Suggested priorities identified	Timing
Rights of the Child	4 July 06
The European Commission adopted its Communication "Towards an EU Strategy on the Rights of the Child" on 4 July 2006. The Strategy contains proposals which are likely to be of interest to Committee Members.	Published
The Communication proposes to establish a comprehensive EU strategy "to effectively promote and safeguard the rights of the child in the EU's internal and external policies and to support Member States' efforts in this field."	
It is recognised that children's rights are far from being generally respected and that their basic needs are not being met. The EU therefore aims to add its weight to push children's rights to the forefront, to add value to the efforts of Member States and to strengthen recognition and respect for the principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The UN Convention was itself adopted by the National Assembly as the basis for policy making in January 2004.	
The Strategy is structured around seven specific objectives which include:	
Capitalising on existing activities (e.g. tackling human trafficking) and addressing urgent needs. The Commission will therefore undertake the following urgent measures:	
To attribute one single six digit telephone number (beginning with 116: 116 xyz) within the EU for child help-lines and one for child hotlines dedicated to missing and sexually exploited children (end 2006).	
To support the banking sector and credit card companies to combat the use of credit cards when purchasing sexual images of children on the Internet (2006).	

To promote 'a clustering of actions' on child poverty in the EU (2007). Identifying priorities for future EU action e.g. to collect comparable data on children's rights (2007) Mainstreaming children's rights in EU actions (2007). Establishing efficient coordination and consultation mechanisms e.g. increasing children's involvement in decision making and the setting up of a coordinator for the rights of the child (2006). Enhancing capacity and expertise on children's rights and communicating more effectively to publicise children's rights (2007 onwards). A progress report will be presented every year, and the Commission has stated its commitment to allocating the necessary human and financial resources to implement the Strategy. Green Paper on the role of civil society in EU Drugs Policy 26 June -30 Sept European Commission consultation, to explore how best organise a continuous dialogue with civil society organisations active in the drugs field to ensure their knowledge and expertise is taken account in the implementation of the EU Action Plan on Drugs 2005-2008. The Drugs Action Plan was one of the suggested priority items for SJR in 2005. **EU Alcohol Strategy** September Commission Communication consulting on the development of an EU alcohol policy - the aim is to reduce the health and social effects of alcohol consumption. An independent report on alcohol use in Europe, commissioned by the European Commission was published in June 2006 by the Institute of Alcohol Studies in London. This will inform the Commission's thinking as it prepares the Communication.

Proposal for a Directive on an internal market for postal services, confirming, if appropriate, the date of 2009 for the full accomplishment of the postal internal market or determining any other step towards it (i.e. the opening of remaining
