	Scoreboard –spring 2004 update	

In 2001, Member States committed themselves to continuing their efforts to reduce the general level of State aid expressed as a percentage of GDP by 2003, and to the need to redirect aid towards horizontal objectives of common interest, including cohesion objectives. Based on the latest available figures, this update states that the majority of Member States appear to be responding positively to the call for "less and better targeted State aid" which Heads of Government recognised is "a key part of effective competition."

In addition to measuring Member States progress towards these goals, this update of the Scoreboard includes a special focus on aid for employment and training.

The update states that disparities in the levels of aid between Member States still exist, but are diminishing as State aid, as a percentage of GDP, continues to fall in the vast majority of Member States.

In terms of State aid for regional and cohesion policy, the update stresses that State aid for regional development can only be granted if the balance between the resulting distortions of competition and the advantages of the aid in terms of the development of a less favoured region can be guaranteed.

COM(2004) 327 final - Green paper on public-private partnerships and Community law on public contracts and concessions This is a Green Paper and invites comments from interested parties, to reach the Commission by 30 July 2004.

The Green Paper deals with public-private partnerships in all sectors. It notes the benefits of PPPs in offering "micro-economic benefits permitting execution of a project that provides value for money and meets public interest objectives", but states that recourse to PPPs "cannot be presented as a miracle solution for a public sector facing budget constraints".

The Commission announced that it would publish a Green Paper on PPPs and Community law on public procurement and concessions, to launch a debate on the best way to ensure that PPPs can develop in a context of effective competition and legal clarity. The publication of the Green Paper is also one of the actions planned under the European Initiative for Growth. The Paper aims to show the extent to which Community rules apply to the phase of selection of the private partner and to the subsequent phase, with a view to identifying any uncertainties, and to analyse the extent to which the Community framework is suited to PPPs.

The opinion confirms that Croatia has met the Copenhagen Criteria for membership, and the stabilisation and association process conditions established by the Council in 1997. The Commission recommends that negotiations for accession to the European Union should be opened with Croatia.

27/04/04 COM (2004) 205 final – Council Decision on the principles, priorities and conditions contained in the European Partnership with Bosnia

and Herzegovina

The Thessaloniki European Council of 19 and 20 June 2003 reiterated its determination to fully and effectively support the European perspective of the Western Balkan countries and stated that "the Western Balkans countries will become an integral part of the EU, once they meet the established criteria". The Thessaloniki Agenda includes an Annex, which aims at intensifying relations between the European Union and the Western Balkans, building on practices used in the enlargement process, inter alia through the introduction of European Partnerships. The Commission has been invited to submit the first set of European Partnerships to the Council for approval with the next Annual Reports on the Stabilisation and Association Process, due end March 2004.

This paper outlines the principles, priorities and conditions for the European Partnership for Bosnia and Herzegovina.
