Victim Support also runs the Witness Service in the criminal courts in England and Wales. In the year 2002/03, 332,189 people were supported by the Crown Court and the Magistrates Courts Witness Service. Victim Support runs a telephone Support line for victims of crime offering information and referral to local services. Victims Support also works to increase awareness of the effects of crime and to achieve greater recognition of victim's and witnesses' rights.
