Audit Committee has completed a report on the issue. We will prepare our response on this particular issue once the Audit Committee has completed its report.

**The Presiding Officer:** I make it clear to Members that allegations relating to standards and alleged issues involving the Ministerial Code should not be bandied about in the Chamber. Standing Order No. 16.1(ii) makes it clear that such matters are to be investigated, where appropriate, by the Committee on Standards of Conduct. I would be grateful if Members would observe that in future.

**David Ian Jones:** Does the First Minister agree that one fundamental weakness of the Ministerial Code is that it effectively renders him judge and jury of his own court? Ought not the oversight of the code—

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. Clearly, Members are not listening when the Presiding Officer pronounces on matters of order. Under Standing Order No. 16, it is clear that this is not a matter for judges and juries, but for reporting to the Committee on Standards of Conduct, where appropriate.

**David Ian Jones:** I appreciate that, Llywydd, but this is a matter of principle rather than an individual case.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. There can be

They are the Animal By-products (Identification) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2003; the Powys Health Care National Health Service Trust (Dissolution) Order 2003; the Council Tax Discount Disregards (Amendment) (Wales) Order 2003; the Care Standards Act 2000 (Commencement No. 11) (Wales) Order 2003; the Financing of Maintained Schools (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2003; and the Health Authorities (Transfer of Functions, Staff, Property, Rights and Liabilities and Abolition) (Wales) Order 2003.

**The Presiding Officer:** Are there any objections to the business statement?

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** Yes.

**Carwyn Jones:** I propose that

*the National Assembly adopts the business statement.*

**The Presiding Officer:** I call one Member from each party group to speak briefly on the motion.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** The Business Minister knows that we, as a group, have called several times for a full debate in the Chamber on the evolving situation with regard to the threat of military action against Iraq. The Plaid Cymru group has held a short debate on the matter in its own time, during which Dafydd Wigley drew attention to some of the Government of Wales's responsibilities in terms of preparing Wales and the people of Wales for the implications of such an attack. Yet the Executive has repeatedly rejected our requests for it to hold a debate here.

Does the Minister agree that, during the Plaid Cymru meeting this morning, every member of the group said that many of their constituents had contacted them asking when the National Assembly for Wales will deal with this matter from a Welsh perspective? When will Members of the National Assembly for Wales get to state their opinion on this matter, as their constituents have requested? I imagine that members of the Government have also received such inquiries from their constituents; I noted over the weekend that some Cabinet members expressed their opposition to any attack on Iraq without a second United Nations resolution. Will the Business Minister accept that we need to have a full debate on this subject in the Chamber? Unless he is willing to commit to that, Plaid Cymru will reject the business statement. I urge everyone who feels strongly that we have a responsibility to discuss this matter to join us in rejecting the business statement.

Plaid Cymru has every right to raise this issue but, just as it did not support us on previous issues, we do not feel it appropriate to support Plaid Cymru on this occasion. Unlike Plaid Cymru, which did a cartwheel within a week last week, we have been consistent. We have said previously, when such issues have arisen, that there may be a time to consider it. However, now is not that time.

**Kirsty Williams:** I have some sympathy with the principle of Rhodri Glyn's point: the Assembly should have an opportunity at some stage to debate a situation that is growing in seriousness. Unlike Mr Bourne, I am not confident about waiting for a second resolution from the United Nations, because there may never be one, as much as many Members would like to see one. However, I object to Plaid Cymru using this opportunity to raise this issue. Rhodri Glyn Thomas was present at the Business Committee meeting this morning and had an opportunity to raise an objection to the business statement then and to put forward his point of view, but he did not do so. If Plaid Cymru feels so strongly about this, why did it not raise it through the appropriate channels, namely in the Business Committee meeting this morning?

**The Business Minister (Carwyn Jones):** It would not be right for me to reveal what goes on in the Business Committee, however, this is the first time that I have heard this request today.

Teimlais ei bod yn bwysig rhoi cyfle i Aelodau eu hystyried yn y Cyfarfod Llawn.

of appeal against permanent exclusions from pupil referral units. Although we said, in National Assembly circular 3/99 'Pupil Support and Social Inclusion', that there should be arrangements for hearing appeals against the permanent exclusion from pupil referral units, until now there has not been a statutory right of appeal.

After it came to light that that situation was not compliant with human rights legislation on the right to a fair and impartial trial, a provision was included in the Education Act 2002 to provide for a statutory right of appeal. The Act was welcomed in plenary on 16 October 2002. The particular provision was referred to in the Annex to my Ministerial Report, which was presented to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee on 24 October 2002.

The regulations are to introduce the right of appeal contained in that provision of the Education Act 2002, and bring the position of pupils who are permanently excluded from PRUs into line with the position of pupils who are currently permanently excluded from mainstream schools.

The regulations mirror existing procedures for independent appeals against permanent exclusions as far as possible. They specify the process for notifying the pupils or their parents of their right to appeal, and the procedure for appealing; the responsibility of the local education authority to make arrangements to enable an appeal, and the powers of an appeal panel, that is, where they determine that that pupil should not have been excluded.

Under the Act, the right of appeal is given retrospectively from 1 September 1994, which is the date when PRUs were first recognised by statute. That allows for appeals against permanent exclusion decisions that were made before the regulations came into force. Retrospective appeals will need to be lodged no later than 30 school days after the date on which regulations come into force.

Members may have concerns about exclusion procedures and appeals in general, but I stress

Pwrpas y rheoliadau yw cyflwyno'r hawl i apêl a geir yn y ddarpariaeth honno yn y Ddeddf Addysg 2002, a chysoni sefyllfa disgyblion sydd wedi'u gwahardd yn barhaol o unedau cyfeirio disgyblion â sefyllfa disgyblion sydd wedi'u gwahardd yn barhaol o ysgolion y brif ffrwd ar hyn o bryd.

Mae'r rheoliadau'n adlewyrchu'r gweithdrefnau presennol ar gyfer apelau annibynnol yn erbyn gwaharddiadau parhaol i'r graddau mwyaf posibl. that the regulations are effectively an interim arrangement. The regulations are simply to bring PRUs into line with mainstream schools regarding exclusion appeal decisions.

I will examine procedures relating to exclusions and appeals against exclusions in the next couple of months. Naturally, I intend to consult thoroughly on any possible changes to the exclusion procedures, which will also be made in regulations under the Act. At that time the regulations before the Chamber will probably need to be amended. Members will have an opportunity to scrutinise any proposed changes when the future regulations are drawn up.

**Helen Mary Jones:** The regulations, as the Minister said, genuinely tidy up an anomalous situation. I am glad that the Minister is going to keep the regulations under review, in the light of the wider review that she is holding into the appeals against exclusions system.

The length of time that is allowed for appeal concerns us. The period of 15 school days is effectively three weeks. That sounds like a long time, but the regulations will affect a small number of children, young people, and families who will be living through difficult circumstances and under much pressure. Those children would not be in pupil referral units if their families were not having severe difficulties with them and with their education.

In my experience as a teacher, families will often wish to explore other possibilities before they decide to make a formal appeal. They may seek an alternative placement elsewhere, but they might not be able to find one. At that point, they may decide to appeal against the exclusion. Will the Minister agree to keep an eye on the issue of timescales in her review?

There is a balance to be achieved here. You do not want the process to drag out, and you do not want staff, particularly in these small units, to be under pressure. On the other hand, it is important that children, young people and their families are given sufficient

Mae'r cyfnod a ganiateir ar gyfer apêl yn peri pryder i ni. Mae'r cyfnod o 15 diwrnod ysgol yn dair wythnos i bob pwrpas. time to weigh up their circumstances, particularly in some situations—perhaps in rural counties—where there may be little alternative provision. We will support these regulations today, but I hope that the Minister will agree to address the issue of timescales in the broader review.

**Mick Bates:** The Welsh Liberal Democrats support these regulations. The introduction of a statutory right to appeal against permanent exclusion from pupil referral units not only complies with human rights legislation, but is fair and just. The Welsh Liberal Democrats believe that everyone has the right to good quality education and to equality of opportunity. Disruptive children are children with problems and needs, and they deserve to be treated constructively, not to be excluded and written off. They need help and assistance. I reinforce Helen Mary's statement that there must be some consideration of the time period between the incident and the appeals.

We favour individual behaviour plans for problem pupils, which involve the school, the parents and the child. These would supply the help and assistance that problem pupils need. They would also place pupils at the centre of their own education. I am certain that the Minister agrees that reinforcing that principle would be welcome. Problem pupils are more likely to drink, take drugs, damage property, handle stolen goods and commit assaults. They are also more likely to end up homeless. Exclusion is not a solution, it merely creates more problems for the pupil and for society as a whole.

**Jonathan Morgan:** We will support these regulations as the Minister has outlined them. There is a sense of natural justice that some sort of appeal should be possible where a pupil has been excluded from a pupil referral unit. I am surprised that concerns are being raised at this juncture about the time period in which an appeal needs to be made, because there have already been ample opportunities for both Plaid Cymru and the Liberal Democrats to raise objections.

**Mick Bates:** Mae Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol Cymru yn cefnogi'r rheoliadau hyn. Mae cyflwyno hawl apêl statudol yn erbyn gwaharddiadau parhaol o unedau cyfeirio disgyblion yn cydymffurfio â deddfwriaeth hawliau dynol, ac mae hefyd yn deg ac yn gyfiawn. Mae Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol Cymru yn credu bod gan bawb hawl i gael addysg o ansawdd da a chyfle cyfartal. Mae plant trafferthus yn blant sydd â phroblemau ac anghenion, ac maent yn haeddu cael eu trin yn adeiladol, nid eu hallgáu a'u diystyr. Mae arnynt angen cymorth. Ategaf yr hyn a ddywedodd Helen Mary am yr angen i roi rhyw ystyriaeth i'r cyfnod rhwng y digwyddiad a'r apelau.

Yr ydym yn ffafrio cynlluniau ymddygiad unigol ar gyfer disgyblion problemus, a fydd yn cynnwys yr ysgol, y rhieni a'r plentyn. Byddai'r rhain yn rhoi'r cymorth y mae ar ddisgyblion problemus ei angen. Byddent hefyd yn gwneud disgyblion yn ganolog i'w haddysg eu hunain. Yr wyf yn sicr bod y Gweinidog yn cytuno ei bod yn dderbyniol ategu'r egwyddor honno. **Jonathan Morgan:** Byddwn yn cefnogi'r rheoliadau hyn fel y mae'r Gweinidog wedi'u hamlinellu. Teimlir mai mater o gyflawnder naturiol yw y dylai rhyw fath o apêl fod yn bosibl pan yw disgybl wedi'i wahardd o uned cyfeirio disgyblion. Yr wyf yn synnu bod pryderon yn cael eu codi'n awr ynghylch y cyfnod y mae'n rhaid cyflwyno apêl oddi mewn iddo, oherwydd bu digonedd o gyfleoedd eisoes i Blaid Cymru a'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol godi gwrthwynebiadau.

Regulation no. 5 places a duty on the local education authority to make arrangements for an appeal. Are we, as an Assembly, able to stipulate the number of members on an appeal panel and the sort of background that we expect those people to have? Headteachers are somewhat concerned that not enough is being done to take account of the views of the teaching profession regarding LEA-administered school permanent exclusion panels. Can we stipulate the membership, for example, by suggesting that a serving member of staff from a pupil referral unit should be part of an appeal panel, so that they can put across the case of the pupil referral unit?

I am looking forward to the review announced by the Minister. There are some general concerns that must be raised about the appeals process, specifically relating to schools, where a headteacher's decision to exclude a pupil, which is then upheld by the school governing body, can be overturned by an independent panel. There are also some more general issues that we need to consider in the next couple of months.

**David Davies:** I echo the point made so well by Jonathan Morgan. There is a perception that the current procedures for making appeals against exclusion from mainstream schools often seem to work against teachers, who feel justifiably let down when young troublemakers who have threatened or attacked them and are consequently excluded are then let back into the classroom after an appeal. If that happens when the appeal panels are set up for the pupil referral units, teachers and those working in pupil referral units will be further demoralised. Will the Minister assure us that the panels will be composed of people who understand the problems faced by teachers and that they will not be packed with naive do-gooders who will side with the troublemakers, rather than with the hard-pressed teachers? Will she clarify the point that she made about retrospective appeals—[*Interruption.*]

Mae penaethiaid ysgol braidd yn bryderus na wneir digon i ystyried barn athrawon am baneri gwaharddiadau parhaol o ysgolion a weinyddir gan awdurdod addysg lleol. A allwn ragnodi'r aelodaeth, er enghraifft, drwy awgrymu y dylai aelod staff sy'n gwasanaethu mewn uned cyfeirio disgylion fod yn rhan o baner apêl, fel y gall gyflwyno achos yr uned cyfeirio disgylion?

Edrychaf ymlaen at yr adolygiad a gyhoeddwyd gan y Gweinidog. **The Presiding Officer:** Order. David Davies has a unique point of view and is entitled to express it.

**David Davies:** I can assure the Presiding Officer that it is not a unique point of view because it is shared by many teachers across the country.

**Helen Mary Jones:** The Presiding Officer is correct, David, in that you often have an interesting point of view, but will you tell us who these do-gooders are who crawl out of the woodwork to poison our education system and where they are from?

**David Davies:** I am happy to do so. If you had read *The Western Mail* today, you would have seen a report about teachers in a school in Llantwit Major, who were furious when someone who had threatened and shot a teacher with a kind of air pistol was allowed back into the school after being excluded. I suggest that do-gooders sat on the appeal panel that made that decision.

Will the Minister clarify the point about retrospective appeals and assure us that pupils who have been excluded from a pupil referral unit will not be allowed to claim any form of compensation years after the decision has been made. The Liberal Democrat education spokesperson made the point that excluded pupils are more likely to drink, smoke, take drugs and handle stolen goods, which is precisely why some of them do not belong in any form of educational establishment.

**Lorraine Barrett:** David Davies never lets us down. I thought he would be the one to raise a particular ongoing case. It is always dangerous to use a specific individual as an example. I refer you to the *Daily Mirror*, where you might see the other side of the story behind that case. None of us know all the details and we should not use individual cases as examples because there is always another side to the story. While I sympathise with the staff and head teacher of that school, you should consider the case in a calmer way, David.

Everyone is entitled to an independent appeal mechanism—that is natural justice. However, what is on offer for those who might lose an appeal to be allowed back into a referral unit? I presume that such questions will be addressed by the Minister's review in due course. I wanted to make the case that everyone is entitled to be heard by an independent appeal panel, even—and I am sure that all Members agree—David Davies, if he were expelled from this Chamber. If that were to happen, could I be on the panel?

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. There is no independent appeal process for someone who is expelled from this Chamber.

**Rosemary Butler:** Does the Minister agree that the Prince's Trust is undertaking excellent work to help pupils who are excluded from referral units? Could she speak to ELWa about ensuring that proper funding is available to help the Prince's Trust and these young students who are always in need of assistance?

**The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson):** I am grateful that Members support the regulations because they are about natural justice. We must ensure, as I described at the outset, that people have a right to appeal against a decision that can affect the rest of their lives. These are temporary regulations to be operated by the same panel composition that is outlined in existing regulations in schools. We had some concerns about that. That is why we need to go through the process of undertaking a proper review.

England recently changed the composition of its independent appeal panels. It considered the requirement on panels to balance the interest of the excluded pupil against the interest of the rest of the school community, prevented exclusions from being overturned solely on the basis of a technical defect in prior procedure, and introduced a new ability

These are sensible proposals, which would be appropriate for us to consider. However, under the Education Act 2002, the Assembly has the responsibility for this; therefore, we need to hold our own consultation on what exclusion mechanisms are right for us. It is also important that we explore the local authority's role in exclusion, because local authorities have a duty to make a place available within three weeks to young people who are excluded from school for whatever reason, to ensure that they are in full-time education. We need to build in a response that takes account of that duty.

David, when you say that there are young people who should not be in any kind of educational establishment, there is a danger of going down the route of saying that certain young people should be excluded from learning opportunities. The Assembly is clear about wanting to balance the interests of excluded pupils against the interests of school communities and others. We should do our best to ensure that all young people have access to learning opportunities. I will also want to take that up in terms of how we tackle exclusions in a way that benefits individuals and the school community and contributes to the individual's learning. Rosemary's point about the Prince's Trust and other similar organisations that can offer valuable educational experiences alongside schools is an important one.

These regulations further amend the National Health Service (Optical Charges and Payments) Regulations 1997, and will provide for the funding of a second set of optical appliances for certain people up to the age of 19, upon the optician applying for and receiving the approval of the appropriate health authority. The regulations reflect the decision taken by the Assembly early last year to support the Government's amendment to Pauline Jarman's motion that sought to introduce this measure at the optometrist's discretion. The Government's amendment secures this important provision by regulation for the most vulnerable in society with a clear clinical need. Decisions will continue to be taken based on the experience and professionalism of the optometric profession in the primary care setting, supported by the appropriate authorities, ensuring consistency and equality of access across Wales.

**Pauline Jarman:** As colleagues will know, in a few weeks' time, I will stand down from the National Assembly. Before some of you say 'and about time too', I would like to say that it has been an honour and a privilege for me to represent the people of South Wales Central during this historic first Assembly, which has been described by some as a learning curve, by others as a roller-coaster ride and, perhaps uncharitably, by a few as something of a damp squib.

As someone who actively campaigned for a National Assembly for Wales—or as I would have preferred it, a real Parliament for Wales—for as long as I can recall, I feel that there is a huge amount of work to be done if we are serious about winning for our National Assembly its rightful place in the hearts and minds of the people of Wales. Furthermore, the financial implications of the proposal can be accommodated within existing planned provision for contractual payments within the family health services budget expenditure line.

Today there is an opportunity for the Assembly to make a real difference to the lives of young people in Wales. I am often asked by people in South Wales Central, an area which I am proud voted 'yes' in 1997, 'What has the Assembly done for us?'. I hope that colleagues will today give this legislation their final approval, so that the next time that I am asked that question, there will be one more compelling piece of evidence that I can use to demonstrate to people in our communities that we can make a difference and that they were right to have the confidence to vote 'Yes for Wales' almost six years ago.

**Kirsty Williams:** The Welsh Liberal Democrats are happy to support the changes that are before us and to acknowledge that Pauline Jarman first brought this idea before the Chamber. At that time, I expressed my reservations about its practicality. However, those reservations have been overcome during the consultation period and the regulations have been drawn up in such a way as to ensure continuity so that opticians are not put in the invidious position of having to choose who should receive a second pair of spectacles. That would mean that Members should not have to wait for an undue length of time before they take the oath in the new Assembly. There is nothing more to this motion than that; I commend it to Plenary.

It is sensible and progressive that Members who are republicans, though not necessarily nationalists, should have the choice of swearing an oath of allegiance to the people of Wales rather than to any parasite in Buckingham Palace.

**Peter Law:** It is interesting how this has arisen after three and a half years, and I am touched by some of my colleagues' comments. However, if the principle is the same as in Parliament—and I agree with the Deputy Presiding Officer's bringing this forward—that is, no oath, no pay, I would be interested to see who is the fastest in here on 2 May.

**Adroddiad y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol am Wasanaethau  
ar gyfer Plant ag Anghenion Iechyd Arbennig  
The Health and Social Services Committee's Report on Services for Children  
with Special Health Needs**

**Kirsty Williams:** I propose that

*the National Assembly for Wales notes the report of the Health and Social Services Committee on its review of services for children with special health needs, which was laid in the Table Office on 11 December 2002. (NDM1343)*

In June 2001, the Health and Social Services Committee decided that it wanted to consider in detail issues surrounding children's health and wellbeing. It would have been impossible to do justice to such a wide subject in the time available. Therefore, following informal consultation with professionals and the voluntary sector in the summer of that year, we narrowed the scope of the review to focus on services for children with special health needs. In October of that year, we published our terms of reference and went out to widespread public consultation.

Children in Wales experience a wide range of chronic health problems and disabilities, but there are issues that are common to many.

Buasai'n amhosibl gwneud cyfiawnder â phwnc mor eang yn yr amser a oedd ar gael. Felly, ar ôl ymgynghori'n anffurfiol â gweithwyr proffesiynol a'r sector gwirfoddol yn haf y flwyddyn honno, gwnaethom gyfyngu ar gwmpas yr adolygiad er mwyn canolbwytio ar wasanaethau ar gyfer plant ag anghenion iechyd arbennig. Ym mis Hydref y flwyddyn honno, gwanethom gyhoeddi ein cylch gorchwyl a mynd ati i ymgynghori'n eang â'r cyhoedd.

We identified eight key aspects of the service for consultation. We received evidence from many parents and carers, as well as from service providers and voluntary groups. Around 70 organisations and individuals sent us their written views, and 19 were invited to discuss them with the Committee. I take this opportunity to thank all those who gave evidence, whether in written or oral form. I know that it was not easy for many of the families to find the time to come to talk to the Committee about their experiences, but their contribution helped us to build a picture of what was happening in Wales, and what needed to happen.

The issues are not just about health and social care, and they cannot be looked at separately from education issues and the other services that these children need. Our review also involved the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee and the Local Government and Housing Committee, and I place on record my thanks to Gwenda Thomas and Cynog Dafis who represented their Committees' interests in our discussions. I also thank Professor Jo Sibert of the University of Wales School of Medicine's department of child health and his team of researchers for their work in producing the literature review for the Wales Office of Research and Development for Health and Social Care. The presentation of its findings to the Committee meant that we also benefited from that professional knowledge and expertise. I hope that the literature review, which is considerable, will prove to be a source of valuable information, not only to Members, but to all those working on child health issues.

There is no doubt that much progress has been made in providing services for children with special health needs and that there is greater awareness of those needs. The Committee received much evidence of apparent good practice but, unfortunately, there was little or no systematic identification or evaluation of this practice, nor were there many easy means of disseminating it. The key to success, we believe, is the better co-ordination of services. Services should focus on the needs of the child and his or her family. The constraints of rigid,

organisational structures preclude that, and the Committee seeks to make further improvements as too many barriers remain between agencies that should be working together. A child-centred approach considers the child's needs holistically as well as in the context of the wider family. Brothers and sisters should be helped to understand their sibling's condition, thereby ensuring that their own development and relationship within the family does not take second place. The Committee's report contains 27 recommendations, many of which would not be costly to implement. They are about better and more efficient ways of working, which could, in the longer term, save money and resources and ensure that families' needs are met before they reach crisis point.

I will briefly highlight some of our recommendations. There was much concern about the importance of early diagnosis and the benefits of early intervention. We heard different views from paediatricians about the value of universal child surveillance and I am pleased that, in response to these concerns, the Minister has already established a group, led by the Chief Medical Officer for Wales, to consider child health surveillance. The Committee recommended that the working group's findings inform the national service framework for children and we also recommended that the new local health boards should have strategies to ensure that there is early access to diagnostic services for vulnerable babies. There was evidence that the professionals giving advice and information to parents following diagnosis did not always appreciate how difficult it was for parents to absorb and understand the information being given at such a difficult, stressful and often traumatic time. We felt that parents needed time to digest what they had been told, and an opportunity to return at a later date to ask more questions. How information is given at the time of diagnosis must be carefully and sympathetically planned and it should be given in an appropriate environment and through the right medium. More training is needed so that providing information becomes an integral part of the diagnostic process and not an

Rhaid cynllunio'r dull o roi gwybodaeth ar adeg diagnosis mewn modd gofalus a llawn cydymdeimlad a dylid ei rhoi mewn amgylchedd addas a thrwy'r cyfrwng iawn. incidental afterthought, involving shoving an often out-of-date leaflet into an upset parent's hands.

The effective co-ordination of care is perhaps the single most important issue that we identified, and is the starting point of a holistic approach to the assessment of the child's and the family's needs. The appointment of a care co-ordinator or key worker as the first point of contact for the family could reduce stress and frustration for parents who may be overwhelmed by the plethora of agencies with which they must deal.

Most Members will have received correspondence about shortages in therapy services, especially speech and language therapy. The increased demand for these services is not confined to Wales; there are problems across the UK that must be addressed. We need long-term strategies, but, in the short term, the Government must work with these professions to discover what can be done to manage the service more effectively and to provide support to the therapists delivering it. The possibility of training therapy assistants to deliver basic services under supervision could be explored.

The Committee considered that the school nursing service could be the keystone supporting the links between the family and health, education and social care services. We hope that the recommendations of Professor Dame Jill Macleod Clark's report on school nursing will be implemented fully. Access to respite care, particularly in times of crisis, is crucial, and we were concerned at the variation in its availability across Wales. Respite care benefits the whole family, but each family has differing needs. While respite care for the weekend is valuable to some, a few hours to allow parents some freedom can be of a huge help to others. What suits one family might not suit another. Flexibility in respite provision is essential.

In the course of our investigation, Committee members visited several schemes that provide advice and support to families. I am pleased that we were able to return to the special needs activity club in Margam just before Christmas to formally launch our report. Such organisations are voluntary, and their success are due to the determination and commitment of their members, many of whom have children with special needs themselves. We would like local authorities throughout Wales to support similar centres. Issues related to the provision of equipment cause anguish for many families. Sometimes the child has outgrown equipment before it is even delivered. We recommend that the statutory agencies pool their equipment budgets, the management of stores and use of equipment. Equipment that is no longer required by a client should be quickly passed on to someone who may be able to use it.

We welcome the move to bring special needs education into mainstream schooling. However, special needs services in mainstream schools should be monitored carefully. We recommend that the national service framework for children contain a detailed section on special education and health needs. Furthermore, a member of each local health board should be given responsibility for children's services and rights.

Finally, I referred earlier to the need to evaluate and disseminate good practice and information. We believe that the national service framework should and could provide the means for this to happen. As Chair of the Committee, I look forward to receiving a full response from the Welsh Assembly Government. I hope that, in years to come, the appropriate Subject Committee—whoever the Chair and its members may be—will look back on this report and use it as a way to evaluate the implementation and the progress that the Assembly has made in this special area.

**David Lloyd:** I thank everyone who was involved in this review of services for children with special health needs. I also thank the children and parents who have battled for years with a system that can appear unsympathetic, cold and distant. I thank all the associations and individuals in the field who presented evidence, my fellow Members, and the clerk and deputy clerk of the Health and Social Services Committee for their thorough and purposeful work at all times.

Children with special health needs are defined as children who are physically impaired, have chronic or complex medical conditions, or have emotional, behavioural or learning difficulties. The field is broad and the challenge is huge.

One perception that led the Committee to establish this review was that, when a diagnosis is made in one sector, such as the health service, but the treatment occurs in a different sector, for example, education, then, almost without exception, there is a shortage of services and insufficient co-ordination of those services. In addition, there is a shortage of key staff members, such as speech therapists, who can speak Welsh.

As the review proceeded, the concerns regarding these services were confirmed. Many themes frequently came to the fore: the importance of early diagnosis—no diagnosis, no help. Other themes were the advantage of having a key worker, as we heard, and the essential importance of the co-ordination of services across the different boundaries, such as those between health and education services and between services for children and adults. Another issue was the pressing need to recruit and retain staff such as speech therapists, school nurses and so on. Another theme was the need for much more respite care and more flexibility in the provision of respite care and the need for prompt provision of the necessary equipment, as Kirsty said. There is also a need for prompt

Time and again the urgent need for early diagnosis in order to get a service was raised. Other recurrent issues were the importance of having a key worker to lead the family through the maze of officialdom, the importance of co-ordination between various interfaces such as health and education, the development of more services such as more speech therapy services, and the importance of respite care. Those themes were stressed repeatedly in the review and also surface frequently in my postbag. Last Friday, I met the mother of a nine-year-old child with Asberger's syndrome. As we know, autism spectrum disorders are becoming evermore prevalent, yet the picture is one of real anger and frustration for parents, who continually have to battle for services for their children. There is a great need to develop autism services in Wales. Difficulties in obtaining the diagnosis of autism remain, and no diagnosis equals no help, which equals no statement and, in this mother's experience, there is no post-diagnosis support either. There was real anger at last Friday's meeting at the lack of co-ordination between agencies. This is because autism does not appear to be on any Government department's radar despite the shocking rise in the number of those with the disorder. These issues are common to many of the diverse clinical entities that formed this review of provision for children with special health needs. The review was extensive and wide-ranging, and it involved much hard work on the part of many people. In addition to the 27 recommendations, it has produced an expectation of action. That expectation is

assessments and for adaptations and similar assistance to be provided early on, and not after months or years of delays and battling for justice on the part of the parents.

There is also a need to review the provisions of legislation on disabled facilities grants. Recommendation 17 in the report notes that our local authorities—as Kirsty said—should support the special needs advice and support centres so that they can provide services to children and support for carers and families. There are particular examples, as we saw, in Torfaen and Margam.

**Ann Jones:** I also add my thanks to those who worked hard to produce this report. This is vital if we are to ensure that the next generation of children will be healthier than the present one. The report covers many issues. I will briefly focus on the link between children's health and child poverty, and, in particular, the issue of low birth-weight.

The effects of being born with a low birth-weight persist throughout a person's life, and we must do more to tackle this issue. Low birth-weight is associated with poorer health not only in childhood but through to adulthood. Children born to mothers from the poorer social classes are 25 per cent more likely to have a low birth-weight. There is also a 45 per cent greater chance that babies born to single mothers, that is, babies whose fathers are absent when the birth is registered, will have a low birth-weight. Some 1,400 babies weighing below 2.5lb are born each year. A further 14,000 babies are born with a birth-weight of between 2.5lb and 4.5lb. Those babies have certain health problems at that age, but also go on to develop further or multi-health problems throughout their childhood and into their young adulthood. The mothers of low birth-weight children are often young and inexperienced and are unlikely to be able to combine employment with caring for a vulnerable or sick child. This group is also likely to be ill-informed about what financial or other help is available. In other words, these people are on the edges of social exclusion. I hope that this report will galvanise action to improve the health of mothers and their children. We must start with the mothers. We must have a positive emphasis on the importance of maternal wellbeing. As Peter Townsend's

report has clearly demonstrated, the health service cannot solve these problems by itself. However, there are areas where we may have an impact.

I believe that the NHS and the new local health boards can undertake that role. We must face up to the challenge of improving the response to local needs. However, we must also look beyond that and use the money for Communities First areas to co-ordinate action and encourage community members to contribute to the reduction of problems such as low birth-weight. There are interventions with behavioural or empowerment focuses. We need to build on those and take those people with us in doing so. I commend to you, as always, what I regard as the greatest achievement in the Communities First ward in my constituency, namely the food co-operative. If we could establish food co-operatives across Wales, it would go some way towards tackling these problems.

**David Melding:** I am pleased to commend this report, which received all-party support in Committee, to the Assembly. We were greatly assisted in the process of putting it together by the secretariat. However, at all stages, each Committee member's ideas were taken forward and we reflected deeply on the evidence that we received. The quality of the report is principally due to the clarity and strength of the evidence submitted, both directly in Committee and through a number of site visits. Those of us who went on the site visits were impressed by what we saw, by the commitment of parents and carers and by their reasonable demands for an adequate level of support. I will not go through issues that have already been mentioned, but I was impressed by the evidence of the need for key workers. The run-around experienced by many when they are suddenly catapulted into an intense role of caring for a child with complex needs can be dispiriting.

I was also impressed by the call for greater joint working. I know that we are encouraging that, as well as flexibility in

pooling budgets and managing equipment stores, for example, but there is a long way to go. We need much smarter working. It is not about overall resources; indeed, were we to add to the current resources available without tackling the organisational challenges, we would still have deficiencies. We must tackle that. The state of the school nursing service must also be improved and we need to implement Dame June Clark's extensive report.

I want to concentrate on and amplify the issue of access to pre-school education for children with special health needs. A real advance in recent years is that children are given, as of right, access to pre-school education. That is of great help to parents, many of whom want to combine caring responsibilities with a job, and it allows them a degree of respite if the child they are caring for has a special need. However, the evidence was clear that, the more complex the needs of your child, the less likely it is that that child will receive any level of pre-school education. That is utterly perverse and works against the contract that I think society should have with these loving parents and guardians who take on the obligations of care with a light and loving heart. They need to be sustained in that role and not entirely engulfed by these responsibilities because otherwise they will be worn down and they will lose their hinterland and their ability to care for other children in the family. The caring relationship cannot be sustained in such a stressful situation. We must revisit the issue of parents and children with the most acute need not receiving care or access to pre-school education.

I commend the Chair of the Committee on the way in which she led us in this work. The report is of a high quality. It stands careful scrutiny and I am sure that the Executive's response to its recommendations will be positive on the whole. It is a coherent report and is not a mere wish list: it tries to grapple with the issue. Perhaps we are becoming slightly whimsical or concerned about our fate as we approach the end of this first Assembly, but looking back, two aspects of

Un cam gwirioneddol ymlaen yn y blynnyddoedd diwethaf yw bod plant yn cael yr hawl i addysg cyn-ysgol. Mae hynny o gymorth mawr i rieni, y mae llawer ohonynt am gyfuno cyfrifoldebau gofal â swydd, ac mae'n rhoi mwy o seibiant iddynt os oes angen arbennig gan y plentyn y maent yn gofalu amdano. Fodd bynnag, yr oedd yn amlwg o'r dystiolaeth mai po fwyaf cymhleth y mae anghenion eich plentyn, lleiaf tebygol ydyw y caiff y plentyn hwnnw unrhyw lefel o addysg cyn-ysgol. Mae hynny'n gwbl wrthnysig ac yn mynd yn groes i'r contract a ddylai fod, yn fy marn i, rhwng cymdeithas a'r rhieni a gwarcheidwad cariadus hynny sy'n ymgymryd ag ymrwymiadau gofal yn siriol ac yn gariadlon. Mae arnynt angen eu cynnal yn y rôl honno ac nid eu llyncu'n llwyr gan y cyfrifoldebau hyn oherwydd fel arall byddant wedi blino'n lân a byddant yn colli eu bywyd ehangach a'u gallu i ofalu am blant eraill yn y teulu. Ni ellir cynnal y berthynas ofalgar mewn sefyllfa sy'n peri'r fath straen. Rhaid inni ailystyried mater y rhieni a'r plant mwyaf anghenus nad ydynt yn cael gofal neu'r gallu i gael addysg cyn-ysgol.

Canmolaf Gadeirydd y Pwyllgor ar ei dull o'n harwain yn y gwaith hwn. Mae'r adroddiad o ansawdd da. Cymer ei archwilio'n fanwl ac yr wyf yn siŵr y bydd ymateb y Weithrediaeth i'w argymhellion yn gadarnhaol ar y cyfan. Mae'n adroddiad rhesymegol ac yn amgenach na rhestr o ddymuniadau: mae'n ceisio mynd i'r afael â'r mater dan sylw. Efallai ein bod yn mynd braidd yn ysmala neu'n bryderus ynghylch ein tynged wrth inni ddiwedd y

the work of the Health and Social Services Committee stand out. They are the report and inquiry to establish the office of the Children's Commissioner for Wales and this report on children with particularly complex health needs. I commend this report to the Assembly for its approval.

**Peter Law:** I am pleased to see this report, and I commend the Committee on its work, particularly with regard to speech and language therapy. I know that the Minister will be listening carefully because she is committed to improving children's lives and to giving them the therapy that they need. I have spoken about this issue on a number of occasions in this Chamber, and I cannot emphasise enough how serious the lack of provision of speech and language therapy across Wales is. I know, as Kirsty Williams said, that it is a matter that affects the UK as a whole, but it is so significant a problem in Wales now—you heard earlier the phrase 'no diagnosis, no treatment'—that we need an emergency taskforce to deal with it. We must get to grips with it because time is passing by for these young people. If you live in a deprived community, and are excluded from much of what other people take for granted, the last thing that you want—but on many occasions have to face—is to go through life with the problem of not being able to converse with your fellow human beings. If we do not adopt an effective approach to these problems, then these young children face a lifetime's impediment.

In June 2002, across the whole of Gwent, 2,000 young people had waited for over two years for an appointment to see a speech and language therapist. I am glad that the Committee highlighted the shortfall in the number of therapists in Wales. There are therapists with a caseload, on average, of 141 people, compared with a recommended caseload of 44. That is horrific. The therapist has no chance of dealing with that. Let us also not forget those who want to converse through the medium of Welsh. Welsh-language speech therapists are like gold. That is another big problem.

**Peter Law:** Yr wyf yn falch o weld yr adroddiad hwn, a chanmolaf y Pwyllgor ar ei waith, yn enwedig mewn cysylltiad â therapi iaith a lleferydd. Gwn y bydd y Gweinidog yn gwrando'n astud gan ei bod wedi ymrwymo i wella bywydau plant a rhoi iddynt y therapi y mae arnynt ei angen. Yr wyf wedi siarad am y mater hwn nifer o weithiau yn y Siambra hon, ac ni allaf bwysleisio ddigon mor ddifrifol yw'r diffyg darpariaeth o therapi iaith a lleferydd ledled Cymru. Gwn, fel y dywedodd Kirsty Williams, ei fod yn fater sy'n effeithio ar y DU gyfan, ond mae'n broblem mor fawr yng Nghymru bellach—clywsoch y dywediad 'dim diagnosis, dim triniaeth' yn gynharach—fel bod arnom angen tasglu argyfwng i ymdrin â hi. Rhaid inni fynd i'r afael â hyn gan fod amser yn mynd heibio yn achos y bobl ifanc hyn. Os ydych yn byw mewn cymuned ddifreintiedig, ac wedi'ch allgáu o lawer o'r hyn y mae pobl eraill yn ei gymryd yn ganiataol, y peth olaf yr ydych am ei gael—ond yn gorfod ei wynebu mewn llawer achos—yw gorfod mynd drwy'ch bywyd â'r broblem o fethu â sgwrsio â'ch cyd-ddyn. Os nad ymdriniwn yn effeithiol â'r problemau hyn, bydd y plant ifanc hyn yn wynebu rhwystr ar hyd eu hoes.

Ym Mehefin 2002, ledled Gwent, yr oedd 2,000 o bobl ifanc wedi disgwyl am fwy na dwy flynedd am apwyntiad i weld therapydd iaith a lleferydd. Yr wyf yn falch bod y Pwyllgor wedi tynnu sylw at y prinder o therapyddion yng Nghymru. Ceir therapyddion â llwyth achosion o 141 o bobl, ar gyfartaledd, o'i gymharu â'r nifer o 44 a argymhellir. Mae hynny'n frawychus. Nid oes gobaith i'r therapydd ddelio â hynny. Gadewch inni beidio ag anghofio ychwaith y rhai sy'n dymuno sgwrsio drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg. Mae therapyddion lleferydd Cymraeg yn brin fel aur. Mae honno'n broblem fawr arall.

I am impressed with the Committee's work, but we must get to grips with this problem today. I hope that the Minister will consider carefully whether we need an emergency taskforce. The problem is not going away in places such as Blaenau Gwent. We could have had an I CAN centre, which I was looking forward to, and which Torfaen County Council and Blaenau Gwent Council supported, but, sadly, Gwent Health Authority and the Gwent Healthcare Trust did not support it, and the children who suffer from these speech impediments and need support lost that opportunity. Their parents sometimes feel that they are forgotten because the system is not operating as it should. Therefore, I welcome the recommendation in the report that a special needs support and advice centre be established in each area. That is positive, as are the other issues that have been mentioned, such as appointing a member of a local health board to be responsible for children's health services—a kind of champion in each area—because many of life's unglamorous problems are often ignored.

We are talking about a small minority of people, but not being able to converse with your fellow human beings is a major problem. That is the legacy of not providing effective speech and language therapy. This is an important report, which points us in the right direction. I sincerely hope that the Minister will be able to take this forward and make positive inroads into this serious problem of the lack of opportunity in Wales for young people to get the speech and language therapy that they deserve, and for the parents to have the support that they need and want.

**Gareth Jones:** Mae gofyn inni nodi adroddiad, sy'n ein hatgoffa, wedi bron i bedair blynedd o Lywodraeth Lafur yn y Cynulliad, fod diffygion a gwendidau amlwg yn bodoli yn y gwasanaeth a gynigir i blant ag anghenion iechyd arbennig. Mae'r methiant i ddarparu gwasanaethau effeithiol cydlynnus a dibynadwy ar ôl Cynulliad cyfan yn sicr o fod yn siom i'r plant a'r teuluoedd, y gweithwyr allweddol, pawb arall sydd wedi gweithio mor galed i dynnu sylw'r

Edmygaf waith y Pwyllgor, ond rhaid inni fynd i'r afael â'r broblem hon heddiw. Gobeithiaf y bydd y Gweinidog yn ystyried yn ofalus a oes arnom angen tasglu argyfwng. Nid yw'r broblem yn diflannu mewn mannau fel Blaenau Gwent. Gallem fod wedi cael canolfan I CAN, yr oeddwn i'n edrych ymlaen ati ac a gefnogwyd gan gyngor sir Torfaen a chyngor Blaenau Gwent, ond nid gan Awdurdod Iechyd Gwent ac Ymddiriedolaeth Gofal Iechyd Gwent, gwaetha'r modd, ac mae'r plant sy'n dioddef gan y namau hynny ar eu lleferydd ac sydd ag angen cymorth wedi colli'r cyfle hwnnw. Mae eu rhieni'n teimlo weithiau eu bod wedi'u hanghofio am nad yw'r system yn gweithredu fel y dylai. Gan hynny, croesawaf yr argymhelliaid yn yr adroddiad y dylid sefydlu canolfannau cymorth a chyngor anghenion arbennig ym mhob ardal. Mae hynny'n gadarnhaol, fel y mae'r materion eraill a grybwyllywyd, fel penodi aelod o fwrdd iechyd lleol i fod yn gyfrifol am wasanaethau iechyd plant—math o gefnogwr ym mhob ardal—gan fod llawer o'r problemau anatyniadol mewn bywyd yn cael eu hanwybyddu'n aml.

Adroddiad pwysig yw hwn, sy'n dangos y cyfeiriad iawn i ni. **Gareth Jones:** We are asked to note a report that reminds us that, after almost four years of a Labour Government in the Assembly, there are deficiencies and obvious weaknesses in the services that are offered to children with special health needs. The failure to provide effective, co-ordinated and reliable services after a full Assembly is sure to be a disappointment for children and their families, the key workers, and everyone else who has worked so hard to draw the attention

Yr oedd y strategaeth honno yn argymhellir yn yr adroddiad hwn, sef canoli'r gwasanaeth o amgylch y plentyn, asesu anghenion Cymru gyfan a sicrhau cydweithio effeithiol rhwng asiantaethau. Yr ydym wedi clywed hyn i gyd o'r blaen. Cyhoeddwyd adroddiad arall, 'Gwired du'r Addeewidion', a groesawyd yn y Cyfarfod Llawn ar 4 Gorffennaf 2002, ac a arweiniodd at adroddiad arall yn y Gogledd, sef, 'Strategaeth Ddrafft ar gyfer Plant ac Oedolion gydag Anableddau Dysgu yng Ngogledd Cymru'. Unwaith eto, addewid o newidiadau er gwell sydd yma ac nid strategaeth yng ngwir ystyr y gair gydag amserlen o dargedau ac arian wedi ei glustnodi ar eu cyfer.

Mae'r holl adroddiadau hyn, ac eraill, yn symptom o salwch meddyliol gwleidyddol—yr hyn a elwir gan y Sais yn *analysis paralysis*. Mae'r salwch hwn yn peri i'r Llywodraeth a'i chyd-gleifion, y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol—gan eu bod bob amser am hawlio'r clod—ddadansoddi popeth, a newid dim yn y diwedd. Ar ben hynny, bydd llawer o'r argymhellion pwysig y cyfeirir atynt yn yr adroddiad yn sicr o fynd ar goll yn y dadansoddiad diangen arall sy'n digwydd, sef ailstrwythuro'r gwasanaeth iechyd yn gyfan gwbl.

Mae'r adroddiad hwn yn cyfeirio at anghenion arbennig mewn perthynas ag addysg. of the Minister and all Assembly Members to the obvious deficiencies in the service. There are references to good practice, but they are scarce. This is another report to add to the pile that the Government has already published on the same subject. What happened to the strategy, launched in September 2001, on child and adolescent mental health service, 'Everybody's Business'?

That strategy made several recommendations that are also made in this report, namely focusing the service on the child, assessing the needs of the whole of Wales and ensuring effective co-operation between agencies. We have heard it all before. Another report was published, 'Fulfilling the Promises', which was welcomed in Plenary on 4 July 2002, and which led to another report in north Wales, namely, 'Draft Strategy for Children and Adults with Learning Disabilities in North Wales'. Once again, there is a promise that improvements will be made but there is no strategy in the true sense of the word with a timetable of targets and money allocated for them.

All these reports, and others, are a symptom of political mental illness—what is called 'analysis paralysis'. This illness makes the Government and its fellow-patients, the Liberal Democrats—as they always insist on claiming the credit—analyse everything, but change nothing in the end. On top of that, many of the important recommendations that are referred to in the report will certainly be lost in the other unnecessary analysis that is happening, which is the wholesale restructuring of the health service.

This report refers to special needs in relation to education. How exactly will any Minister respond to the recommendation that parents should be allowed to choose a suitable school for their child? Are we referring to special schools, or to mainstream schools? How on earth can you expand the choice for parents, while special schools are either closing or are in the process of being adapted for children with behavioural problems? How many special schools for the partially blind or deaf

**Val Lloyd:** I too welcome the work in this important area, which is evident in this report. I am also pleased that the evidence was gathered from such a wide range of individuals and organisations.

Kirsty talked about waiting for a diagnosis, which is, at any time, a nerve-racking experience, even for oneself. However, waiting for a firm diagnosis for a child in your care must be even worse. The inevitable stress could well be exacerbated by other feelings, particularly more personal ones, as specific to each case. Therefore, the need for privacy, sensitivity, and protected time for the initial discussion, which is mentioned in the document, is an important recommendation. As well as this, information must be given in a language that is understandable to those caring for the child and, if applicable, to the child itself.

Immediate reactions to hearing a diagnosis vary, but there must be follow-up opportunities for parents to question and talk at length with suitably knowledgeable health practitioners as soon as they are ready. The anxiety surrounding the diagnosis may not

do we have in Wales at the moment? How can any Minister satisfy this demand to be able to choose schools under such circumstances when we are undermining our present resources? What provision will be available to increase the number of therapists—to which Peter Law referred—especially those who work through the medium of Welsh? This situation is just as complex today as it was four years ago. The same is true in terms of dyslexic needs.

Once again, I have no difficulty in noting this report, which reminds us vividly of our desperate situation in such a crucial field—and I am grateful for this report. However, when will we have the pleasure of noting a strategy by the Government of Wales that states what improvements we can look forward to, when they will be delivered, and how much money will be allocated for them, to help children who have special health needs and who are suffering under the present service, as this report reminds us?

**Val Lloyd:** Yr wyf finnau'n croesawu'r gwaith yn y maes pwysig hwn, a welir yn yr adroddiad hwn. Yr wyf hefyd yn falch i'r dystiolaeth gael ei chasglu o blith amrediad mor eang o unigolion a chyrff.

Soniodd Kirsty am aros am ddiagnosis, sy'n brofiad dirdynnol ar unrhyw adeg, hyd yn oed ar eich cyfer eich hun. Fodd bynnag, mae aros am ddiagnosis pendant ar gyfer plentyn sydd o dan eich gofal yn sier o fod yn waeth byth. Gallai'r straen anorfol gael ei ddwysáu gan deimladau eraill, yn enwedig rhai mwy personol, yn ôl yr achos penodol. Gan hynny, mae'r argymhelliaid am yr angen am breifatrwydd, sensitifrwydd, a diogelu amser ar gyfer y drafodaeth ddechreuel, a grybwyllir yn y ddogfen, yn un pwysig. Yn ogystal â hynny, rhaid rhoi gwybodaeth mewn iaith sy'n ddealladwy i'r rhai sy'n gofalu am y plentyn ac, os yw'n berthnasol, y plentyn ei hun.

Mae'r ymateb yn syth ar ôl clywed diagnosis yn amrywio, ond rhaid cael cyfleoedd ar ôl hynny i rieni ofyn cwestiynau a siarad yn hirfaith ag ymarferwyr iechyd sydd â gwybodaeth briodol cyn gynted ag y byddont yn barod. Oherwydd y pryder ynghylch y

lead them to absorb everything at first, and time for reflection is needed. It might be an idea to offer comprehensive advice in a written and/or visual format, which can be reviewed in more familiar surroundings. Perhaps it would be even better to have a contact number for those who have either personal or professional experience of this specific diagnosis to offer a friendly ear and a friendly voice to those whose loved ones have just been diagnosed with this problem. Recommendations 6 and 7 cover this ground, but they are not as explicit as I would have liked.

David has already talked about the need for a key workers. When I have talked with parents whose children have special health needs, that necessitate multi-agency participation it is noticeable that those who have had early identification of a key worker or a co-ordinator feel more in control, more involved, and better able to cope and adjust than those who have not. I strongly support the use of parent-held records. These empower parents, and facilitate the sharing of information between agencies. There are excellent examples of joint working between agencies, and examples of good practice should always be disseminated. However, like the parent-held records, the major beneficiary of joint working should be—and is—the child, although there are subsidiary benefits to the agencies involved.

Respite services have also been highlighted. From the letters in my postbag it seems that access to these is problematic. Parents value them, but they sometimes find that access is limited, and the nature of the services on offer does not always match their specific needs or the needs of their child. I recognise, as have others, that there is heavy demand on those services, but they are desperately needed. The main problem that I have come across, as well as that of the amount of services on offer, is the flexibility needed to match varying demands. Respite care is not an added extra, it is essential for the health of parents and siblings, allowing them to recharge their batteries and sustain their caring responsibilities.

Mae David wedi sôn eisoes am yr angen am weithwyr allweddol. Pan siaradaf â rhieni y mae eu plant ag anghenion iechyd arbennig, sy'n gofyn cyfraniad gan sawl asiantaeth, gellir sylwi bod y rhai y dynodwyd gweithiwr allweddol neu gydlynnydd ar eu cyfer yn fuan, yn teimlo bod ganddynt fwy o reolaeth a chysylltiad, a'u bod yn gallu ymdopi ac ymaddasu'n well na'r rhai sydd heb un. Yr wyf yn gadarn o blaid defnyddio cofnodion a ddelir gan rieni. Mae'r rhain yn galluogi rhieni, ac yn hwyluso rhannu gwybodaeth rhwng asiantaethau. Mae engriffiatau rhagorol o weithio ar y cyd rhwng asiantaethau, a dylid lledaenu engriffiatau o arfer da bob amser. Fodd bynnag, yn yr un modd â chofnodion a ddelir gan rieni, yr un a ddylai—ac sydd—yn elwa'n bennaf yw'r plentyn, er bod manteision yn sgîl hynny i'r asiantaethau sy'n gysylltiedig.

Tynnwyd sylw at wasanaethau gofal seibiant hefyd. Yn ôl y llythyrau a dderbyniad, ymddengys bod problemau wrth gael mynediad iddynyt. Mae rhieni'n eu gwerthfawrogi, ond weithiau maent yn cael fod y mynediad iddynt yn gyfyngedig, ac nad yw natur y gwasanaethau a gynigir yn addas bob tro i'w hanghenion penodol hwy neu anghenion eu plentyn. Yr wyf yn cydnabod, fel y gwnaeth eraill, fod galwadau mawr ar y gwasanaethau hynny, ond mae taer angen amdanynt. I too welcome the Committee's views that the recommendations of Professor Clark's report on the school nursing service should be implemented. It could be claimed that I say that because I have worked with June Clark for several years. However, the recommendations in that school nursing service report will benefit not only children who have special health needs, but all children. It was evident throughout the review that there is a pressing need for more detailed and focused research on operational practices so that a sound body of validated knowledge can be built up and used to inform evidence-based practice. This will assist practitioners across the relevant services and agencies to further develop their knowledge and skills, and to continue providing the best quality care for children with special health needs.

**William Graham:** I am not a member of the Health and Social Services Committee, but I was impressed with its report, and I congratulate its members on bringing forward the most relevant recommendations. As part of one's duties as an Assembly Member, it has been a privilege to raise awareness of a wide spectrum of disabilities, particularly autism, which, unfortunately, is becoming all too common.

I will also discuss recommendations 6 and 7, regarding the provision of information. As previous speakers have said, these recommendations are welcome, but they perhaps need to be strengthened further—no doubt the Chair of the Committee will consider that further. Statementing is a legal right—I direct that primarily at local authorities. It is not a stigma; it is a way of obtaining specialist services. Recommendation 12 recognises the acute shortage of speech therapists. I would welcome an assurance from the Minister that she will consider this, particularly the fact that those speech therapists should be sensitive to culture and language.

On the provision of equipment, I was particularly surprised that there was not more

Fel rhan o'm dyletswyddau fel Aelod Cynulliad, bu'n faint cael hybu ymwybyddiaeth o amrediad eang o anableddau, ac awtistaeth yn enwedig, sy'n dod yn gyffredin iawn, gwaetha'r modd.

Trafodaf innau hefyd argymhellion 6 a 7, sy'n ymwneud â darparu gwybodaeth. As Chair of the former Pre-16 Education Committee, I was incredibly impressed with the service provided at Trinity Fields Special School in Caerphilly, yet the service at a special needs school in Haverfordwest, which was provided with great love and enthusiasm, was, frankly, amateur. I know that the Minister will reconsider that. It is hoped that, on recommendation 26, which describes the codification of practice, as my colleague has often said, best practice should be usual practice.

**Eleanor Burnham:** I also welcome this report to help children and young people with special educational needs and behavioural challenges, and their families, through the medium of English and Welsh.

In July 2002, the Audit Commission's report found that the needs of children with the most severe special educational needs are often not met by the present costly, bureaucratic and slow system. It stated that one in five children has some form of special educational needs, ranging from mild dyslexia to behavioural problems to complex medical conditions. In most cases, this is dealt with in schools, but some need more than their school can provide, as I discovered when dealing peripatetically with under-achieving 14 to 16-year-olds in north Wales, prior to becoming an Assembly Member. The Audit Commission report called for a high level, independent review of the system in England and Wales.

There are pockets of good practice across Wales, but more needs to be done to ensure that these families receive the best services, from initial diagnosis through to a smooth transition to adult services. That can only be achieved by sharing validated good practice, and cohesive working between the various agencies and the families and carers. Based on this admirable report to the Health and Social Services Committee these practices, which have been highlighted, but which I will skim through quickly, include the co-

Ym mis Gorffennaf 2002, canfu adroddiad y Comisiwn Archwilio nad yw anghenion plant sydd â'r anghenion addysgol arbennig mwyaf difrifol yn cael eu diwallu mewn llawer achos gan y system ddrud, fiwrocataidd ac araf a geir ar hyn o bryd. Dywedodd fod gan un o bob pump o blant ryw fath o angen addysgol arbennig, yn amrywio o ddyslecsia cymedrol i broblemau ymddygiadol i anhwylderâu meddygol cymhleth. ordination of health, education and other officials and agencies from the local level up to the national level—and to Westminster where appropriate. This will help to ensure, among other things, early detection and optimal treatment of special needs as quickly and as effectively as possible. They will also include feedback and consultation in policy making and implementation with the parents and practitioners involved in day-to-day childcare to ensure that Government activities target the needs of particular families, children and localities. They also include ensuring that a key worker service assigns an agent to individual children to help co-ordinate health, social, and educational services concerning care for each individual child; ensuring that equipment and other infrastructure resources are available to meet the specific needs of these children; and improving speech disability services for children with special needs, particularly with regard to Welsh language specialists.

All these need to be adequately funded. I trust that the Minister will commit fully to addressing these challenges as soon as possible, to support children, young people, and their families who face these enormous challenges that blight their lives.

**Karen Sinclair:** I also welcome this thorough report. I am pleased that the report notes that work is needed to ensure the smooth transition from children's services to adult services, for youngsters with complex special needs in relation to respite care. This needs to be not just acknowledged as a problem, but also prioritised for improvement. The report mentions encouraging best practice and pooling budgets. I would argue that we should go much further than encouragement. At present, the differences in terms of provision, certainly in my constituency, is startling. Currently, at the transition stage, parents—who are also usually the primary carers—find that the provision that they have received over the years for people with complex health and social needs dries up. They also find that, suddenly, the potential providers from health and social services are more interested in protecting their budgets than offering care

Yr wyf yn falch bod yr adroddiad yn nodi bod angen gwaith i sicrhau trawsnewid esmwyth o wasanaethau i blant i wasanaethau i oedolion, ar gyfer pobl ifanc sydd ag anghenion arbennig cymhleth mewn cysylltiad â gofal sebiant. Parents—the 24-hour carers—are left facing a future where they are subjected to listening to arguments as to which percentage of their child's needs falls to a health budget, and which percentage falls to a social services budget. This distasteful argument often leaves parents who are becoming older feeling absolutely desperate. Their natural support network of other parents, met through school events, has fallen away, as school no longer features in their lives, and it is often left to individual parents to fight alone for their own and their children's rights. Many parents, left exhausted by their carer role, become depressed, disillusioned and desperate. It is imperative that we ensure equal access to respite care for adults with complex special needs, equal to that on offer to those under 19 years of age. The biggest reassurance that you can give to the parent of a child with complex special needs is that their son or daughter will receive quality care, commensurate with their needs, regardless of whose budget pays for it. They need an assurance that the respite care on offer, as they move from children's services to adult services, remains of high quality. Parents need the assurance that the transition will be smooth and as event-free as possible. Their lives are complicated enough, and they deserve our support.

**Christine Chapman:** Like many Members, I regularly meet parents who are concerned about special needs provision for their children. I agree with Peter Law that problems with speech and language therapy services are particularly acute in poorer areas.

On children with special educational needs, I also flag up the problem of Asperger's syndrome, which Dai Lloyd mentioned earlier. Children with Asperger's have difficulties in socialising, communication and behaviour. It can be traumatic for a parent to receive the news that their child is affected by

**Christine Chapman:** Fel llawer o Aelodau, yr wyf yn cwrdd yn rheolaidd â rhieni sy'n bryderus ynghylch darpariaeth anghenion arbennig ar gyfer eu plant. Cytunaf â Peter Law fod problemau o ran gwasanaethau therapi iaith a lleferydd yn arbennig o ddifrifol mewn ardaloedd tlotach.

Ynghylch plant ag anghenion addysgol arbennig, yr wyf finnau'n tynnu sylw at broblem syndrom Asperger, y cyfeiriodd Dai Lloyd ati'n gynharach. Mae plant sydd â syndrom Asperger yn profi anawsterau o ran cymdeithasu, cyfathrebu ac o ran eu hymddygiad. Gall fod yn brofiad ysgytvol i

Asperger's. Kirsty mentioned the disruption that the syndrome can cause to other siblings and parents. Living in a household where a child has Asperger's can be extremely stressful.

Parents will want to have the best possible advice and support. A number of parents in my constituency have told me that that support is not always forthcoming. Parents often complain that statementing takes too long, thus delaying the time until an assessment can be given. As I understand it, under the current rules, if a child has an IQ that is below 75, then support is given; but if a child has an IQ above 75, then it is extremely difficult to get support; flexibility is needed.

That children with special needs are being supported in mainstream schools, and are being educated with their friends and in the community in which they live, should be welcomed. Nevertheless, that support can be patchy, depending on the school that the child attends. Expertise among teachers concerning the needs of children who have Asperger's syndrome is inconsistent. Unless that is examined children who need support will be faced with the lottery of provision that is dependent on where they live. Dealing with Asperger's syndrome should be given priority on teacher training courses.

I am pleased with the reference to the availability of care and treatment, and the apparent good practice that exists. However, the report states that

'that must be validated and disseminated.'

There is a gap in services. Parents have told me that it is difficult to access information about available support. A family that I am currently dealing with was initially told that their child did not have Asperger's syndrome. Despite being on benefits, they decided to have a private assessment done, at which time they learned that their child actually did have Asperger's. We need to minimise such cases. A consistent level of support needs to be guaranteed, irrespective of the region of Wales in which you live.

When faced with Asperger's syndrome, parents often get together to support each other. I pay tribute to the excellent work that is being done by the Cynon Valley Autism and Aspergers Support Group.

I welcome the report. It notes the good practice that exists, but Members need to ensure that the special needs provision benefits all young people who require it and not just a few.

**Lorraine Barrett:** I welcome Recommendation 18, which concerns the supply of equipment and having a designated lead agency in every area.

I dealt with a sad case of a four-year-old girl with cerebral palsy who desperately needed a particular type of chair, which would enable her to be more mobile, alert and safe. For months, the petition for the chair went back and forth between the health authority and the education and social services departments—by the end of that time, her parents were in despair. That went on until I became a pain in the neck, and the health authority eventually said that it would supply the chair. It is not right that a child and distraught parents should suffer for months in that way, with no-one taking responsibility. I hope that recommendation 18 is fully implemented.

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** I was pleased when the Health and Social Services Committee decided to review the health services for children with special needs. I commend the Committee, of which I was a Member, on its work and its report. The Committee thanks all those who gave evidence, both parents and professionals. I assure Members, and all who contributed, that they have had a major influence on the Welsh Assembly Government.

The opportunity for this kind of co-ordination is at the heart of delivering a better joined-up service for the families of children and young people. The Caerphilly children's centre project is led by a clinical nurse specialist, and her role is to develop a model of co-ordinated care for parents, aided and guided by the parents who are members of the parents' committee.

That is just one example of several projects across Wales where co-operation allows care to be co-ordinated across services for the benefit of children and their families. Another example is the multi-disciplinary service for disabled children in Bridgend, which is currently being developed. We must look to those projects as models for the rest of Wales. The flexibilities special grant is crucial, particularly the recommendation in relation to equipment. We already have a number of equipment stores across Wales, which have been funded by the Assembly Government's flexibilities special grant to local authorities.

I have considered each one of the Committee report's 26 recommendations, and I support all of them in principle. In fact, action is already underway to implement a number of those recommendations. An action plan is going out to Members this afternoon. I did not want to take all the time that I could have taken to respond, because this is such an important report. You will see the detailed Assembly Government response to every recommendation in the Committee's report in that action plan.

I will however mention some of the specific points. It is clear that, as Kirsty said, our children's national service framework will

Enghraifft arall yw'r gwasanaeth amlddisgyblaethol ar gyfer plant anabl ym Mhen-y-bont ar Ogwr sy'n cael ei ddatblygu ar hyn o bryd. Rhaid inni ystyried y prosiectau hynny'n fodelau i weddill Cymru. Mae'r grant hyblygrwydd arbennig yn hollbwysig, yn enwedig ar gyfer yr argymhelliaid sy'n ymwneud ag offer. Mae gennym nifer o storfeydd offer ledled Cymru eisoes, ac maent wedi'u cylrido drwy grant hyblygrwydd arbennig Llywodraeth y Cynulliad i awdurdodau lleol.

Yr wyf wedi ystyried pob un o'r 26 o argymhellion sydd yn adroddiad y Pwyllgor, a chefnogaf bob un ohonynt mewn egwyddor. Mewn gwirionedd, dechreuwyd cymryd camau eisoes i roi nifer o'r argymhellion hynny ar waith. Anfonir cynllun gweithredu at Aelodau y prynhawn yma. Nid oeddwn am gymryd yr holl amser y gallwn fod wedi'i gymryd i ymateb, oherwydd bod yr adroddiad hwn mor bwysig. take us forward strategically. Work that covers the whole spectrum of health and social care has already started in earnest. It will address the health and social care needs of children and young people from before conception to their eighteenth birthday. Ann Jones's point about low birth-weight is important, and we must tackle the social aspect of that through the impact of Sure Start and the wider social health and wellbeing agenda.

The children's national service framework is moving forward, with expert groups considering how they can develop standards for the first phase of their work. A child-centred approach directs us to establish care pathways that a child can travel through with their family and to establish the standards of service that can be expected, so that we do not just rely on the good practice that we identified during our review. It must be a national service framework in which not only is health and social care provision co-ordinated, but education and housing services also. Parents should have a single point of contact in a key worker, and co-ordinated services.

Dai, I was disappointed by your negative response to the fact that Wales is taking forward a pioneering national strategy for autism. I was disappointed that you were not present when we launched that strategy. Autism Cymru is pleased that we are in the lead on this initiative. Yesterday, I met Scottish representatives who want to learn about our Welsh national strategy for autism, because it gives us a lead in securing high-quality services of proven effectiveness. They must be uniformly accessible across Wales. The social care needs are already being addressed under our Children First programme. We are already seeing development in terms of our all-Wales disability managers' network group, which has developed as a result of Children First.

A number of people have mentioned respite care, Karen, in particular. That is an important group for ensuring that we can

Yr oeddwn yn siomedig nad oeddech yn bresennol pan wnaethom lansio'r strategaeth honno. Mae Awstisiaeth Cymru yn falch ein bod ar y blaen gyda'r fenter hon. Ddoe, cyfarfum â chynrychiolwyr o'r Alban sydd am gael gwybod am ein strategaeth genedlaethol Gymreig ar gyfer awtistiaeth, am ei bod yn rhoi mantais inni wrth sierhau gwasanaethau o ansawdd da y profwyd eu bod yn effeithiol. identify particular respite service needs. Our carers' special grant also indicates that there must be respite for children with special needs. We must remember that disabled children and their families will access a greater range and choice of services through direct payment and voucher schemes.

Speech and language therapy is critical, and Peter Law and many others have mentioned this. Jane Davidson and I have set up a multi-disciplinary group to address this issue. We are receiving a report from that group shortly. In our workforce plans we have said that we must identify the number of speech and language therapists and increase the numbers in training. Cynog and others discussed language therapy assistants and we must consider how we can make better use of them.

We must also ensure that we take forward—as Dai and many others mentioned—our own unique code on special needs, which focuses on Welsh issues, including the Welsh language and Welsh circumstances and structures. The Assembly backed it unanimously in November 2001 and schools and local education authorities must implement it from April 2002.

We are taking many of these recommendations forward. This excellent report was brought to the Committee and I pay tribute to all who contributed to it and to Kirsty's leadership in delivering a report that is evidently from the people of Wales. As I have demonstrated today, the Welsh Assembly Government is taking this forward and will ensure that the changes are delivered through its national service framework and all the other measures which I have mentioned.

**Kirsty Williams:** I thank everyone for their contributions and comments on this report, especially my fellow Committee members. I welcome both Dai Lloyd and David Melding's comments as they have worked hard, as have other Committee members, in preparing this report.

Ann took the opportunity—as she did

throughout the review—to raise the important issue of low birth-weight babies. I am grateful that she has done so. We could do much more as a nation to improve the worrying statistics that she quoted. I am pleased that David pointed out that many of our recommendations must be implemented because there is agreement about a lack of resources. Much of what we found as a Committee, and much of what we comment on simply requires people to improve their co-operation and we cannot use a lack of resources as an excuse for that. There is no reason why many of these recommendations cannot be achieved because many simply require people to break down the traditional barriers of how they worked in the past and move forward.

Peter Law highlights a problem that affects his constituency badly; the Gwent region probably has some of the longest waiting lists for speech and language therapists. It is unacceptable to the Health and Social Services Committee that constituents in Gwent should wait such a long time when children in other parts of Wales receive the service within a reasonable timescale. That inequality cannot be acceptable to any of us in this Chamber. I am grateful for Val's comments: she brings great professional expertise in this field to this debate. I also appreciate the positive comments of William Graham and Eleanor Burnham. Karen Sinclair raised the vexed issue of the transition period as a person moves from children's to adult services. It is highly complex and worrying for parents who are getting on in age. They are looking for reassurance about what will happen to their child while their ability to care for that child is perhaps lessening. If I were to consider leading on another Committee report at another time we would do well to look at services in that particular area. Christine Chapman and Lorraine Barrett, I hope that the report has some resonance for you, that it reflects the particular problems that constituents bring to you and that it addresses those particular concerns.

In that time, the Committee has added great value to the work of the National Assembly and, in preparing reports of this kind, it has demonstrated how the National Assembly can work at its best, with Members from all political parties sharing their views and ideas around the table and discussing them without adopting the yah-boos style that is often seen in the Chamber. As a result of such positive work we have created a positive report. The challenge of making that report a reality now lies in the

## **Dyfodol y Cynlluniau Amaeth-Amgylcheddol** **The Future of Agri-Environmental Schemes**

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** I have **Y Dirprwy Lywydd:** Yr wyf wedi dethol

selected amendments 1, 2 and 3 in the name of Jonathan Morgan.

**The Deputy First Minister and Minister for Rural Development and Wales Abroad (Michael German):** I propose that

*the National Assembly for Wales recognises the valuable contribution made by the Tir Gofal and organic farming schemes to the promotion of environmental sustainability in Wales, and agrees that every effort should be made to broaden the scope of future agri-environmental schemes, subject to the outcome of the mid-term review of the common agricultural policy, so that environmental benefits across Wales are maximised. (NDM1344)*

Agri-environmental schemes are the sharp end of a new way of thinking about agriculture, management of the environment and the Welsh countryside. Our scheme, Tir Gofal, is an internationally recognised model due to its whole-farm, comprehensive approach. I can now announce the details of our new organic stewardship payments, which will be significantly higher than those being introduced in England. Agri-environmental schemes are here to stay. We must look to the future and take further steps to enhance environmental management.

The first agri-environmental scheme in Wales was the Cambrian mountains and Llŷn peninsula environmentally sensitive area scheme, which was later extended to other parts of Wales. Tir Cymen was introduced in 1992 and was available in three pilot areas. The habitat scheme, a part-farm scheme, was introduced to protect and enhance habitats like broadleaved woodlands, semi-natural grasslands and coastal belts. The moorland scheme was set up to protect moorlands through stocking rate reductions. The success of those schemes was such that, by 1996, consultation identified overwhelming support for a single whole-farm agri-environmental scheme that would be available throughout Wales.

Tir Gofal was launched in 1999 as the

Cynlluniau amaeth-amgylcheddol yw'r elfen fwyaf blaengar mewn ffordd newydd o feddwl am amaethyddiaeth, rheoli'r amgylchedd a chefn gwlad Cymru. Mae ein cynllun, Tir Gofal, yn fodel a gydnabuwyd yn rhwngwladol oherwydd ei ddull cynhwysfawr sy'n ymwneud â'r fferm gyfan. Yn awr, gallaf gyhoeddi manylion ein taliadau stiwardiaeth organig newydd, a fydd yn uwch o lawer na'r rhai a gyflwynir yn Lloegr. Mae cynlluniau amaeth-amgylcheddol wedi ennill eu plwyf. Rhaid inni edrych tua'r dyfodol a chymryd camau pellach i wella'r rheolaeth ar yr amgylchedd.

Y cynllun amaeth-amgylcheddol cyntaf yng Nghymru oedd cynllun ardal amgylchedd arbennig mynyddoedd y Cambrian a phenrhyn Llŷn, a estynnwyd yn ddiweddarach i gynnwys rhannau eraill o Gymru. Cyflwynwyd Tir Cymen yn 1992 ac yr oedd ar gael mewn tair ardal beilot. Cyflwynwyd y cynllun cynefinoedd, cynllun ar gyfer rhannau o ffermydd, i ddiogelu a gwella cynefinoedd fel coetiroedd llydanddail, tir glas lled-naturiol a lleiniau arfordirol. Sefydlwyd y cynllun rhostir i ddiogelu rhostiroedd drwy ostwng cyfraddau stocio. Gymaint oedd llwyddiant y cynlluniau hynny fel i broses ymgynghori yn 1996 amlygu cefnogaeth ysgubol i ddatblygu un cynllun amaeth-amgylcheddol ar gyfer ffermydd cyfan a fyddai ar gael ledled Cymru.

Lansiwyd Tir Gofal yn 1999 fel prif gynllun

Assembly's flagship environmentally-friendly farming scheme and it is regarded as one of the best of its type in Europe. Its principal objectives are to improve, restore and create wildlife habitats; to protect and restore characteristic rural landscapes; to protect and conserve historic and archaeological features; and to provide public access to the countryside. It covers whole farms and is available throughout Wales. To date some 1,300 agreements have been signed and a further 200 are in their final stages. It gave me great pleasure, last September, to visit the thousandth farmer to have joined Tir Gofal and the next milestone, the two-thousandth agreement, should be reached by the end of this year.

By the end of this financial year, some £26 million will have been committed to Tir Gofal agreements and a further £55 million is committed for the next three years. This is overwhelmingly from Assembly resources, and only around 15 per cent comes from the European Union. In addition, we will be recycling modulation receipts, which are expected to have reached £7.5 million by October 2003, to further increase the total available resources. As questions have been asked about modulation, I should mention that in 2002, for the first time, £725,000 in modulation money became available to the Assembly to spend on Tir Gofal. However, because of the foot and mouth disease outbreak in the previous year, which meant that our inspectors and those within the Countryside Council for Wales who were dealing with the scheme were unable to gain access to farms, there was an underspend in the Tir Gofal budget for that year.

We have therefore rolled the money forward. N+3 applies in this scheme and we have until October 2004 to spend the 2001 receipts, although I anticipate that we will have spent all of those receipts during this current year.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** You make a great deal of the fact that all of this money is available, but do you recognise that a significant number of farmers in Wales have still not received their environmentally sensitive area payments, to which they have been entitled for over six

Ei brif amcanion yw gwella, adfer a chreu cynefinoedd i fywyd gwylt; diogelu ac adfer nodweddion tirluniau gwledig; diogelu a chadw nodweddion hanesyddol ac archaeolegol; a darparu mynediad i'r cyhoedd i gefn gwlad. Daw'r rhan helaethaf ohono o adnoddau'r Cynulliad, a dim ond tua 15 y cant a ddaw o'r Undeb Ewropeaidd. **Ieuan Wyn Jones:** Yr ydych yn gwneud yn fawr o'r ffaith bod yr holl arian hwn ar gael, ond a ydych yn cydnabod bod nifer fawr o ffermwyr yng Nghymru heb dderbyn eu taliadau ardal amgylchedd arbennig eto, a hwythau â hawl i'w derbyn ers dros chwe

months? They have now been told that the Welsh Assembly Government has no facility to pay them. Can you assure us that these payments will be made quickly, and that the arrangements for doing so are in place?

**Michael German:** I assure you that Assembly officials are making every effort to ensure that all payments are made as rapidly as possible and that the rate of payment is accelerated.

We have carried out a thorough stock-take of Tir Gofal, which is important, because it was clear from the beginning that the administration needed to be streamlined to enable a greater number of farmers to benefit from the scheme. The resulting changes will be introduced by the time that the scheme reopens later this year.

The organic farming scheme is more specialised and has different objectives. Organic farming offers significant environmental benefits and the level of payments reflects this. To date, more than 550 farms have entered the scheme and the support that we have provided for conversion, through the establishment of Organic Centre Wales and through the provision of specialist advice as a part of Farming Connect, is tailored to maximise the environmental gains and to deliver a viable organic business.

I announced last October that I would introduce new payments for organic stewardship. This will be realised through an amendment to the organic farming scheme, and there are several improvements. Current and new agreements will be extended from five to 10 years—

**Michael German:** I will take an intervention when I finish discussing the improvements.

There will be an option to withdraw at the fifth anniversary. Farmers who have converted to organic production without assistance will be eligible to enter the scheme for a five-year period. Payment rates in years 4 and 5 will be increased from £20 to £35 per hectare on arable land, from £15 to £35 per

mis? Dywedwyd wrthynt bellach nad oes gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru gyfleuster i'w talu. A allwch ein sicrhau y gwneir y taliadau hyn yn gyflym, a bod y trefniadau i wneud hynny ar waith?

**Michael German:** Yr wyf yn eich sicrhau bod swyddogion y Cynulliad yn gwneud pob ymdrech i sicrhau y gwneir yr holl daliadau cyn gynted ag y bo modd ac y cyflymir y gyfraddal.

**Michael German:** Gwnaf dderbyn ymyriad ar ôl gorffen trafod y gwelliannau.

The new rates are significantly higher than those announced by the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs in England. Our arable rate is £5 per hectare or 17 per cent higher, our enclosed land rate is £12 per hectare or 52 per cent higher, and our unenclosed land rate is £5 per hectare or 100 per cent higher. These changes must be approved by the European Commission before they can be introduced. They were submitted at the end of last year and I expect to hear the outcome within a few months. This stewardship scheme is a significant initiative and another important example of our commitment to the organic sector in Wales.

**Peter Rogers:** You say that you have plans for the organic sector in Wales, but why have last year's organic conversion payments not been made? I remember seeing Eleanor Burnham in Anglesey in October, asking about those payments. They have still not been made. Why will you not make these organic conversion payments?

**Michael German:** I refer you to the reason that I gave earlier.

It is too early to make a full evaluation of Tir Gofal, but the results so far indicate that there is a strong case for the existence of a whole-farm agri-environmental scheme such as Tir Gofal in Wales. I welcome the fact that the Assembly's Agriculture and Rural Development Committee is considering these issues, because we need to further develop the agri-environmental approach for several reasons. First, farmers feel that if they are all required to contribute towards the funding of a rural development measure, they should all be able to benefit from it. There is a long waiting list for Tir Gofal, which is a measure of its popularity. At the same time, it has exacting requirements, and there is a strong feeling that we should take a broader approach and give farmers access to at least a first level of agri-environmental payments in return for meeting basic environmental

Such challenges include tackling diffused pollution, enhancing biodiversity, safeguarding the historic environment and traditional landscapes and providing new public access. In conjunction with proposals for a broader scheme, I also intend to develop proposals for co-operative action to tackle specific issues, including commons management, diffused pollution within a river catchment and protection of critical species or wildlife habitats in targeted geographical areas. We are developing proposals for a river catchment scheme with several partners.

**Eleanor Burnham:** How do you address the difficulty that Dafydd Morris, the famous shepherd, brought to my attention a couple of weeks ago, namely that if there is open access to high ground those who farm that land cannot register as organic farmers because they cannot prove that every dog that comes onto the land has been sufficiently wormed? Can you reassure him that this is being addressed?

**Michael German:** The new access regulations being developed in Whitehall will have an impact on certain aspects of farming. We can discuss further how the organic scheme will work within the context of those regulations. In managing the uptake of the scheme, we can make adjustments to accommodate that.

**Michael German:** Ni fydd gennyd amser ar ôl os derbyniaf ragor o ymyriadau. Gall

make comments in their speeches and I will refer to them in my closing speech.

Later this year, we will consult more widely with the industry, environmental interests and the public to receive feedback on our proposals. I intend to develop a prototype scheme that can be piloted on a sample of farms before introducing the new scheme more widely.

All that has to be set in the context of the mid-term review of the common agricultural policy. Funding for the introduction of the new, broader scheme that I outlined will depend on the outcome of that review. A lot of hard negotiating needs to be done before we will be clear on what that outcome will be. Nevertheless, the proposals that we have developed with our funding partners represent an exciting opportunity—one that we are determined to achieve, if possible. I look to Members for support in taking this programme forward.

I now turn to the three amendments in the name of Jonathan Morgan. I will support amendment 1. I have already acknowledged the important role played by the Organic Centre Wales in developing the sector. I will not support amendments 2 and 3. Amendment 2 displays a lack of understanding of the processes involved, and of the regulatory framework for the use of modulated receipts. Amendment 3 fails to recognise that I have already announced the annual maintenance payments for organic farmers and that the detailed arrangements are subject to the European Commission accepting modifications to the rural development plan for Wales, which were submitted at the end of last year for its consideration.

A dderbyniwch fod ffermwyr sydd wedi trosglwyddo i gynhyrchu'n organig ac wedi derbyn y tâl trosglwyddo yn wynebu problemau ariannol unwaith y daw'r tâl hwnnw i ben? Mae ffermwyr yn disgwyl yr arian hwnnw, ac mae'r £7 miliwn yn ychwanegol at y swm sy'n daladwy o dan bolisi amaethyddol cyffredinol Ewrop, sef dros £70 miliwn. changes, it will remain the case that not enough farmers will be able to access Tir Gofal to make a fundamental difference to the situation of agriculture in Wales. I hope that the Minister will accept that.

I refer to figures that were published in the last few days on farm incomes. The likely net income in the dairy sector for 2002-03, for example, is half of what it was in the mid 1990s—in 1994-95, 1995-96 and 1996-97. Does the Minister accept that we are facing a real crisis? Has he considered how dairy farmers can access Tir Gofal? Those payments would be of great assistance to them in terms of their net income.

I also refer to what the Minister said about the organic scheme. I warmly welcome the statement that he made today on additional payments. If I understood correctly, you refer, Minister, to farmers who have transferred into the organic scheme without the help of conversion funding. Do you accept that farmers who have transferred into organic farming and who have received conversion payments face financial difficulties once those payments stop? That brings us back to the dairy sector because many farmers switched to producing organic milk when its price was around 33p or 34p per litre but, by now, it has fallen to 21p or 22p per litre. The difference between that and the price of conventionally-produced milk means that farmers have had to restrict production, and they face serious problems. Will the Minister also consider that situation?

Minister, do you accept that the problem with late payments creates difficulties for participants in these schemes? Do you accept that £7 million that is payable to farmers under the agri-environmental schemes, and in payments of farm improvement grants and farm enterprise grants, is late? Farmers are expecting that money, and the £7 million is in addition to the sum payable under the European common agricultural policy, which amounts to more than £70 million. Farmers expected to receive that money by now, but they are still waiting, which causes great

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** I should have called Peter Rogers first to propose the amendments. Peter, I apologise for calling Rhodri Glyn Thomas instead, and I apologise to Rhodri, as he made his speech without the benefit of hearing what Peter Rogers was going to say. However, nothing is lost; I will put it right by calling Peter Rogers.

**Peter Rogers:** I propose amendment 1, 2 and 3 in the name of Jonathan Morgan. Amendment 1: add a new point:

*acknowledges the contribution to the development of organic farming in Wales by the Organic Centre Wales.*

I propose amendment 2: add a new point:

*regrets the failure of the Government to apply money modulated from EU support payments to agri-environmental schemes in an acceptable time frame.*

I propose amendment 3: add a new point:

problems for them.

I do not want to rehearse the debate on late payments. We have drawn the matter to the Minister's attention in as direct a manner as possible, but we ask him to accept that the situation is grave.

Within the broader picture, it is acknowledged that we want to be moved from pillar 1 to pillar 2 status. We see the value of that, especially when we receive match funding from the Treasury. Will the Minister accept that there is a problem in terms of the British allocation of the European funds available, and the Welsh share of it, which means that we will not receive the European funds available to us? For instance, the Minister mentioned 15 per cent but the figure could be as much as 75 per cent in Objective 1 areas.

The time allocated to me is coming to an end—just like farmers' money. Plaid Cymru will support the three Conservative Party amendments, but we appreciate some of the Minister's statements this afternoon.

**Y Dirprwy Lywydd:** Dylwn fod wedi galw ar Peter Rogers yn gyntaf i gynnig y gwelliannau. *yn cydnabod cyfraniad canolfan organig Cymru i ddatblygiad ffermio organig yng Nghymru.*

Cynigiaf welliant 2: ychwanegu pwynt newydd:

*yn gresynu at fethiant y Llywodraeth i roi arian wedi'i fodwleiddio o daliadau cymorth yr UE i gynlluniau amaeth-amgylcheddol o fewn cyfnod derbyniol.*

Cynigiaf welliant 3: ychwanegu pwynt

newydd:

*regrets the failure of the coalition Government to make announcements about annual maintenance payments to organic farmers within an acceptable time frame.*

It is not a problem that I did not propose my amendments first. Judging by how many Members are present in the Chamber, I think that some people have had enough of what is happening to agriculture.

The Assembly is now in its fourth year and, the more we go down this road—and having had to listen to the standard of Mike's answers on payments to Ieuan and me—the more I find it unacceptable that a Minister has reached this stage without gaining an understanding of the problem. We know what the problem is and it has nothing to do with any computer; it is that staff were moved out of offices in May, moved from processing agri-environmental schemes to processing cattle movement tracing schemes, and they have not been returned to process the agri-environmental schemes. That is why farmers now face late payments.

Do not shake your head, Mike, we know very well what is wrong; you will not acknowledge anything that has happened and you are a disgrace as a Minister.

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. Peter, the word ‘disgrace’ crosses over the boundary of acceptable language. Use a nicer word. [Laughter.]

**Glyn Davies:** We could come up with a few. What about ‘pillar of incompetence’? Maybe Members have ideas about other words that we could use to describe him.

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. I am sorry now that I interrupted you, Peter. Please carry on.

**Peter Rogers:** Returning to organic farming—another of the Government’s

**Y Dirprwy Lywydd:** Trefn. Peter, mae'r geiriau 'testun cywilydd' yn croesi ffin yr hyn sy'n dderbynio. Defnyddiwch air mwy dymunol. [Chwerthin.]

**Glyn Davies:** Gallem feddw am rai. Beth am 'golofn o anallu'? Efallai fod gan Aelodau syniadau am eiriau eraill y gallem eu defnyddio i'w ddisgrifio.

**Y Dirprwy Lywydd:** Trefn. Mae'n edifar gennylf yn awr am dorri ar eich traws, Peter. Ewch ymlaen, os gwelwch yn dda.

**Peter Rogers:** Gan droi'n ôl at ffermio organig—un arall o brif gynlluniau'r

flagship schemes—we heard about milk producers who switched to organic farming, and I remember attending the launch in Builth Wells. To convert to that scheme requires extensive work and, unless you can guarantee that the money spent will be earned back, the scheme is in danger of collapsing. For example, a farmer in north Wales, with two children of school age, was declared bankrupt because of the expense of diversifying to the organic farming scheme. He went through the independent appeals process and had to pay back £12,000. You know very well, Minister, that that was force majeure and that the Welsh Administration Ombudsman will find in favour of that.

You cannot deny people the money from these agri-environmental schemes, and you cannot continue being blasé about the future, because there will be no future for farming. I need only remind you of land in parts of France and Italy. Unless managed land is farmed in a system and unless you intend to provide support for family farming in Wales, as is the case in other parts of Europe, you will not begin to realise your vision of an appealing, sustainable and environmentally friendly landscape. The opposite is happening in many places and, until the Assembly wakes up and realises the importance of supporting farming, we are headed for disaster.

Members have asked and have written to you about payments to organic farming groups, yet we have received no response. It is inexcusable; this has nothing to do with payment windows. You tell the Assembly that you can make between 3,000 and 4,000 payments per day, but that is just about writing cheques. I do not know how many cheques you can write manually, but organic farmers have nothing to do with payment windows. You are in breach of legislation, Minister. It was your Government that raised this issue of bill payment in Parliament.

Our amendment 2 concerns the money modulated from EU support payments. It is vital that that should have been used. You pass it off by blaming foot and mouth disease, but why did you not include that extra money in last year's budget? You

created Tir Gofal for an elite. What about the young farmers who only took over the tenancies of farms in October? No provision was made for sheep and suckler cow quotas; we could not even give them a small base of financial return from Tir Gofal, because you turned them down. Money is there, which could amount to almost £17 million. That money should have been in the rural economy last year.

For goodness' sake, Mike, spare us any more of your hare-brained schemes. I suggest that you put your head down and walk away from this job, and let somebody who understands it and who appreciates the role that the Welsh farmer should have in this country come in.

**Mick Bates:** I welcome this opportunity to consider the future of agri-environmental schemes. This debate is essentially about land use and management, which is important to farmers' incomes. Fortunately, there has been a fundamental shift in attitude among the public and farmers about the need for agri-environmental schemes and good funding. A few years ago, the environment was seen as the domain of a few long-haired hippies living in a wigwam and the odd cranky farmer.

**Glyn Davies:** They are all on the front bench.

**Mick Bates:** I cannot see any.

We have come a long way since then, and agricultural interest groups and environmental lobby groups have made significant progress by working together—we must all remember that. Useful schemes have been established, such as the environmentally sensitive area scheme, Tir Cymen and Tir Gofal, the habitat scheme, the moorland scheme, organic schemes and a raft of cross-compliance measures that have pushed the industry into a more agri-environmental-orientated payment scheme. It is important not to lose sight at this stage of the importance of agri-environmental schemes, and that farming is about food production. The integration of these aims into agri-environmental schemes must take account of the issue of income through food production.

**Glyn Davies:** Maent i gyd ar y faint flaen.

**Mick Bates:** Ni allaf fi eu gweld.

Bu newid mawr ers hynny, ac mae grwpiau buddiant amaethyddol a grwpiau lobio amgylcheddol wedi gwneud cynnydd sylweddol drwy gydweithio—rhaid inni i gyd gofio hynny. Sefydlwyd cynlluniau defnyddiol, fel y cynllun ardal amgylchedd arbennig, Tir Cymen a Tir Gofal, y cynllun cynefinoedd, y cynllun rhostir, cynlluniau organig a llu o fesurau trawsgydymffurfio sydd wedi gwthio'r diwydiant i gyfundrefn daliadau sydd â mwy o ogwydd amaeth-amgylcheddol. Mae'n bwysig peidio â cholli golwg ar hyn o bryd ar bwysigrwydd cynlluniau amaeth-amgylcheddol, a'r ffaith bod ffermio'n ymwneud â chynhyrchu bwyd. I will concentrate on the need to ensure that these schemes are properly evaluated, and to ensure that we broaden access. We often forget that expenditure on these schemes must be justified. My view that Tir Gofal is elitist—which Peter also raised—is well documented and we need to broaden access. Where Government expenditure is involved, we must give good reasons for why these schemes are essential. I therefore call for a greater review of the applicable sustainability indicators to show the benefits of organic farming and how environmental biodiversity, for example, has been increased by the expenditure. We have some way to go to develop an index of sustainable economic welfare that accounts for these factors to enable further funding that is not based solely on the recommendations of a few people. I have fully understood the economic value of environmental schemes to the industry for a long time and have sung the praises of many. However, I welcome most of your remarks on extending access to these schemes.

Tir Gofal—fine scheme though it is—has proved exclusive. There are about 22,000 businesses that can access agri-environment moneys, but perhaps, as you said, only 2,000 were eligible for Tir Gofal. I believe that that is the way to justify modulation to people. Modulation takes money from every business, so let us ensure that every business sees the benefits of that modulated money, which is, of course, match-funded. We should also use this evaluation to evaluate the marketing opportunities that these offer. Organic farming conversion payments are a classic example of money being used to convert to a style of farming without sufficient attention being paid to the need to market and process its products. Only by adding value and creating a niche market were people able to sustain an income from that farming method. There are many other similar schemes. As the Minister knows, I and 10 others are directly involved in the Pontbren environmental scheme to use environmental enhancements to sell our products, in particular our lamb. It is

important that we take note of that.

One way to ensure successful broadening of access is to reduce the bureaucratic burden in the application process as much as possible. I recommend that the Minister—with his fine words about broadening access—consider how the standard costs used to work, whereby an individual producer proposed his schemes, which were then assessed. The scheme was then undertaken and payment was made per unit, for example, per metre of pleached hedge or square metre of pond area and so on. That would help a lot. If we want to enhance biodiversity, safeguard our heritage, reduce pollution and keep farmers producing food, we must widen access. To do that, funding must be secured.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** The Minister reminded us of the proposal in 1996 to have one national scheme for Wales from all the agri-environmental schemes. I was pleased, as a Member of Parliament, to be a part of the discussions that led to the creation of that comprehensive scheme. A particularly interesting aspect of these schemes is that there is an understanding across the political spectrum, and among farmers and environmental organisations, that they now make an important contribution to the industry and the rural economy. During that period, I was pleased to be a member of the Select Committee on Agriculture between 1992 and 1997. I persuaded the Committee to come to Wales to see our innovative schemes, such as Tir Cymen, and to see whether many of their elements could be included in schemes throughout the countries of Britain. It is interesting that the innovative work carried out under those schemes is now accepted, not only in Wales, but throughout the United Kingdom.

One of our concerns about schemes such as Tir Gofal—as good as that scheme is—is that the Government, in Westminster in particular, must realise the importance of match funding to ensure that these schemes

Other Members have referred to a delay in the payments of several existing agri-environmental schemes and I must say to the Minister—although not in the terms used by other Members—that there is real concern in the industry about the long delay in the payments. I know of farmers who have a contract with the Welsh Assembly Government, previously the Welsh Office, under the old environmentally sensitive area scheme, who should be paid when an application is made. Some of them made their applications last August and they have still not been paid. Payments have been promised month after month, week after week, but nothing has happened.

Now we are told that these payments will be made by the end of February, but no-one is giving any clear guidance. Minister, we understand that there is currently no Government system to make these agri-environment payments to farmers. Will you answer that point? The Minister only gave a general reply that the Government is doing its best to try to make these payments. However, in reality not a single ESA payment has been made to a farmer in Wales since August 2002 and if that is true—and it has not been denied—then we need an answer as to why that is the case. This is not a matter of an open window period, it is a contractual obligation. If that contractual obligation is not met, the Government must answer for it.

can fully exploit European funding. One of its problems came to the fore at the outset when the Conservative Government, and the subsequent Labour Government, failed to invest sufficient money in the scheme to ensure wider access to the scheme for farmers. That was not the fault of the scheme, but of the Government, which was not willing to commit sufficient funds to ensure that the scheme would work. Mick Bates, Rhodri Glyn Thomas, and others have said that Tir Gofal is too restrictive at present in terms of the number of farmers who can apply to join it. I hope that, as we develop these schemes, the Government, particularly in Westminster, will realise the need for match funding to ensure that we make the best possible use of the schemes.

**Alun Pugh:** Tir Gofal and similar agri-environmental schemes must be a key part of the future of Welsh agriculture because many of us spend significant parts of our leisure and working lives in the great Welsh outdoors. We have plenty of examples of best practice in environmental management and the length of the application list is an indicator of its success. Anyone who regularly walks up the Watkin path on Snowdon cannot fail to notice the massive improvements in environmental management in that area.

However, I draw the Minister's attention to those tenant farmers who wish to join Tir Gofal but who are thwarted by landowners who block applications for financial reasons. It is unfair to tenants and the environment. I hope that the Minister will consider the regulations to see how we can prevent landlords from making unreasonable objections to Tir Gofal applications.

**Peter Rogers:** Are you aware that initially Tir Gofal did not even require any authorisation from the landowner to put in place Tir Gofal arrangements? You are talking absolute rubbish.

**Alun Pugh:** I know from tenant farmers in my constituency that they want to join Tir Gofal but are unable to do so at present.

I have been a great supporter of agri-environmental schemes since they started around 10 or 15 years ago. Originally we had environmentally sensitive area schemes, followed by Tir Cymen. Agri-environmental schemes have a tremendous potential, which Alun Pugh touched upon. They have the potential to reconnect the rural and urban parts of Wales, and to build a bridge between them. There is a great deal of dissension and people are critical of rural areas, which has worried me over the past few years. Agri-environmental schemes have a great potential to build a bridge between these two areas.

a parliamentary question was tabled by David Lidington, the shadow Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, asking Margaret Beckett how much modulation money had been spent. Her answer stated that the Government had only spent a little over half of the money. I wondered how much of that money was spent in Wales, therefore I tabled my written question. The relevant part of the answer stated that for the 2001 scheme, the total received through modulation was £724,000 and, for 2002, the receipts were £2.3 million. The anticipated amount for the current scheme was £4.5 million.

The Minister acknowledges that he has three years in which to spend this money. However, none of that money has been spent. Arrangements are in hand to spend £700,000 of the 2001 receipts in the current year to finance Tir Gofal. Agricultural incomes are at a historic low and there is a long list of people wanting to access the Tir Gofal scheme. The credibility of the Tir Gofal scheme is in doubt because people feel that they cannot access it. Even worse, the principle of modulation is also being discredited. I have a personal problem with this given that the Minister previously responsible for agriculture would not discuss modulation with the farming industry because it was unpopular. I decided that because modulation was the future I would go out and talk about this unpopular concept. The way in which the Minister has behaved in relation to recycling this money will cause outrage in the rural community and make modulation even more unacceptable. It seriously damages the credibility of Tir Gofal and the principle of modulation.

I welcome the announcement of funding for the maintenance payments; that is right. However, I am concerned that momentum has been lost in Wales. A few years ago, the general impression across Britain was that Wales was leading the way in terms of the organic sector. Maintenance payments were announced in England some months ago. The Assembly Minister was silent for months, and the whole momentum switched to England. Today, the Minister has announced the funding, probably because the Conservatives' amendment 3 dragged the information out of him. He was probably awaiting a public relations opportunity in which to make this announcement.

We will support the motion, because it is right. However, the Minister's ability to deliver on it is limited.

**Eleanor Burnham:** I welcome this motion as it provides an opportunity to measure the partnership Government's success in delivering the Assembly's commitment to sustainable development. Tir Gofal has been a landmark scheme, with over 700 projects agreed since it was established. Organic farming is particularly environmentally friendly, and the market demand for organic produce has not yet been met. Promoting the organic sector was one of our key strategies for rural Wales and Welsh agriculture. Not only has this helped the organic sector, it has also helped to establish the brand of quality now associated with Welsh foods worldwide.

I support the announcement of the organic stewardship scheme and, in particular, the new payment rates, which are significantly higher than those offered by DEFRA in England. The arable rate in Wales is £5 per hectare or 17 per cent higher; our enclosed land rate is £12 per hectare or 52 per cent higher; and our unenclosed land rate is £5 per hectare or 100 per cent higher. Put simply, under this partnership Government, Welsh farmers are getting a better deal than those in England. However, will the Minister's commit to ensuring that all payments due to

**The Deputy First Minister and Minister for Rural Development and Wales Abroad (Michael German):** I thank Members for the generally constructive nature of the debate. I will deal with the constructive points made. I will remind the Conservative Party of the damage that it has caused Welsh farmers. The fact that it turned down the agri-monetary compensation that was due to Britain will create more anguish over the next 10, 15, 20 or even 40 years. I will return to that point in a minute; we must give the Conservatives some of their own medicine. [ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Oh.]

I agree with Rhodri Glyn Thomas that not enough farmers can get into the scheme—

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. The red button is on; you cannot be heard. The Minister had five minutes in which to speak, but I will now allow him an extra minute because of all the unseemly interruptions.

**Michael German:** Thank you. I agree that not enough farmers are coming into the scheme. The target was for 25 per cent of agricultural land to be covered under Tir Gofal. We will achieve that during this year, ahead of time. However, the interest lies in the broad and shallow scheme, hence the problem raised by the Conservative Party. The accelerating number of Tir Gofal schemes coming into place at the moment is important. There have been 750 agreements in the last 12 months and probably—

**Michael German:** I will not take any interventions at the moment. [ASSEMBLY

**Michael German:** Ni dderbyniaf unrhyw ymyriadau ar hyn o bryd. [AELODAU'R

MEMBERS: ‘Oh.’] I have not reached the point when I will tell the Conservatives of the trouble that they have caused the people of Wales. There has been a huge acceleration in paying Tir Gofal payments. I expect to make a full announcement in Committee tomorrow of the current situation in terms of payments. However, Ieuan, ESA payments, along with organic payments, will restart in the next few weeks. The farm improvement grant payments, the farm enterprise grant payments and the woodland scheme payments have already started. The backlog of approximately £280,000—not millions of pounds, as some claim—will be cleared quickly. I understand the difficulties in terms of payments and we have previously discussed this. In terms of the organic scheme, the introduction of maintenance payments over an extended period will apply to those who received help for conversion and are now experiencing difficulties.

I agree with Mick Bates that monitoring and evaluation are important. Arrangements are in place, not only to monitor compliance, which we must carry out, but also to monitor the longer-term benefits. We cannot determine those benefits at the moment because it takes time for the scheme to get up and running. I recognise that standard costs may help in terms of simplifying schemes, but, because this is public money, we must take account of our inherent duty to ensure value for money. Therefore, we prefer competitive quotations.

Although Alun Pugh is not in the Chamber, in response to his question on tenant farmers, it is important to ensure that the landlord signs up so that there is a long-term commitment to the agreement. However, I am looking to include further flexibility in the arrangements, where possible, in order to assist tenant farmers.

I inform Ieuan that match funding for European money is not an issue in terms of Tir Gofal. We have put in enormous amounts of money, far more than would be required as match funding. I recognise the inherent difficulties in negotiating the UK position and the European position as part of the review of the common agricultural policy

CYNULLIAD: ‘O.’] Nid wyf wedi dod at y man lle y dywedaf wrth y Ceidwadwyr am y drafferth y maent wedi’i hachosi i bobl Cymru. Mae’r taliadau Tir Gofal yn cael eu talu’n gyflymach o lawer. Er nad yw Alun Pugh yn y Siambwr, mewn ymateb i’w gwestiwn am denantiaid ffermydd, mae’n bwysig sicrhau bod y landlord yn ymuno fel bod ymrwymiad tymor-hir i’r cytundeb. Serch hynny, yr wyf yn ystyried ffyrdd o wneud y trefniadau’n fwy hyblyg, lle y bo modd, er mwyn cynorthwyo tenantiaid ffermydd.

Hysbysaf Ieuan nad yw cyllid cyfatebol ar gyfer arian Ewropeaidd yn fater sy’n codi yng nghyd-destun Tir Gofal. because of the difficulties with pillar 2 funding caused by the Conservative Party. [Interruption.] Mrs Thatcher was responsible for it.

On pillar 2, the £4.5 million has not been collected. Glyn said that we should be spending that £4.5 million now, but it will not be collected until the end of this year. Last year's receipts and those of the previous year will be available to us this year. The Conservatives think that I am now responsible for foot and mouth disease. They have another thing coming. It does not say much about their competence either.

**Peter Rogers:** Will you give way?

**Michael German:** No. You have had your chance. [ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Oh.']}

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. The Minister is not giving way, so please sit down, Peter.

**Michael German:** The Conservatives cannot deny the difficulties that they have caused Welsh agriculture by turning money down. The cost to Welsh farmers will become more apparent if I cannot negotiate a stronger position. The UK Government supports our efforts to prioritise redressing the historic imbalance in pillar 2. The Conservatives may not like the truth when it hits them between the eyes.

The organic payments, which will restart in the next few weeks, are higher than those in England. Therefore, I reject any claims that we are not giving a better deal to organic farmers.

**Nick Bourne** rose—

**Michael German:** I will not give way. I remind the Conservatives that the Tir Gofal budget for the next three years is £55 million. Modulation for the next three years will amount to £7.5 million; that is in future, as is the match funding from the UK Government. I believe that the £55 million that the Assembly Government is contributing to Tir Gofal demonstrates our commitment to ensuring a good deal for Welsh farmers,
