SOME FACTS AND FIGURES TO ACCOMPANY THE ARTS COUNCIL OF WALES' ORAL PRESENTATION ON 1 FEBRUARY

Total Arts Lottery spend in the region to date is:

Mid & West Wales - £22,241,967 with a total of 982 awards/grants (this does not include South Gwynedd)

North Wales - £20,680,600 with a total of 606 awards/grants

South Wales - £35,327,739 with a total of 885 awards/grants

Therefore it very clear that ACW has assessed far more applications in the M&W region. Figures for Ceredigion and Powys are indicated below:

Ceredigion - £5,736,004 with 139 awards (£82.53p per head)

Powys - £7,186,239 with 275 awards (other than Cardiff this county has had the highest number of awards).

Star projects in the region include the following:

CARAD in Rhayader is a community arts organisation, which has just received a further A4A award (£35K 1 year) to continue their work in the area and Council recently announced £30K ACW revenue funding for this year. Their previous three year A4A award was £120K with a Capital grant of £200K to set up the two units in Rhayader.

Celfogwmpas – three year project that works with disabled people across Powys – they received \pounds 199,853 for their first 3 years of operation through A4A and have recently received a further \pounds 39,849 for their 4th year. In addition, they have been awarded £9,956 of ACW revenue funding towards their core costs.
