## **Cwestiynau i Brif Weinidog Cymru Questions to the First Minister**

### **Adroddiadau ar Weithgareddau Gweinyddiaeth y Cynulliad Reports on the Assembly Administration's Activities**

**Q1 William Graham:** Will the First Minister indicate his commitment to continuing to produce reports, like 'Delivering for Wales', on the activities of the Assembly's administration? (OAQ13640)

**The First Minister:** I believe that producing an annual report is an important part of the First Minister's accountability to the Assembly.

**William Graham:** I am grateful for the First Minister's commitment to openness and transparency. However, does he not agree that it would be better to follow the practice in Westminster and give up on these self-congratulatory reports? They have little bearing on the lives of people in Wales who are waiting for hospital treatment, who have lost their jobs or whose businesses suffered as a result of the foot and mouth disease outbreak.

**The First Minister:** Part of the process of accountability is to consider the difficult aspects of Government where success has not yet been achieved and to indicate where we think we are well on the way to achieving success. We will brag about aspects that are worth bragging about. Unemployment is at its lowest level for 26 years, so it is fair for us to say so. However, we will also draw attention to continuing difficulties. I do not think that this report is self-congratulatory.

**Arweinydd yr Wrthblaid (Ieuan Wyn Jones):** Yr oedd yn dda clywed eich datganiad clir o gefnogaeth i'r adeilad newydd ar y teledu neithiwr, Rhodri. A wnewch ailadrodd hynny yn y Siambr heddiw?

**C1 William Graham:** A wnaiff Prif Weinidog Cymru ddatgan ei ymrwymiad i barhau i gynhyrchu adroddiadau, megis 'Cyflawni dros Gymru', ar weithgareddau Gweinyddiaeth y Cynulliad hwn? (OAQ13640)

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Credaf fod cynhyrchu adroddiad blynnyddol yn rhan bwysig o atebolrwydd Prif Weinidog Cymru i'r Cynulliad.

**William Graham:** Yr wyf yn ddiolchgar am ymroddiad Prif Weinidog Cymru i fod yn agored. Fodd bynnag, onid yw'n cytuno y byddai'n well dilyn yr arfer yn San Steffan a rhoi'r gorau i'r adroddiadau hunanglodforus hyn? Prin yw eu perthnasedd i fywydau pobl yng Nghymru sy'n aros am driniaeth ysbyty, sydd wedi colli eu swyddi neu y mae eu busnesau wedi dioddef o ganlyniad i argyfwng clwy'r traed a'r genau.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Rhan o'r broses atebolrwydd yw ystyried agweddau anodd ar Lywodraeth lle na chafwyd llwyddiant hyd yn hyn a nodi lle y credwn ein bod ar ein ffordd tuag at lwyddo. Byddwn yn brolio am agweddau y mae'n werth brolio amdanynt. Mae diweithdra ar ei lefel isaf ers 26 mlynedd, felly mae'n deg ein bod yn dweud hynny. Fodd bynnag, byddwn hefyd yn tynnu sylw at anawsterau parhaus. Ni chredaf fod yr adroddiad hwn yn hunanglodforus.

**The Leader of the Opposition (Ieuan Wyn Jones):** It was good to hear your clear declaration of support for the new building on television last night, Rhodri. Will you reiterate that in the Chamber today?

O ddifrif, faint rhagor o ddogfennau, papurau a strategaethau y bwriadwch eu cyhoeddi cyn y gallwch ddweud wrthym nad diffyg papurau sydd i gyfrif am ein problemau ond diffyg pwerau'r Cynulliad? Ystyriwch yr holl ddogfennau a gyhoeddwyd gennych yn ystod y blynnyddoedd diwethaf: 'Gwellcymru.com', 'Rhoi Cymru'n Gyntaf: Partneriaeth ar gyfer Pobl Cymru' ac, yn awr, 'Cyflawni dros Gymru'. O gyfuno'r tair dogfen nid oes llawer o sylwedd iddynt. Onid ydyw'n amlwg bellach, faint bynnag o botsian a wnawn, na allwn gyflawni o fewn pwerau presennol y Cynulliad? A allwch roi eich llaw ar eich calon a dweud y gallwch, o fewn cyfyngiadau'r pwerau, gyflawni i bobl Cymru? Onid yw'n bryd i chi ddweud yn groyw fod ar bobl Cymru angen i'r Cynulliad gael ei droi yn senedd go iawn?

On a more serious note, how many more documents, papers and strategies do you intend to publish before you can tell us that our problems are not caused by a lack of papers, but by the Assembly's lack of powers? Consider all the documents that you have published during the last few years: 'Betterwales.com', 'Putting Wales First: A Partnership for the People of Wales' and, now, 'Delivering for Wales'. Were you to combine the three there would still be little of substance in them. Is it not evident by now that, however much we tinker, we cannot deliver within the Assembly's current powers? Can you state with your hand on your heart that you can deliver for the people of Wales within the limitations of the powers? Is it not time for you to state categorically that the people of Wales need the Assembly to be turned into a proper parliament?

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Mae Plaid Cymru yn mynegi'r obsesiwn hwn wythnos ar ôl wythnos nad yw'r Cynulliad yn gallu gwneud hyn-a-hyn, ac mai'r senedd yr oedd arni ei heisiau yn wreiddiol, a gwlad annibynnol, yw'r unig ateb i broblemau Cymru. Obsesiwn yw hynny, sy'n mynd yn groes i'r ffeithiau. Ystyriwch, Ieuan—a grŵp cyfan Plaid Cymru, oherwydd eu bod bron i gyd yn rhannu'r obsesiwn hwn—inni allu cyhoeddi ddoe bod £45 miliwn ar gael i ehangu cwmnïau bach a chanolig eu maint yng Nghymru o dan nawdd Cyllid Cymru, gyda bron hanner yr arian yn dod o Ewrop ac ychydig dros hanner yn dod o Fanc Barclays. Cyflawnwyd hynny dros bobl, busnesau ac economi Cymru. Nid wyf yn derbyn honiad Plaid Cymru, na bod dystiolaeth i gefnogi hynny.

**The First Minister:** Week in week out Plaid Cymru returns to its obsession that the Assembly is impotent in one way or another, and that the parliament that it originally wanted, and an independent country, is the only answer to Wales's problems. That is an obsession that flies in the face of the facts. Consider, Ieuan—and the whole Plaid Cymru group, because they almost all share this obsession—that we were able to announce yesterday that £45 million is available to expand small and medium-sized companies in Wales under the aegis of Finance Wales, with almost half the money coming from Europe and a little over half coming from Barclays Bank. We delivered that for the people, businesses and economy of Wales. I do not accept Plaid Cymru's assertion, nor that there is any evidence to support it.

**The First Minister:** Health is a key aspect of economic development. We are conscious of the risk of increased stress in rural areas, such as those in north Wales, as a result of the foot and mouth disease outbreak. In addition to

the CALL mental health helpline that now covers the whole of Wales, we have established and funded a freephone rural stress helpline. We included measures in the rural recovery plan to help alleviate stress, including employing additional specialist community workers, the rural hardship fund and additional funding for community-based projects to combat stress.

**Peter Rogers:** You are aware of the problems concerning independent care homes raised at the last meeting of the North Wales Regional Committee meeting. If what you said is true, there is nothing in your answer that could avert a possible crisis in those homes. You failed to secure a fee structure which keeps pace with the costs that you are asking these homes to meet. Will you act now? If you do not, homes will close and many jobs will be lost, particularly in those rural areas. We will be left with a shortfall in capacity, forcing people who have spent their lives in areas of my constituency, such as Anglesey, to move to other areas on the mainland.

**Peter Rogers:** Yr ydych yn ymwybodol o'r problemau sy'n ymwneud â chartrefi gofal annibynnol a godwyd yng nghyfarfod diwethaf cyfarfod Pwyllgor Rhanbarth y Gogledd. Os yw yr hyn a ddywedoch yn wir, nid oes dim yn eich ateb a allai osgoi argyfwng possibl yn y cartrefi hynny. **The First Minister:** Mario Kreft made a thoughtful contribution representing the North Wales Nursing and Residential Homes Association at the meeting last Friday in the village hall at Llanraeadr-ym-Mochnant, which was chaired by Eleanor Burnham. Since then there have been major developments in this field: Jane Hutt announced yesterday that £100 a week will be available for nursing care services in Wales. That is probably more generous than what is available in England; I am not sure about the situation in Scotland. That announcement is generous and it may satisfy many of the complaints made in Mario Kreft's thoughtful contribution. However, I intend to write to Mario, because I respect him and I respect his association.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Gwnaeth Mario Kreft gyfraniad ystyriol yn cynrychioli Cymdeithas Cartrefi Nyrssio a Chartrefi Preswyl Gogledd Cymru yn y cyfarfod ddydd Gwener diwethaf yn neuadd bentref Llanraeadr-ym-Mochnant, a gadeiriwyd gan Eleanor Burnham. **Alun Pugh:** Objective 1 is an important part of economic development in north Wales. In that context, will you comment on the front-page story in *The Western Mail* today, which

**The First Minister:** I understand that the story is based on a mistake. The only fact that I could discern in that article was that Cornwall had allocated 32 per cent of its Objective 1 money—the actual figure, I think, is 18 per cent. No other facts were adduced in that article. Any front-page story where you cannot see any correct facts at all—the only fact is completely wrong in indicating that Cornwall had allocated a higher proportion of its funds, when in fact it has allocated a lower proportion of its funds—is curious. The Finance Wales announcement of £45 million, which is real, hard news of interest to every small and medium-sized business in Wales, is relegated to about page 14. I am baffled by the relative news values whereby a non-story is put on page 1, and a real story on page 14.

**C3 Gareth Jones:** A wnaiff Prif Weinidog Cymru ddatganiad ar gynnydd tuag at wireddu'r ymrwymiadau yn y ddogfen bartneriaeth? (OAQ13634)

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Mae 'Cyflawni dros Gymru' yn nodi'r hyn a gyflawnwyd ers y gwanwyn. Mae'r Llywodraeth bartneriaeth naill ai wedi cyflawni, neu wedi gwneud cynnydd sylweddol tuag at wireddu'r rhan fwyaf o'i hymrwymiadau. Dim ond dau ymrwymiad sydd wedi cael eu hailystyried. Bydd y rhaglen wedi'i chwblhau erbyn diwedd y tymor Cynulliad hwn.

**Gareth Jones:** Ochr yn ochr â'r cynnydd hwnnw, ceir methiannau amlwg a thrawiadol sydd yn tanseilio delwedd y Cynulliad ac yn dwyn anfri arno: methu â chyflawni Amcan 1; methu ag adeiladu estyniad i'r Cynulliad; methu â hyrwyddo Cymru fel gwlad ddwyieithog; methu â sefydlu is-adeileddau band llydan a chludiant; methu ag atal y twf brawychus mewn rhestrau aros i gleifion.

**Q3 Gareth Jones:** Will the First Minister make a statement on progress in delivering the commitments made in the partnership document? (OAQ13634)

**The First Minister:** 'Delivering for Wales' notes what has been achieved since the spring. The partnership Government has delivered, or has made significant progress towards realising most of its commitments. Only two of its commitments have been reconsidered. The programme will be completed by the end of this Assembly term.

**Gareth Jones:** Alongside that progress are obvious and striking failures, which undermine the Assembly's image and bring it into disrepute: the failure to deliver Objective 1; the failure to build an extension to the Assembly; the failure to promote Wales as a bilingual country; the failure to build broadband and transport infrastructure; and the failure to prevent the horrifying rise in

Bum munud yn ddiweddarach mae Gareth Jones yn profi hynny. Mae Plaid Cymru yn codi'r un hen gwestiwn dro ar ôl tro sef, na all y Cynulliad wneud dim os nad yw'n senedd ac nad oes pwynt i grŵp Plaid Cymru wastraffu ei amser yma am nad oes gan y Cynulliad ddigon o bwerau. **Mick Bates:** As you know we must champion renewable energy in Wales. I am sure that you saw the display on renewable energy in the milling area today, and tonight you are our guest at the cross-party National Assembly sustainable energy group. In view of your responsibility for the co-ordination of cross-cutting themes, will you undertake to actively encourage the development of renewable energy in Wales such as the biomass strategy in the partnership document?

**The First Minister:** I strongly support the proposition that we should promote renewable energy. I work closely on this issue with Sue Essex, as Minister for Environment, because there are occasionally environmental objections to specific applications for windfarms or other forms of energy production. However, we strongly believe that by 2010 at least 10 per cent of energy production in Wales will be achieved by renewable means, as part of the UK commitment. Overall energy policy is not devolved to the Assembly. Nevertheless, we can contribute in a big way. Given the special

patient waiting lists. The list is endless. First Minister, when will you realise that the Assembly is unlikely to succeed until we have more legislative powers and that you, meanwhile, must transfer some of your duties and functions to other Ministers so that you can concentrate fully on delivering solutions to meet the needs of Wales?

**The First Minister:** Gareth, that proves the point within five minutes. I said earlier that not only Ieuan Wyn Jones, but also the Plaid Cymru group as a whole, has an obsession. Five minutes later Gareth Jones proves my point. Plaid Cymru asks the same old question time after time, namely that the Assembly cannot do anything unless it is a parliament and that there is no point for the Plaid Cymru group to waste its time here because the Assembly's powers are insufficient. And everytime I repeat the facts about what the partnership Government has delivered as regards the commitments made in the partnership agreement; only two have been reconsidered. All those commitments will have been realised long before we fight the election.

**Mick Bates:** Fel y gwyddoch rhaid inni gyflwyno'r ddadl dros ynni adnewyddadwy yng Nghymru. **Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Cefnogaf yn gryf y cynnig y dylem hyrwyddo ynni adnewyddadwy. Gweithiaf yn agos ar y mater hwn gyda Sue Essex, fel Gweinidog yr Amgylchedd, gan fod gwrthwynebiadau amgylcheddol weithiau i geisiadau penodol ar gyfer ffermydd gwynt neu ddulliau eraill o gynhyrchu ynni. Fodd bynnag, credwn yn gryf erbyn 2010 y cynhyrchrir o leiaf 10 y cant o ynni Cymru drwy ffyrdd adnewyddadwy, fel rhan o ymroddiad y DU. advantages and virtues of Wales regarding many aspects of renewable production, we expect to play a full part, and possibly exceed that 10 per cent target. As regards windfarms, it is amazing how some people say that Scotland is much more sympathetic to windfarms; 41 per cent of windfarms are in Wales as compared to 18 per cent in Scotland. I do not know where they get their facts.

**The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne):** The partnership document includes a commitment to high-quality healthcare. Since that commitment was made, the outpatient waiting list is 850 per cent higher than it was when you came into power. In-patient waiting lists have increased every month for the past six months. Over 40,000 orthopaedic patients are waiting to see a consultant, and consultants say that far too much time is spent on administration. How does that fit in with the commitment to high-quality healthcare outlined in the partnership agreement?

**The First Minister:** We are simultaneously improving the quality of healthcare and changing the health structure, by switching to a primary-led care service and moving away from using waiting lists, as a means of measuring success, to waiting times. We are also measuring output to ascertain how many patients are seen and treated in the system. That figure continues to rise. However, there has also been an inexorable rise, even greater than that figure, in the number of patients that come through our hospital doors, particularly in the first half of the week. A flood of patients comes in at a greater rate than before. Even though hospitals treat more patients, the number being admitted for treatment rises at an even faster rate. We have not yet cracked that problem.

**Nick Bourne:** You mentioned two particular aspects. First, the deeply unpopular structural changes in the medical sector proposed by the Minister for Health and Social Services. What was to be a debate on the issue, has mysteriously been altered to be a statement. Secondly, you mentioned the introduction of waiting times instead of waiting lists.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Yr ydym ar yr un pryd yn gwella ansawdd gofal iechyd ac yn newid y strwythur iechyd, drwy newid i wasanaeth sydd wedi ei arwain yn bennaf gan ofal ac yn symud o ddefnyddio rhestrau aros i ddefnyddio amserau aros, fel ffordd o fesur llwyddiant. Yr ydym hefyd yn mesur allawn i bennu faint o gleifion a welir ac a drinir yn y system. Mae'r ffigur hwnnw yn dal i godi. I believe that this is a part of political accountability for it. Removing the health authorities is overwhelmingly popular throughout Wales, apart from among members of the authorities who have a vested interest. They would naturally say that it is better to keep the health authorities. I would not expect them to say anything else. You cannot show that there is significant opposition to the institutional changes, except from the vested interests.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Ni chredaf y dylai fod gennych obsesiwn â straeon newyddion. **C4 Jocelyn Davies:** Sut y mae Prif Weinidog Cymru yn bwriadu codi mwy o ymwybyddiaeth ymhliith y cyhoedd o waith Cabinet y Cynulliad? (OAQ13642)

**The First Minister:** If we do not publicise it,

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Os nad ydym yn rhoi

you criticise me for failing to do so; if we publicise it then Nick Bourne will criticise me for issuing propaganda. Whatever I do I cannot really get it right. We publish 'Delivering for Wales' annually, and the corporate plan, 'Plan for Wales 2001' was published on 25 October. We will publish another plan for Wales after the election. That is how we publicise what the Cabinet has done. I believe it is reasonable for the Cabinet to set out what it believes it has achieved and stand by that. We then review what we have achieved every 12 months through a new annual report. That is standard accountability and should not be confused with political propaganda.

**Jocelyn Davies:** Is the First Minister aware of his Cabinet's activities? We know from his responses in the Chamber that he has no interest in the Welsh media. He tells us that he has much better things to do. However, from having watched television last night, I learn that he supports the new building because of comments in the London press last week about our current accommodation. Will the First Minister tell us whose opinion he values most, that of his Cabinet or London journalists?

**The First Minister:** I did not say that last night. I said that the London media had helped to make the case for the new building. I thought that it was pertinent to say so. The press thought that it was saying something slick and smart and anti-Welsh, and indicating its superiority over all provincial beings that live outside the M25 belt. It actually demonstrated that this Assembly was right to regard this home—although it has served us well—as a temporary Chamber. Although it had not intended to be helpful, I thought that it had been in indicating why this is a temporary Chamber. We have always regarded it thus and the sooner that it is replaced by a fitting home for the new Welsh democracy the better.

**The First Minister:** I agree that we must get on with the job. The more we achieve, the more people will take an interest in how we debate matters and come to our decisions. It is far better than the previous system. Wales has been able to grow up as a nation, and we have a level of responsibility for the domestic agenda that has been devolved to us.

**Jonathan Morgan:** In light of the public relations disaster over the rejection of the health service reforms, are you concerned that public awareness will quickly turn into public dissatisfaction?

**The First Minister:** That is a *parti pris* opposition comment, based on the views of vested interests who will lose the quango state special positions that they have held since health authorities were set up. Simplifying the bureaucratic health service hierarchy, by devolving matters to the local health group level to simplify commissioning on the basis of subsidiarity will cause a squeal from here and there. Anyone who loses his or her position as an apparatchik, or any other special position, will say, 'I do not think this is a good idea: I am going to lose my position.' Jonathan, I would not have expected you to fall for such a simple three card trick as the health authorities' special pleading.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** One piece of good news is that the European Commission's standing veterinary committee is considering partially lifting the ban on exporting lambs from Wales. Do you welcome that news, and will you tell us what role the Cabinet will play in persuading the commission—if the recommendation goes through today—that the ban should be lifted as soon as possible? Do you recognise the damage done to Welsh

**The First Minister:** The issue of livestock markets is more complicated than that of the lifting of the export ban. That has been on the stocks for a while; the standing veterinary committee has been in favour of that for some weeks. It is simply a matter of getting it through commission procedures, and the sooner that that happens, the better. I do not think that anyone here would quarrel with that, as three months—less one week—have passed since the last outbreak. That does not, of course, mean that we should not continue to be vigilant, but there is a strong case for permitting the re-commencement of exports, and I think that we would all agree with that.

On the matter of the livestock marts, we must be aware that we are in a difficult and dangerous season; the weather has become colder and damper. If there were an outbreak of foot and mouth disease, it would be difficult to control it again because of the lack of direct sunlight during the autumn and winter months.

**The First Minister:** I was pleased to address around 70 delegates from across Europe when they visited Cardiff for the British Council conference in early October. The conference was organised under the umbrella of the European year of languages. Jane Davidson, Jenny Randerson, and I spoke during the conference.

**Christine Chapman:** Do you welcome the fact that the UK ratified the Charter for Regional or Minority languages on 28 March, and that it came into effect on 1 July?

**The First Minister:** Yes. This confers a duty on the UK Government, as the signatory. It must make its first report to the Council of Europe—as this is a Council of Europe, and not a European Union issue—on its implementation of the Charter. Fifty-two paragraphs from part 3 of the charter will apply to the Welsh language, which is above the minimum 35 paragraphs required to meet the terms of the charter. That reflects the measures already in place to support the Welsh language.

**Alun Cairns:** I am sure that all parties will support you in seeking to promote the option of gaining a Welsh-medium education. In providing people with that choice, do you believe that the people on the east side of Swansea should have the choice of sending their children to a Welsh-medium secondary school with first rate facilities, rather than having to send them to Penlan Comprehensive School?

**The First Minister:** I am not sure that your facts are correct, but, in any case, that is not a matter for me, but for Swansea City and County Council.

**The First Minister:** I can report on progress in launching Finance Wales yesterday with £45 million now available to be invested in

Furthermore, we understand that we are ahead of the other three Objective 1 areas in the UK in terms of the proportion of funds that have been committed out of the entire programme. Finance Wales will assist the small and medium-sized enterprise sector in Wales to create 10,000 jobs over the next five years.

On ministerial appointments, I have nothing to add to previous answers.

**Jonathan Morgan:** Thank you for that answer to a question that I did not ask, but I am grateful to you for outlining your ministerial engagements. However, even you must realise that attempting to undertake two busy workloads as First Minister and Minister for Economic Development is demanding. You must surely realise that your only course now is to appoint a Minister for Economic Development. In July, you indicated that you would fill the post as a temporary measure. We are now in the fourth week of the new term; will you make the necessary arrangements for somebody to be appointed to the Cabinet to undertake those duties?

**The First Minister:** I said that I had nothing to add to my previous answers because I have already said that the situation is temporary and not ideal. What is your problem, Jonathan? Why will you not welcome good news for the Welsh business sector?

Also, they may have to pay £5,000, or even £10,000 for business plans in order to gain access to these funding schemes. Is not this the kind of bureaucracy that a Minister for Economic Development should deal with? Will he appoint a Minister to do that?

That unit is responsible, among other things, for assisting businesses that are eager to get hold of Objective 1 funding, but are frustrated by bureaucracy because they do not understand how the public sector works. One of the main reasons for establishing the new unit was to find a way around the rules without breaking them. I believe that everyone welcomes that and I am pleased that the advertisement has appeared in the newspapers. We hope to make the relevant appointments soon.

### Denu Digwyddiadau megis Cwpan Ryder i Gymru Attracting Events such as the Ryder Cup to Wales

**Q7 Alison Halford:** What lessons can the Assembly learn from the recent successful Ryder Cup bid in order to continue to attract valuable events like this to the rest of Wales in the future? (OAQ13630)

**The First Minister:** The Assembly learnt significant lessons not only from the successful Ryder Cup bid for 2010, but also from staging other prestigious sporting events such as the Rugby World Cup—when the Assembly had just been established—and the FA Cup Final. The final round of the Network Q Rally, the world rallying championship, will be held in Cardiff and the forests of north Glamorgan, Gwent and mid Wales at the end of November. There are three drivers in contention for the championship and it will draw hundreds of thousands of people to those forests and Cardiff. There are lessons to be learnt: the primary one being how to form the necessary private-public partnerships to get such events off the ground. They are not matters for the private sector or public sector alone. The main lesson to be learnt is how those sectors can work together.

**Alison Halford:** I congratulate you, Rhodri, on the stunning success of getting the Ryder Cup to Wales. However, will you ensure that north Wales golf courses also benefit from the subsequent bonanza, particularly as David Llewellyn, who was the head professional of the course that I played in Delyn, will now take up the prestigious job of chief coach to the Welsh team?

**The First Minister:** In the golf world, this success is not regarded as the preserve of the Celtic Manor alone and that was understood in the bid. Wales does not have many championship courses. There is one at Harlech, where there is a championship links course, another at the Royal Porthcawl Golf Club and, I believe, a third at the Ashburnham Golf Club in west Wales. Celtic Manor has a non-links course but it is undoubtedly of championship quality. The golf events that were part of the package will be distributed among Harlech, Porthcawl, Ashburnham and one or two other courses. That will continue over the next nine years and probably beyond that time. Harlech benefited this year from hosting one of the sponsored seniors championships. Similarly, Porthcawl hosted the International European Ladies Championship.

**David Davies:** What is being done to bring such events into areas such as Monmouth, which has seen many job losses recently? Do you ever see headlines such as these from the local papers—‘More jobs gloom in Monmouth’, ‘Thousands lost in Rank Xerox’, ‘Specialist jobs lost in Nimbus as it goes into receivership, more on the way’? Is it not time—

**Owen John Thomas:** Trafododd y Cynulliad y mater hwn, a chytuno arno dros 18 mis yn ôl, ar ôl Dydd Gŵyl Dewi y llynedd. Codais y cwestiwn eto chwe mis yn ôl ar 8 Mai. Dywedoch fod y mater yn mynd trwy beirianwaith San Steffan ar y pryd. Dywedoch hefyd eich bod yn disgwyl clywed gan Ysgrifennydd Gwladol Cymru cyn bo hir. **Q8 Owen John Thomas:** What recent discussions have you had with Ministers in Westminster with regard to making St David's Day a public holiday in Wales? (OAQ13636)

**The First Minister:** I continue to discuss this matter with the Secretary of State for Wales.

**Owen John Thomas:** This matter was discussed and agreed upon by the Assembly over 18 months ago, after St David's Day last year. I raised the question again six months ago on 8 May. You said that the matter was going through the Westminster machine at the time. You also said that you were expecting an imminent response from the Secretary of State for Wales. Is it not high time for you to admit that you, as leader of the National Assembly, have failed to persuade the Westminster Government to listen to our voice?

**The First Minister:** This matter is much more complex than Owen John Thomas's comments would suggest. In Scotland, St Andrew's Day is not a bank holiday, although it is celebrated as such in the highlands of Scotland. In Northern Ireland, St Patrick's Day is considered legally to be a bank holiday, but it is not celebrated in the unionist areas. In England, there is no interest in celebrating St George's Day as a bank holiday. This desire to celebrate our patron

**The First Minister:** No, Glyn, it is not like that. Your party took a different view from the other three parties, in that it said the day should be swapped for another bank holiday rather than be additional. You should remember that. Our record on getting proposals on non-devolved matters—bank holidays being one of them—into the Westminster machine is far better than your party's record. How many Bills have we been able to get into the Westminster machine over the past two years? There have been two in 12 months. When your party was in power, there were two Bills in 18 years. Ours is a pretty good record. If the measure of leadership is how often can you get Welsh Bills into the Westminster machine, I would be happy to stand by my record. Compare it with the performance of your party between 1979 and 1997—two Bills in 18 years compared with two Bills in 12 months.

the National Assembly to other Welsh bodies and Assembly sponsored public bodies? (OAQ13645)

**The First Minister:** ‘Plan for Wales 2001’, which I launched on 25 October, sets out the policies the Cabinet will pursue directly and through its agents—if you want to call the ASPBs, or quangos, our agents—for the remainder of this Assembly term. Through the remit letters issued to the ASPBs we ensure that they translate our policies into action on the ground. That includes cross-cutting policies. It also includes the enduring values of equality of opportunity and sustainable development. Those are the flagship underlying values that we mainstream in everything that we do.

**Peter Black:** In addition to the quinquennial review of ASPBs, will you consider carrying out a more fundamental review of ASPBs or quangos in Wales to see whether it would be possible to abolish more of them and replace them with more directly accountable services?

**The First Minister:** Yes, but we must accept that, every time we do that, there will be squealing from ASPBs and that opposition parties will interpret the squealing and pleading of the quangos that are being abolished as some measure of universal public opinion in Wales and as an uprising against the Government’s oppressive policies. If you make a change, there are inevitably winners and losers. The losers will squeal, and opposition parties will take advantage of that and present it as evidence of public opposition, when it is nothing of the kind.

**David Melding:** I note wryly that your proposed reforms will double, rather than cut, the number of health quangos. Some of the people whom you accuse of squealing would, if they were self-interested, be celebrating in the streets because they are about to be appointed clinical directors or directors of

**The First Minister:** I suppose it would be naïve of me to hope that you might compliment the Assembly administration on following the rules of open competition in appointing special advisers, and for being unique, I think, in the United Kingdom in that respect. We are the only part of the United Kingdom that appoints its special advisers through open competition.

**Peter Black:** Will the Minister make a statement on the announcement by the Children's Society that it is to withdraw funding for projects in Wales? (EAQ14023)

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** Thank you for raising this serious issue. I was concerned to hear this morning's news. The Children's Society had not previously given me any indication of its financial position. I will meet urgently with representatives of the society from England and Wales to discuss the position. I will be happy to report to the Assembly after my meeting with the society, and will make a statement at the earliest opportunity.

**Peter Black:** Do you agree that it is essential that the projects funded by the Children's Society in Wales are maintained, particularly given our commitment to protect children? Will you do everything in your power to

**Jane Hutt:** I believe that up to 14 projects are directly funded and supported by the Children's Society, with some projects undertaken in partnership with local government and the church. I have already had discussions with the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities, Edwina Hart. I am consulting my officials about the impact of this decision and, as I said, I will meet the Children's Society and do my utmost to ensure that these important services, which safeguard children in Wales, are not adversely affected.

**Helen Mary Jones:** Will you ensure that, in the short term, the jobs of the staff are protected? They have valuable skills, particularly in matters of advocacy. It would be a tragedy if those were lost to Wales. I know of individuals who are already seeking work over the border. In the light of the Waterhouse report, we need to keep those skills here. Could you give us a timescale for when we are likely to have details of any additional funding that you may be able to make available?

**Jane Hutt:** It is important that I meet the Children's Society. There is a strong view that it should be persuaded to change its mind on the situation in Wales. Its work in relation to advocacy is important. Some of our most vulnerable children are looked-after children. The society also does much important street work as well as work with our most socially disadvantaged children. I will look at that and consider, with the Minister for Finance, what the issues are, but we need to start by making the society change its mind.

**Ann Jones:** I welcome your swift response to this morning's shattering news. When you meet the Children's Society, I ask you to impress upon it that it must talk to us. The way in which it has responded to its problems

**David Melding:** Do you agree that the Archbishop of Wales was right to resign from the Children's Society in response to this abrupt decision? Is it not essential that the Assembly sends out a message to all UK wide organisations that to simply cut off Welsh operations is unacceptable?

**Jane Hutt:** The Archbishop of Wales made a courageous and important statement by resigning from the Children's Society. It clearly shows his commitment as leader of the Church in Wales to the Children's Society and to the children of Wales. We must ensure that that message is expressed to the Children's Society. It has carried out great work in Wales and we must acknowledge that. Those who work for the Children's Society work at the sharp end, providing services to some of our most disadvantaged communities. The strong voice of the Welsh people has come through today on that issue.

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** I announced to the Health and Social Services Committee on 14 September 2000 that a comprehensive strategy for older people would be developed. I would like to take the opportunity today to make a short statement on the progress that has been made.

**Jane Hutt:** Gwnaeth Archesgob Cymru safiad dewr a phwysig drwy ymddiswyddo o Gymdeithas y Plant. Dengys yn glir ei ymrwymiad fel arweinydd yr Eglwys yng Nghymru i Gymdeithas y Plant ac i blant Cymru. Rhaid inni sicrhau y caiff y neges honno ei mynegi i Gymdeithas y Plant. Mae wedi cyflawni gwaith ardderchog yng Nghymru a rhaid inni gydnabod hynny. The strategy programme is being undertaken by a steering group, chaired by Brian Gibbons AM, as Deputy Minister for Health and Social Services. There is broad representation of older people's organisations on the strategy steering group, including members of Wales Pensioners, the National Old Age Pensioners Association of Wales and the Alzheimer's Society, along with lay pensioner representation. A quarter of members of the steering group are older people.

The strategy is about much more than health and social care issues. It will cover all aspects of Assembly responsibilities as they impact on the lives of elderly people. The development of this strategy is an important Assembly initiative. It will provide a structured basis for the Assembly and other public bodies in Wales to develop future policies and plans, which better reflect the needs of older people, and recognise the changing demography and social circumstances. Through the strategy, we will provide a framework to help to ensure that we are proactive in Wales in planning for an ageing population and that our policies meet the needs of older people. It will be important that the strategy takes account of the wide variation in how people experience and respond to ageing and their changing needs.

We are all aware that the numbers of older people are significantly greater than at any time in our history. One of the main challenges that faces us this century, however, is to respond to the needs of an ageing population and to harness the contributions that older people make to society. Older people expect much more from life and the services they use. They want a bigger say in decisions which affect them and they want opportunities to contribute to their communities. Retirement should not mean retirement from life.

To meet this challenge, we must plan for all our futures, not just for the current generation of older people. We need new strategies for

A key aspect of the strategy is that it will be evidence-based, utilising the research available on the lives of older people. We also want the strategy to be based on the realities of life for older people. We have, therefore, undertaken extensive consultation on the strategy to ensure that we hear as wide a range of views as possible. This has included 27 focus groups with older people; meetings with pensioner organisations; written consultation—and we have received over 200 responses on this—an all-Wales conference; and holding sessions over the last two weeks at each of the Assembly Regional Committees. In all, over 1,000 people have participated in this consultation process.

The strategy is a vital opportunity to ensure that the Assembly is proactive in planning for changes in the age structure of our population and in addressing more directly the needs and aspirations of older people in Wales.

We are planning for the draft strategy to be completed by March 2002, so that it can be considered by the Health and Social Services Committee in spring 2002, and published on completion of consultation by the summer. I am sure that other Subject Committees will wish to take the opportunity to discuss the strategy once the draft has been published. It is, of course, essential that the strategy leads firmly to action and an implementation plan will be developed to ensure that that happens.

I have already mentioned that the strategy is wide ranging. However, during the consultation process, one issue that has come to the fore time and again is the importance

of health and social services and the availability of good quality care, whether in the short or the long term. I was therefore pleased to announce details yesterday of the removal of a major anomaly in the funding of long-term care through the implementation of NHS-funded nursing care for self-funding residents in nursing homes. The introduction of this new policy, with effect from 3 December, will mean that the NHS will be responsible for the provision of nursing care by a registered nurse in all settings, and will bring a substantial benefit to those paying for their own care. Around 2,400 self-funders in Wales will benefit.

We have consulted widely on this new arrangement. The outcome of that process is a good deal for nursing home residents in Wales. The standardised model that we are adopting for free nursing care is unique to Wales. The consultation clearly showed strong support for this model rather than the banding system introduced in England. Funding will therefore be set at £100 a week per individual self-funder who is assessed as needing nursing care. This is a fair, reasonable and affordable contribution from the NHS towards care costs, and means that, on average, a self-funder will receive more than his or her counterpart in England.

It is important that support is given to implementing this policy. In recognition of that, an additional £1 million is being allocated to support the start-up of these arrangements, including the development of local systems and arrangements, completion of assessments, training for nurses, and other requirements. We have developed a framework that is tailored distinctly to circumstances and requirements in Wales, and which gives a better deal for self-funders in Wales. I thank the wide range of organisations, professionals and individuals who have helped us to develop this new care funding policy for Wales.

**David Lloyd:** I thank Jane for her statement. I declare an interest as a GP and a member of the City and County of Swansea. I welcome the emphasis on the interests of the elderly.

Datganaf fuddiant oherwydd fy nghysylltiad â'r mudiadau hynny. Maent i gyd, fel y clywsom yn y Pwyllgorau Rhanbarthol, yn pryderu ynglŷn â'r angen am ariannu cyson a thymor hir, fel y gallant drefnu eu gwasanaethau yn hytrach na threulio'u holl amser yn cynnig am y pot nesaf o arian. Pa ystyriaeth a roddwch i'r themâu hyn sydd yn deillio o'r trafodaethau ar y strategaeth a fydd yn gweld golau dydd y flwyddyn nesaf?

**Jane Hutt:** Those are all important themes. The need to focus on all the issues and

Jane, like everyone else, will be aware of the main themes of the consultation on the older people's strategy. The main concerns are pensions and poverty. People are still asking for free personal care following the Royal Commission's recommendations. We note the comments made yesterday and today regarding free nursing care, but there is increasing demand for free personal care following the Royal Commission's recommendations.

During this consultation, people have also expressed concern about the crisis in the health service. We cannot avoid that. Older people are naturally concerned about the standard of service in the NHS. Also, as has already been mentioned, there is a crisis in nursing and residential homes. There is a financial crisis, as Jane knows, and also a crisis emanating from the concerns about the new regulations of the Care Standards Act 2000. As well as this, and it was reflected in the consultation, the discussion regarding the crisis in nursing homes should be used to underline the need to care for people in their own homes. We should consider improving the provision of care for people in their own homes and communities, rather than sticking to the strict doctrine of provision in residential and nursing homes. We are missing an opportunity if we ignore that.

Finally, we need to acknowledge the considerable contribution of the voluntary sector in caring for the elderly—organisations such as Crossroads Wales, the Alzheimer's Society and Age Concern. I declare an interest because of my links with those organisations. They are all, as we heard in the Regional Committees, concerned about the provision of constant and long-term funding, so that they can organise their services rather than forever spending their time bidding for the next pot of money. What consideration will you give to these themes that have come to the fore during discussions on the strategy, which will see the light of day next year?

**Jane Hutt:** Mae pob un o'r rheini yn themâu pwysig. Mae'r angen i ganolbwyntio ar bob

interests of older people has come over strongly in these discussions. There is a large number of people of pensionable age in Wales. We must recognise that there are over 500,000 such people. In terms of nursing care, I announced yesterday a generous provision in terms of how we define nursing care, which will make a great difference to self-funders.

As Dai said, there is also a great deal of interest and concern about how we can enable people to stay healthy and well and supported in their own homes. People are supportive of the six-week home care package that we announced earlier this year, which will enable people, on discharge from hospital, to have six weeks of free care in their home. That will enable them to obtain the support that they need to stay in the home rather than consider the option of long-term residential or nursing care. However, it is important that we recognise the current pressures on the home-care sector.

As alluded to earlier during questions to the First Minister, we are taking action in addition to yesterday's announcement. I have also announced £5 million for the home-care sector to work with local government, which commissions it, to consider ways in which we can have better partnerships to secure the necessary in-the-home care. It is clear that we must examine the whole range of issues and recognise our priorities for the 500,000 pensioners in Wales in terms of future policies that emerge from this important strategy. The voluntary sector Partnership Council has agreed a three-year code of practice for funding. We are also supporting organisations such as Crossroads, not just in their service provision, but in the work that they do to help us develop policy.

**Brian Gibbons:** I know that you have attended some of the evidence-gathering meetings. Do you agree that one of the most interesting developments at the meetings was that many older people did not want to speak about the fourth age end-of-life issues? They wanted to talk about promoting their own

autonomy, independence and right to live a full and active life. You summarised this when you said that people may be retired, but they are not retired from life. Certainly, though they may be pensioned, they have not pensioned-off their expectations. It is important, while we discuss matters such as free personal care and so on, that we do not allow the strategy for older people in Wales to just focus on those particular issues. For older people, living their lives is more than that. It is about opportunity, volunteering, lifelong learning, being able to get out and socialise and so on. If this strategy for older people is to deliver for older people in Wales then we must never lose sight of these wider issues.

**Jane Hutt:** That is an important point. Many of the organisations that have come to make presentations and give their views on the consultation have shown how the active elderly are making a huge contribution to Welsh society. Yesterday, I received the ‘flame of volunteering’ from a group of senior citizens who have walked and travelled around Wales this month, which is the older people’s month in the United Nations’ International Year of Volunteers 2001. We also heard about the work done by older people with young people in our communities and in schools. The importance that older people feel in terms of their own health, wellbeing and independence comes from their active citizenship, which they want to maintain. We must look at the whole. I agree completely with Brian in terms of what emerges from this policy and from the strategy.

We must also recognise that this is not just a matter for the health and social care portfolio: it is a matter for education and lifelong learning, housing, the environment and all Assembly Members to take on board.

**David Melding:** The all-party group on older people’s issues, which I currently chair—the chair rotates among the political parties—is considering the strategy and will make a submission. We have been helped by the work of Age Concern, the secretariat to that group, which brought a wide range of people to talk to us about the experience, interests

and concerns of older people. I agree with Brian Gibbons. It is not only a matter of the services that they receive, but also the contribution they want to make to society. As well as considering their voluntary work, we should remember that many older people want to work in paid employment well into what would otherwise be considered as retirement age. Perhaps some practices discriminate against older people, and we must challenge them. Reaching the minimum age for retirement should not necessarily mean that someone ought not to pursue paid work.

I want to touch on some policies that affect this strategy, which may also have been dealt with elsewhere. I know that we are examining the charging policies. Many older people consider the charging policies to be iniquitous. If they are to be applied at all, it should be on a consistent, all-Wales basis, so that we do not get 22 different versions.

Concern is growing over the effective support of carers. Many people caring during their old age have done so for some time and have not built up a pension. They feel that they are denied a reasonable income, as they could not provide themselves with more than the state retirement pension. Some schemes for how carers could be remunerated for the care that they deliver have been considered. Direct payments are not provided to people within families, and such matters need to be revisited.

Nursing and residential homes raise other questions, but I will not concentrate on those. A positive development over the last 20 years was the growth in domiciliary care services in people's homes. The increased standards that we now insist upon in this sector are also driving up costs. We need to be careful, because some providers could go out of business, and that would restrict the choice for older people. I am sure that we can head off that possibility, but we must be mindful of it.

lists is one health issue that severely impinges upon older people's quality of life. We should remember that joint replacement operations need to be performed speedily and effectively—to wait up to six years for one in Bro Taf is unacceptable. We must prioritise producing an effective response to that particular medical issue.

**Jane Hutt:** Following on from Brian's contribution on our older people's contribution in Wales, we need to ensure that they can continue to work. Wales must not have an ageist society. We must also recognise our senior citizens' wisdom and experience, which is valuable. Their contribution to the voluntary sector is certainly valuable. Their work and lifelong learning opportunities should not be impeded. Lifelong learning can continue throughout old age, and we hope that that will be reflected in Assembly policies.

We held a consultation on local authority charging policies, as David is aware, and we must move forward on its outcome. That links with your point about domiciliary services. Many of our services that attract a charge are domiciliary services. They are vital in enabling people to stay at home with support in the community. Again, it reflects on our work supporting the social care workforce. Our expectations of the standard of domiciliary care and care homes is an issue. How do we meet those standards without destabilising the service or putting it at a disadvantage? Our social care workforce is also in difficulty: some of them work in the most difficult conditions in Wales, but are often on the lowest pay rate. We must recognise that that is part of the picture.

Carers' needs are key to the Assembly's policy agenda. Elderly people care for other elderly people and we need to consider not only support and respite services, but also perhaps how we can support them further in the community. Some of these issues may be outside the purview of the Assembly. We need to talk to our Westminster colleagues, as other issues will arise from the strategy.

On orthopaedics and joint replacements of hips and knees and so forth, as our population lives ever longer, it will not be a matter of one hip replacement, but of two or more replacements per person, and hip revisions. As people live longer, the huge increase in demand on the health budget must be considered. There is a target that, from next July, no-one should wait more than 18 months for a hip or joint replacement operation. This is an important target for senior citizens in Wales.

**Peter Black:** I welcome the statement and the consultation on the strategy for older people in Wales. Older people are entitled to expect to be able to live in dignity and security. That is why I welcome this comprehensive strategy because it will address all aspects of the Assembly's responsibilities affecting the lives of older people.

The need to implement the findings of the Royal Commission on long-term care and the introduction of free personal care needs to be raised with Westminster colleagues. Although your recent announcement about free nursing care in residential homes in Wales is welcome, personal care should also be free. The current long-term care system is unfair. People with modest assets, who have been prudent, saved their money and bought homes, are hardest hit. They are often forced to sell their homes and spend their life savings on care that they thought would be supplied free of charge by the national health service. An important part of this strategy is getting the Westminster Government to seriously consider this issue and whether the recommendations can be implemented. I urge the Minister to impress upon her Westminster colleagues the urgency of this in order to boost the welfare of older people in Wales.

I am pleased that the Minister has recognised the cross-cutting nature of this review. For example, as older people and others in Wales rely on public transport, there is a need to invest in adequate services. Central services

This issue is on the strategy steering group's agenda. It is important that we consider the whole context of the needs of older people. We must do that in terms of prioritisation. Perhaps some colleagues may not be aware that the personal care of three-quarters of the people in residential and nursing homes in Wales is paid from the public purse. A total of 2,400 people who fund their own care will benefit from the £100 per week for free nursing care. It is important that we work closely and inclusively with organisations concerned about free personal care to try to come to an arrangement where the free nursing care package is more generous than the one on offer in England and Scotland, the latter being only £65 a week. This demonstrates that we are trying to address care issues, which is our aim and intention.

I welcome your points about transport and the cross-cutting nature of this strategy. We must ensure, as Brian said, that we pay attention to the wider vision to deliver for the 580,000 pensioners in Wales.

**Geraint Davies:** I raise concerns about the future of respite care in NHS hospitals. The original proposal for the new Rhondda hospital included deleting respite care beds. I hope that that has now changed and that those beds will be reinstated. However, the original plan was to use the facilities of private residential and nursing homes to provide respite care. There is concern—

**Helen Mary Jones:** Datganaf fy mhryder—a deallaf fod hyn wedi'i godi yn y Pwyllgor Busnes eisoes—am y ffaith fod y Pwyllgor Cyfle Cyfartal yn cael ei gynnal bob amser ar yr un diwrnod â Phwyllgor yr Amgylchedd, Cynllunio a Thrafnidiaeth. Mae hynny hefyd yn wir am y Pwyllgor Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes. Fel y gŵyr Aelodau, nid yw'r pwysau gwaith o ran Pwyllgorau yn deillio o'r ffaith fod yn rhaid eistedd yn yr ystafell, ond o'r holl waith cartref y mae'n rhaid ei wneud o flaen llaw, megis darllen papurau ac ymgynghori ag eraill.

**Helen Mary Jones:** I state my concern—and I understand that this has already been raised in the Business Committee—about the fact that the Committee on Equality of Opportunity is always held on the same day as the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee. The same is true of the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee. As Members know, the burden of Committee work does not stem from the fact that you have to sit through the Committee itself, but from the homework that must be done beforehand, such as reading papers and consulting with others.

Yr ydym wedi colli aelod gwerthfawr o'r Pwyllgor Cyfle Cyfartal, sef Richard Edwards, nad oedd yn meddwl y gallai gadeirio Pwyllgor yr Amgylchedd, Cynllunio a Thrafnidiaeth a bod yn aelod o'r Pwyllgor Cyfle Cyfartal am ei fod wedyn yn gorfol gwneud gormod o waith ar yr un diwrnod. Mae hefyd yn mynd yn erbyn y syniad gwreiddiol o gael un aelod o bob Pwyllgor Pwnc ar y Pwyllgorau trawsbynciol, a allai yn y dyfodol, ein gwthio at sefyllfa lle mai dim ond yr Aelodau sydd heb gyfarfodydd yn y prynhawn a fydd eisiau bod ar y Pwyllgor Cyfle Cyfartal.

We have lost a valued member of the Committee on Equality of Opportunity, namely Richard Edwards, who did not think that he could chair the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee and be a member of the Committee on Equality of Opportunity, because it meant that he had too much work to do in one day. It also goes against the original idea of having one member of each Subject Committee on the cross-cutting Committees, which could push us to a situation in the future where only Members who do not have meetings in the afternoon would want to be on the Committee on Equality of Opportunity.

It also creates problems for members of the public who wish to attend both Committees, especially when the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee meets outside Cardiff, which we frequently try to do. I understand that this is difficult and I understand the Minister for Assembly Business's problems in trying to find time for meetings. However, I encourage him to try to solve this problem by February.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. There seems to be confusion. We are debating a motion on the approval of the periodic timetable. Are there any other speakers on the motion? I see that there are not.

**Andrew Davies:** Trying to balance Members' various interests is a problem. The scheduling of Committees is not a matter for me. It is a matter for Committee Secretariat in the Presiding Office. My responsibility is to formally table matters. However, there are issues about party representation on Committees. There are issues that others want to raise about having widespread geographical representation on Committees as far as is possible. There is also the issue of gender balance. If we were to add an extra element in the cross-cutting themes and require members of various Subject Committees to also be on various Standing Committees, that would add another level of complication. The Business Committee has discussed this and we have come to a decision that party groups should decide on those matters, not officials or the Committee Secretariat.

**Dafydd Wigley:** Pwynt o drefn. Yn ystod y cwestiynau yn gynharach, fe ddylwn fod wedi datgan buddiant o safbwyt fy nghysylltiad â busnes bach yn fy etholaeth. Ymddiheuraf am beidio â gwneud hynny'n gynharach.

**David Melding:** Point of order. It is my understanding that the Health and Social Services Committee had been informed that there would be a Plenary debate on the issue of structural reforms. Unfortunately, I do not have the papers with me. I will ask to see them as soon as possible. If I can forward this documentary evidence to you, will you require the Minister for Assembly Business to answer the question that I posed about why the debate was downgraded to a statement?

**The Presiding Officer:** As Members know I cannot require Ministers to give answers in relation to content. I can give them the opportunity to answer questions. The Minister has heard, and I believe that he maintains that he has given you an answer. However, you may wish to take the matter further in exchanges with the Minister.

**Brian Hancock:** No, it is further to David Melding's point of order. I have the minutes and report to the Health and Social Services Committee here. I read point 13.

'I will be in a position to announce my conclusions on the future structure at the meeting of the Committee on Wednesday 7 November 2001, followed by a Plenary debate in the following week.' [OPPOSITION ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Oh.']}

**The Presiding Officer:** That is a matter for the Minister to consider and respond to at a later date.

**Peter Rogers:** Point of order. I raise this under Standing Order No. 6.26. It relates to questions to the Minister for Rural Affairs on 25 October. I told the Minister that I had birth certificates which showed that despite his Government's policy, he had buried cattle over five years of age at Penhesgyn tip. The Minister responded by denying knowledge of that fact. I quote from the Record of Proceedings:

'If you have evidence that the cattle were

questions—Christine Chapman's question 5 on the conference on lesser used languages—I noticed that the First Minister not only managed to read a prepared answer to the tabled question, but also to the supplementary question. **Y Llywydd:** Mater i'r Gweinidog i'w ystyried ac ymateb iddo yn ddiwerddarach yw hynny.

**Peter Rogers:** Pwynt o drefn. Codaf hyn o dan Reol Sefydlog Rhif 6.26. Mae'n ymwneud â chwestiynau i'r Gweinidog dros Faterion Gwledig ar 25 Hydref. older than we were led to believe, we would want to see it so that we could discuss the matter with the appropriate farmers.'

I have provided the Minister with the birth certificates; however, I have since been informed that the farmer concerned provided the relevant documentation to officials at the time. Either the Minister is ignorant of what is happening in his department, or he has deliberately misled Members. Standing Orders provide that the Minister should give accurate information, and that when he has given inaccurate information, he should seek to correct it at the first available opportunity.

**The Presiding Officer:** I ask Peter to reconsider the words 'deliberately misled Members'. I do not believe that any of our Ministers deliberately mislead Members.

**Peter Rogers:** Yes, I will reconsider that; it must have been ignorance on his part.

**The Minister for Rural Affairs (Carwyn Jones):** I reject any suggestion that I deliberately misled Members. There is no evidence to support that, and I would not expect Peter to produce any; that is the nature of his comments.

I, personally, have not buried cattle aged over five years at the tip. I have not been seen with a shovel or a rake at Penhesgyn tip, nor do I intend to be seen there. He has told the press that I may have to dig up the cattle at the Penhesgyn tip, but I can assure him that I will not do so, nor will people acting under my instructions or those of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. Asking for evidence of a fact is not the same as denying that fact. He should know that. He has referred to birth certificates, but if he means cattle passports—as I think he does—then I have not seen them. He has not handed them to me in person, although the remainder of his point of order implies that everything was done by me personally.

All that has been said, was said accurately and in good faith. A letter will soon be placed

Finally, you will notice in the letter that this gentleman asked that his cattle be taken as dangerous contact, because he claims that they have been blighted. Not long afterwards, he contacted the State Veterinary Service to say that the cattle had strayed to the Penhesgyn landfill site. They were disposed of there. He told the veterinary officer, according to our information, that all the cattle were under five years of age. This fact is noted in the veterinary officer's notebook. The other question that must be asked is why it took him four and a half years to register the birth of these cattle. A sensible Assembly Member would look at this letter and be wary of its contents. However, I cannot speak for Peter.

**Peter Rogers:** Further to that point of order—

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. There can be no further points on that point of order. This is not a debate about cattle at Penhesgyn or anywhere else. Points of order must not be used for that purpose. We have heard the Minister's response. It is on the record, as is your statement, Peter. I do not see how there can be further points of order on this matter.

**Peter Rogers:** I raise a point of order—

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. Is this point of order raised under a different Standing Order?

**Peter Rogers:** Yes. I raise this point of order under Standing Order No. 6.

**The Presiding Officer:** Is this the point of order of which you have given me notice?

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. This is not a matter for me. Timing is a matter for the Business Committee. That point should have been raised in the Business Committee meeting this morning.

**Alun Cairns:** Point of order. Llywydd, you will recall that I raised a point of order under Standing Order No. 6.34 on Thursday, 1 November. It related to six questions that I had tabled to the First Minister and the Minister for Economic Development. The questions were tabled on 19 October and were due for answer on 25 October. You will recall that my point of order sought to underline the unnecessary delay in responding, and that chasing up the Minister's private office had proved fruitless. Eventually, on Friday, 2 November, I received a response. My questions asked whether the Minister would list the number of invitations that he has received to attend events in his official capacity as First Minister and Minister for Economic Development, and asked him to list those that he has accepted and those that he has been forced to decline.

The response that I received to the questions tabled to him as the Minister for Economic Development and those tabled to him as the First Minister was not consistent. The response to the questions tabled to the First Minister stated that the information could only be provided at a disproportionate cost. The answers to identical questions tabled to

**The Presiding Officer:** I am unable to answer to that question. It is not my responsibility. The content of ministerial answers is a matter for the Minister. I have heard the phrases that you quoted elsewhere.

**Alun Cairns:** Further to that point of order, would it be in order to ask whether the First Minister and Minister for Economic Development would publish every invitation that he receives from now on—those that he accepts, and those that he declines. He will be aware of the tension that arises from the First Minister seeking to do the jobs of both the First Minister and Minister for Economic Development. He will also be aware of the business community's response to that, and its concern that it is not having an adequate relationship with the Cabinet, which it deserves.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. To answer your question, if you were to rush to the Table Office, following the next debate, and seek to table such a question and if it is in order, it will appear on the agenda and be scheduled for answer. My suspicion is that the answer may be similar to the ones that were provided earlier.

**Mick Bates:** Point of order. I raise this under Standing Orders Nos. 8.20, 8.21, 17.1 and 17.2 relating to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee's decision to consider the draft report of the higher education policy review in private, although we now know that

Standing Orders No. 8.20 and 17.2 can clearly be overridden by a decision in accordance with Standing Order No. 8.21 to hold a session of a Committee meeting in private. What provision exists to determine whether or not a Committee was or was not justified in making such a decision? For example, is there a mechanism by which the Committee's decision can be referred to an independent arbitrator? Finally, what sanctions does the Assembly have against a Member, or a member of his or her staff, who has disclosed information to the public against the provisions of Standing Order No. 17.1?

**The Presiding Officer:** Thank you for giving me advance notice of that point of order. A Committee can, on successive occasions, having taken into account the criteria in Standing Order No. 8.21, decide to exclude the public from its meetings. That was done in an orderly way, therefore there was no breach of Standing Order No. 8.20 in this matter. Today's debate is the latest chance for the Assembly to perform one of its most important functions, that is, to influence the creation of primary legislation. It is fundamental to the Assembly's good name that we get this right. The motion is framed with that in mind. I hope that the Assembly and its Committees will take full advantage of the opportunities offered by the legislative programme provided in the Queen's Speech. It is possible to get sidetracked into making broad or cheap political points aimed at the UK Government. However, that is not the job of Subject Committees. They should look closely at the legislation and see what can be done to make it work better for Wales.

The Queen's Speech builds on a record of which we can proud. Since 1999, 17 new Acts of Parliament have conferred substantial new powers on the Assembly at our request. These have covered major issues—outstandingly, the reform of our education and training system—but Acts to strengthen the NHS, to protect vulnerable children and to open up the countryside were also included. Two substantial Wales-only Bills have been announced in the last nine months; the same amount as in all the legislative programmes between 1979 and 1997 put together. That would not have happened without devolution and without the close and co-operative relationship that we generally have with the UK Government.

The draft NHS (Wales) Bill is the second recent Wales-only Bill. It will enable radical restructuring of the NHS in Wales, in line with our national plan for the NHS. It will make the NHS more responsive to local and patient needs. There are many major differences to what is being proposed for England. It is an excellent example of how we can work with the UK Government to develop legislation for Wales.

**The First Minister:** If they have not been dealt with in the interim, they will be dealt with in the draft Bill. I will explain that further later. Publishing the NHS (Wales) Bill in draft form allows the Assembly and others to scrutinise it before it is formally introduced to Parliament. The same is true of the draft Communications Bill. We hope to see more Bills being introduced in draft form in future. The Leader of the House of Commons, Robin Cook, has also stated that.

The Adoption and Children Bill is, at least partly, a response to the case of the Kilshaws, which occasioned such interest in north Wales and, indeed, the world. However, we should not see it in such narrow terms. We expect that there will be significant functions for the Assembly. We must consider how we use those functions to build on the innovative approach to children's policy and services that we have already developed via the Children's Commissioner for Wales and otherwise.

The Homelessness Bill significantly strengthens local authorities' capacity to support those who are at risk of becoming homeless. We strongly welcome this Bill, which will allow us to build on our commitments in 'Putting Wales First: A Partnership for the People of Wales'. Again, the views of the Subject Committees on that matter will be valuable. Members will recall that both these Bills were reintroduced from the last session of Parliament because the general election meant that there was little chance of them going through in the programme of the Queen's Speech for 2000. The Bills' contents are therefore predictable. Nevertheless, it is important that the Subject Committees scrutinise them.

The NHS Reform Bill and the Education Bill are not so predictable. However, they will have a significant impact on Wales. The NHS Reform Bill must be dovetailed with the proposals in the NHS (Wales) Bill. We are working closely with UK colleagues on the

detail and, as the Secretary of State for Wales stated last month, it is important that these Bills recognise the distinctive agendas for Wales and, equally important, that the two Subject Committees also satisfy themselves on that.

The Land Registration Bill will update the law relating to registration of title by introducing electronic or paperless conveyancing, and removing some major defects in the present conveyancing system. The ownership of land and registration of title is not a devolved matter and powers are being conferred on the Lord Chancellor. However, there has been recent interest in the Assembly as regards the buying and selling of homes.

The draft Safety Bill intends to make travel by rail, air, sea and on roads safer and also makes plans to revitalise health and safety at work. Implementing Lord Cullen's recommendation on rail safety is vital. Ministers from the Department for Transport, Local Government and the Regions are considering how best to consult on their legislative proposals. It is, of course, of interest to Wales in the light of the Southall crash and the subsequent incidents involving First Great Western trains, which incurred Welsh fatalities.

Since this motion was tabled for debate the UK Government has also introduced the Animal Health Bill, which will provide additional powers to tackle foot and mouth disease and will be extendable by Order to other animal diseases. The Bill will amend the Animal Health Act 1981, and I am sure that the Assembly's Agriculture and Rural Development Committee will wish to examine it.

In my view, those are the six key items of legislation that the Subject Committees can get stuck into and scrutinise in order to form an Assembly view.

I turn now to the amendments. I support amendment 5. The date was inserted when the debate was scheduled for July, but as it was postponed, it is no longer realistic to expect Committees to report by the end of this month. We must allow the maximum time for proper consideration. I am happy to support amendment 6 and amendment 10. I share the disappointment that proposals to make St David's Day a public holiday in Wales and for the banning of tobacco advertising were not included in the speech. There are always losers and nobody likes being one of them. We support the Conservative Group and the Plaid Cymru group on those amendments.

The matters proposed in amendment 15 do not require primary legislation: that could be done by a transfer Order. However, we will support amendment 15. We have already pressed for such a transfer, so it would be logical for us to support that amendment.

We would have been willing to support amendment 1 and amendment 9 but both fail, in part, to understand current Bills and previous Acts. There is already a commitment to further reform of the House of Lords following consultation. We have achieved greater cohesion between education and training under the wide powers in the Learning and Skills Act 2000 and the establishment of Education and Learning Wales. Therefore, we cannot support those amendments.

Jocelyn Davies's amendment 13 also jumps the gun. We have repeatedly made it clear that an independent commission will be established early next year to examine the Assembly's powers, which will report to the Assembly in mid or late 2003. Plaid Cymru welcomed it at the time. It is pointless welcoming it and then prejudging its conclusions a year and a half in advance.

I will clarify one issue before I discuss some of the other amendments. There are no widespread plans for the privatisation of key public services in Wales. If there were, I would resist them. The Secretary of State for

Wales explained, when he addressed the Assembly in June, that the Assembly will decide on such matters. We will not support amendments 2 and 12. Furthermore, I am not content to have my remarks about having no more than one or two specialist schools in Wales taken out of context, as William Graham's amendment 3 seeks to do.

We do not support amendment 11. It is important that we consider this issue in the wider context of our emerging policies and priorities to improve older people's lives. I am pleased to see the mature proposals regarding the draft NHS (Wales) Bill in William Graham's amendments 7 and 8. I am not convinced that we need to judge these issues now; they are for Committees to scrutinise. There will also be a wider consultation on this Bill, which will continue for many months. I am also not convinced that membership of local health partnerships should be outlined on the face of the Bill, instead of leaving it to Assembly subordinate legislation. Reluctantly, we do not support those amendments.

Although we cannot support several amendments, I am pleased that a more considered approach to primary legislation has been demonstrated today than has been demonstrated in some previous debates.

On amendment 14, I do not know what William Graham and Peter Rogers mean. You cannot abolish rural deprivation by making it illegal. We have ample powers to tackle rural issues and, in case you had not noticed, we have been exercising them a great deal lately. I am not trivialising these serious issues, but anyone who imagines that you can sweep away rural poverty by a stroke of a parliamentary draftsman's pen, is living in fairyland. I have no time for that amendment. It is *chwarae plant*, as we would say in Welsh—playing up. The principle behind today's motion is not that the Queen's Speech was perfect in every respect—of course it was not—but that the Assembly must take its opportunities to make primary legislation work for Wales. That is why I urge all Members to support this motion.

I welcome the Secretary of State for Wales to the Assembly. We were pleased that he visited the Assembly some months ago to deliver a statement on the contents of the Queen's Speech. We are also pleased that he is here today to respond to this debate.

The last time we discussed the Queen's Speech, we confirmed that this is the real speech. The Bills included in last year's speech were obviously included in preparation for a general election. This year, we see the priorities of the Government elected in June, and, as a result, its stance on several important matters and principles have become apparent.

As we said earlier this year, we welcome some of the Bills, for example that on the adoption of children. Nevertheless, several Bills are notable by their absence. We list some of those Bills in our amendments, such as Bills to give primary legislative and tax-varying powers to the Assembly to make it a real parliament. We do not accept that our welcoming the announcement of a review following the next Assembly elections is contrary to our aspirations.

Our amendments also refer to legislative proposals for more cohesive systems of education, training and careers for people of all ages; making St David's Day a bank holiday; and allowing the Assembly to decide on a Welsh tick box on census forms. We also refer to Bills that are missing from the Government's own programme, and Rhodri

The contents of this year's Queen's Speech, more than any other in recent years, shows the ever-widening gulf that now exists between the agenda pursued by the New Labour UK Government at Westminster and the aspirations of the people of Wales. We now see it in almost every field of policy. On the economy, the whole thrust of UK economic policy is aimed at affluent parts of the United Kingdom such as the south-east of England. No real attempt is being made, through tax or fiscal measures, to spread prosperity throughout the United Kingdom and to all parts of Wales. On health, no effort is being made to direct resources to those areas of greatest need, for example, in Wales. The constant tinkering with structures is creating more and more quangos and bureaucracy rather than targeting health resources to the areas with greatest need. The great dilemma for our First Minister is that he

Morgan confirmed that he regrets the fact that there is no Bill in the Queen's Speech to prohibit tobacco advertising. We hope that the Assembly will send a strong message to Westminster stating our wish to see such a Bill introduced without delay.

Some proposals which fall outside the legislative sphere could have been made since the Queen's Speech provides an opportunity to include some issues in addition to legislation. For example, Plaid Cymru wanted to see the United Kingdom Government commit itself to introducing free personal care for the elderly. We want the Assembly to support that. We realise that the Assembly has made a statement on nursing care, but we want that to be developed to include personal care.

Having considered the proposals in the speech and the amendments today, we see the United Kingdom Government's stance on basic social principles. We see that the Government's agenda is right of centre, rather than left of centre. We would like to pursue a radical left of centre agenda with an emphasis on ensuring that the Assembly has the powers to deliver for the people of Wales.

He invited the House of Commons to introduce legislation that seeks to remove that enduring legacy and introduce creeping privatisation in the health service. That is the kind of statement you would expect from a Conservative Minister. I am sure it would be cheered to the rafters by Welsh Conservative Members, but its impact on Wales would be horrific.

On education, we have the spectacle of Tony Blair enthusing about the prospect of specialist schools. We understand that that goes against the grain for the Labour group in the Assembly. Nevertheless, we have the admission that there will be some specialist schools in Wales, with all that implies in terms of selection.

This Queen's Speech is a complete clash of values between New Labour—which has stolen the Conservatives' clothes and commitment to increasing privatisation in public services, particularly health and education—and the values that we promote and which the people of Wales want us to promote. Those are properly resourced public services, delivering good quality care in health, and education in our schools. There is also, of course, the failure of the New Labour Government to understand what must be done to ensure that this body can deliver for the people of Wales. It is becoming glaringly obvious to us that the National Assembly, as it is currently constituted, simply cannot deliver for Wales within the constraints of its existing powers. They are too weak and too confusing and the public is disappointed by how this Labour/Liberal administration is not delivering for the people of Wales. We now have two years' experience of what can be

I am sure that the Secretary of State for Wales read last Sunday's *The Observer* with interest. He may have noted a letter that highlighted the UK Government's u-turns on student tuition fees, a grown-up policy on cannabis, the conversion of Railtrack to a not-for-profit organisation and the scrapping of the voucher system for refugees. Looking back over the last four years, all the following policies were advocated by the Liberal Democrats before they were adopted by the present Westminster Government: giving independence to the Bank of England; the introduction of proportional representation to elections to the European Parliament; and, indeed, the introduction of devolution.

I am happy to note that and to congratulate the UK Government for all these policies and the benefits that they have brought. I have no problem with that. If the Liberal Democrats can win the argument and get our policies put into action, we are achieving what we came into politics to achieve. However, I cannot welcome everything that the Government is doing, particularly where we feel that more action could be taken.

The Liberal Democrats are disappointed with the Queen's Speech in several respects, which I will outline. We draw attention to a few points in amendment 1.

I want to move on to discuss the issues with which we are disappointed. Firstly, free long-term care for the elderly. We have debated this issue today. There is a widespread view that the package presented to us by the Minister for Health and Social Services is the maximum that the Assembly can do within its powers. We are disappointed that the UK Government has not seen fit to follow the example of the Scottish Parliament, where the Liberal Democrats and Labour, in partnership, have moved to accept the findings of the Royal Commission. I am pleased that Plaid Cymru also supports that. As the Secretary of State knows, the Royal Commission was established by the Labour Government in the last Parliament to introduce free personal care, as well as nursing care, for the elderly. The Liberal Democrats believe that it is wrong for elderly people to suffer the indignity of having to sell their own homes to pay for their own long-term care. I think that the people of Wales agree with us.

The second issue that I raise is that of an early referendum on the euro. I have just returned, as have other Members, from the Confederation of British Industry's conference, where I heard a slight difference of emphasis on this matter between the Chancellor of the Exchequer and the Prime Minister. The Liberal Democrats are concerned that the UK Labour Government

has not taken a strong enough lead on the euro. The issue has been delayed for too long. In the meantime, we are suffering the loss of manufacturing jobs in Wales, partly because companies are seeking exchange rate certainty. We believe that the euro can provide that certainty. I accept that there are measures, and times for when this could be done. However, a message of clear intent and statement by the UK Government would send a signal of confidence to Welsh industry, particularly the manufacturing industry. The Liberal Democrats believe that we should move this debate forward and let the people of Britain decide on this vital issue.

The third point that I want to raise with the Secretary of State for Wales is the democratic reform of the House of Lords. I appreciate that constitutional change has taken place, but the need for dramatic reform has long been recognised. We acknowledge that in abolishing the rights of hereditary peers, the Labour Government has made progress on this matter. However, we are deeply concerned that we have substituted a House of Lords based on privilege for one based on patronage and, in some ways, that is equally worrying. We want to see the House of Lords replaced with a smaller, directly-elected Senate, which would enable the upper House to be more representative of Wales and the other nations and regions of the UK. Our argument with the present Labour Government in London's approach is that we do not view it as wholly democratic. Why should we be afraid of letting the people of Britain decide who sits in the upper Chamber?

I raise an important issue for urban Wales, on the registration and licensing of houses in multiple occupation. In Labour's 1997 general election manifesto, it pledged to introduce a licensing scheme for houses in multiple occupation. However, more than four years later, the UK Government has not yet delivered on that pledge. There are no legislative proposals on the scheme in the Queen's Speech. However, we welcome the fact that the Department for Transport, Local

The standard of accommodation in houses in multiple occupation in Wales is often recognised to be of a significantly lower standard, below that which we would like. This is a key issue in many urban areas in Wales, in particular, cities such as Cardiff and Swansea. Licensing would help us to improve standards for those who live in such accommodation, as well as those who live among houses in multiple occupation in areas with a high concentration of such properties. We hope that we will not have to wait too much longer for this.

**Michael German:** Before I accept David Melding's intervention, I want to refer to how we will vote on the amendments. We support amendments 5 and 6, which are the partnership Government's policy, and amendments 10 and 13, because they are in line with our party's policy. On health, perhaps the First Minister has not updated his speech over the summer recess. We know that because Jane Hutt sent a letter to David Melding on 25 July, stating that the provision relating to the structures in Wales are to be dealt with in the English Bill. They will not be dealt with in the Welsh Bill, as the First Minister indicated. Therefore, he is out of date on that. Such was his pride in a Welsh Bill, that he did not seem to realise that it is only an outline provision and all the Welsh provisions will be dealt with in the English Bill. I must say that it is nothing like the bonfire of quangos that we were promised. We would favour an all-Wales health authority, at arm's length from the National Assembly, carrying out the work that the five Welsh health authorities currently do, rather than glorified quangos made up of the 22 existing health boards. They cannot possibly do all the work that would be asked of them, such as commissioning provision and the possible extension of community and mental health care. It would be impossible.

The First Minister made much of amendment 14, which he may have misread. He thought that it was something to do with eradicating rural poverty and that we had asked for measures to address this. We have asked for measures to address the crisis in the countryside, which is not unreasonable. Some of these could be done in legislative form, for example, restricting the import of infected meat from countries where foot and mouth disease is endemic—

**Brian Gibbons:** I know that you have not seen the final response to the consultation on the future of the health service, but I wonder how you can reconcile your comments on the health boards not being able to deliver with your party's declared policy that all these decisions should be devolved to frontline clinicians? How will they make the decisions when they are treating patients?

Whether or not you are in favour of banning fox hunting, it seems to be an extraordinary slap in the face for rural Wales that there is nothing in this legislative programme to address the problems of the countryside. The First Minister was rather too flippant, cavalier and dismissive in saying that the Welsh Conservatives want Labour to do something about rural poverty. We want you to do something about rural poverty and the Queen's Speech presented you with a golden opportunity to do that.

number of regulations going through Parliament last year, far more than have ever gone through before, even under a Labour Government. The number has accelerated during the Labour Government's period in office.

I want to refer briefly to the Criminal Justice Bill and to some of the anti-terrorism measures, which I know are being introduced subsequent to the Queen's Speech. Our party, here and in Westminster, gives a fair wind to those measures against terrorism. It is right that they are brought forward. We also support the proposals in the Criminal Justice Bill to set up a criminal assets recovery agency to recover drug pushers' receipts. I wonder how that is consistent with the Liberal Democrats' approach to legalising cannabis and, since their Welsh party conference in Builth Wells, to legalise heroin and cocaine as well. I hope that you have cleared it with the other half of the pantomime horse, because I do not think that Labour would be happy with those measures.

**Michael German:** Perhaps you would like to read the policy, because you are totally inaccurate. When you have read it, we will discuss it again.

**Nick Bourne:** I am not sure that that counts as an intervention. However, you had better have a word with your researcher, Gavin Cox, who has taken issue with me in the local newspapers in mid Wales, suggesting that you intend to legalise those drugs. I will give you a copy of the article in question.

The St David's Day provision seems to have been an issue. The First Minister hinted earlier that the only reason that that was not in the Queen's Speech was because the Welsh Conservatives wanted it as a replacement bank holiday in Wales. I am happy to withdraw that condition, in the spirit of comity, if he thinks that he can get it into the next Queen's Speech, because it is important that we have this legislation. Even though we have given much support to your Prime Minister recently, I did not think that our power in Downing Street was as great as you made it sound. Perhaps you exaggerate

The Queen's Speech is a great disappointment. It is unimpressive and largely irrelevant to Wales. It misses the point on healthcare reform, which is dealt with in the English Bill, not the Welsh Bill. It totally fails to address the worst crisis in agriculture for a century. That is why we will oppose the motion on this Queen's Speech and support amendments that seek to improve it.

**Alison Halford:** I welcome the Prime Minister's legislative programme. It signals a more open and responsive relationship with the Executive in Whitehall, which is in all of our best interests. The Speech clearly indicates that devolution is beginning to penetrate the mindset of Central Government. That is encouraging and it reflects the hard work of our Cabinet and the Secretary of State for Wales. The NHS (Wales) Bill is an excellent achievement. It is good to see local health groups becoming the main gateway for local service provision. This will hopefully cut back on bureaucracy and give the health service back to local communities. Some constituents however have raised concerns, mainly focusing on the difficulty of aiming for clear lines of accountability, while at the same time dividing power between local health groups and the consortia. However, now is not the time for such a detailed debate.

I now come on to my main point. The Bill bringing about police reform is also vital for Wales. It is about time that the principles of openness, accountability and transparency penetrated the upper echelons of our police service. I hope that the Bill will force a change to the managerial culture of the police and its authorities which encourages secrecy, and values obstinacy. The ordinary police officer is a hard-working and dedicated professional who is being unfairly tarnished by this culture of secrecy. Secrecy in the majority of cases is totally unnecessary, and the public then struggles to learn basic information from its public servants. The

targeting of sickness and spurious medical retirement will save our country several million pounds a year. In some areas, up to 50 per cent of all neighbourhood police officers are off sick. As has already been recommended, I would like to welcome the Criminal Assets Recovery Agency, set up under the Proceeds of Crime Bill. This will see drugs barons and pimps get what they deserve. Their criminal gains will be taken from them and given to the state to help repair the damage that they have caused.

I will also mention the second stage of the House of Lords reform, also mentioned in the Queen's Speech. The people's peers initiative has so far been disappointing. Out of the 15 ordinary people chosen there are seven knights, one Lady, the chief executive of BP Amoco, a former ambassador, the Government's former chief scientific officer and the former commissioner of the Metropolitan Police, Sir Paul Condon. I know Sir Paul, but let us remember—

I shall concentrate on amendment 15 in the name of Jocelyn Davies. Unfortunately, the Minister for Rural Affairs is not in the Chamber to hear my comments.

The Assembly is now of the unanimous opinion that it needs more powers in the field of animal health in order to control foot and mouth disease. A fortnight ago, in the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee, that principle enjoyed cross-party support.

The experience of the past nine months has been extremely frustrating for Members representing rural constituencies, especially for the Minister, who was portrayed in the media as the man who managed foot and mouth disease without any powers to make the practical and scientific changes necessary to lift the restrictions on animal movements. There are many examples of changes which the Minister supported, but where the farmers of Wales were forced to wait for days and, more often, for weeks for a Minister in the former Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food to sign the piece of paper for those changes to be carried out.

Farmers in my constituency had direct experience of that: for a long time an area of north Ceredigion was designated an infected area, although there had been no case of the

Cyhoeddodd Llywodraeth San Steffan Fesur Iechyd Anifeiliaid yn y tymor seneddol hwn, ers Araith y Frenhines, a fydd yn diwygio Deddf Iechyd Anifeiliaid 1981. Mae'n bosibl y gellid cynnig gwelliant i'r Mesur hwn a fyddai'n galluogi trosglwyddo'r pwerau i'r Cynulliad. Ni fyddai'n rhaid inni ddisgwyl felly am is-ddeddfwriaeth gan Adran yr Amgylchedd, Bwyd a Materion Gwledig i lunio gorchymyn trosglwyddo swyddogaethau, fel y soniodd Prif Weinidog Cymru yn gynharach.

Gobeithiwn y gallai'r Prif Weinidog a'r Ysgrifennydd Gwladol gefnogi, mewn egwyddor, ddefnyddio'r Mesur Iechyd Anifeiliaid sydd newydd ei gyhoeddi, i sicrhau bod gan y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol y pwerau i reoli afiechydon anifeiliaid, yn unol

disease. There was no scientific basis for the decision, but an official in MAFF in London had drawn a circle on a map that included north Ceredigion. That was in spite of the fact that Atlantic winds and the Cambrian mountains separate Ceredigion and Llanidloes, which was the nearest place to Ceredigion where a case was identified. The Minister for Rural Affairs and his scientific advisers were ready to lift the restrictions. They put pressure on MAFF to do that, to the ridiculous extent that, apparently, an official went by car from London all the way to York to chase up the Parliamentary Secretary, Eliot Morley, so that he could sign a piece of paper lifting the restrictions.

That may not sound particularly serious this afternoon, but, during the period between implementing and lifting the restriction in north Ceredigion, thousands of animals were killed under the welfare scheme. The animals were starving because they could not be taken across the road to better pasture. Those animals were killed totally without need. That is the sort of information that would come to light in a public inquiry, which would cause embarrassment to the Government of Wales and the Government in London. Thousands of animals were needlessly killed over recent months and it is no surprise that our Governments are not courageous enough to hold a public inquiry into foot and mouth disease, as is appropriate.

The Westminster Government has published an Animal Health Bill in this parliamentary term, since the Queen's Speech, which will reform the Animal Health Act 1981. An amendment to that Bill could be proposed to enable a transfer of powers to the Assembly. We would not therefore have to wait for secondary legislation from the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs to draw up a transfer of functions order, as the First Minister alluded to earlier.

We hope that the First Minister and the Secretary of State can support, in principle, using the newly published Animal Health Bill to ensure that the National Assembly has the powers to control animal diseases, in line with the wish of all parties. The First

**Lynne Neagle:** I will speak briefly about the new animal health powers proposed by the UK Government. They are sadly necessary to deal with the aftermath of the foot and mouth disease crisis. However, they can only be a partial measure. We all need to learn the lessons of the foot and mouth disease crisis for Wales. One of those is that we can never again make the mistake of elevating the interests of farmers above those of everybody else in the countryside. The Assembly and the UK Government acted in good faith when they closed down much of the countryside, but that was a mistake. We allowed a small industry’s fears to damage a much larger industry—tourism. There is no evidence that any walker or mountaineer spread foot and mouth disease, but there is plenty of evidence of carelessness by farmers spreading the disease. If the Animal Health Bill helps redress the balance in the countryside in favour of tourism, that should be welcomed by everyone in Wales.

**David Davies:** Why does the Labour Party have a pathological hatred of farmers?

**Lynne Neagle:** The Labour Party does not hate farmers, David. I am not at all surprised to see the Welsh Conservatives defending the vested interests of some in the farming industry. I remind you that my constituents pay for those interests.

Secondly, there is the question of the long-term future of much marginal farming in Wales. We all paid a high price—too high a price—in the foot and mouth disease crisis, because we were all determined to save all farms and farmers in Wales. A long, cool look must lead us to conclude that we cannot carry on this way. We need to end the system of subsidies that costs us millions of pounds

Minister said that Plaid Cymru is obsessed with additional powers—I would call that a ‘policy’, rather than an obsession. However, if I have an obsession for animal health powers, it is an obsession that we all share.

**Lynne Neagle:** Siaradaf yn fyr am y pwerau newydd a gynigir gan Lywodraeth y DU ym maes iechyd anifeiliaid. We should make an effort, as every other country in the world does, to stop meat coming in from countries where foot and mouth disease is prevalent. We have not taken action against any of these countries. All we are doing now is trying to control the disease on farms.

**Lynne Neagle:** I do not think that it is a question of laying blame, Peter. It is about learning lessons to ensure that this never happens again.

**Elin Jones:** Do you agree, therefore, that the best means of learning the lessons would be a full public inquiry, which would bring the concerns that you, and possibly many other Assembly Members have on the foot and mouth disease crisis, to the public domain?

**Lynne Neagle:** I do not think that we need a public inquiry to learn the lessons, Elin. You are trying to create a smokescreen. I do not agree that a public inquiry would shame the Government or the Assembly. It would, rather, shame some farmers.

It would be much better to use some of the money that we spend on subsidies to create new rural businesses across Wales that could provide the sort of sustainable future that current farming policy does not. It cannot be right that we have more sheep on Welsh hillsides than we did two decades ago, yet farming incomes are at a new low. Thousands of sheep will not be destroyed—at a great cost to the taxpayer—because there is no market for their meat. This Bill is necessary to resolve that problem, but we also need to find a long-term solution. A sustainable future for farming will not be achieved until

**David Melding:** I commend the recommitment in the gracious speech to the devolution process in Great Britain. That will strengthen the British state and keep those who are firm and true unionists in good heart, because Britain as a political entity has a long way to run. In welcoming the Secretary of State, I commend his record, particularly in Northern Ireland where he worked hard as Minister of State in charge of political development. We are all pleased to see somewhat more positive developments in Northern Ireland this week. If devolution is successful in Wales and in Scotland, it will give a great chance of stability in Northern Ireland.

**David Melding:** Cymeradwyaf yr ymrwymiad eto i'r broses ddatganoli ym Mhrydain Fawr yn yr araith raslon. I will concentrate on the measures relating to the national health service. It is disappointing that our structural health reforms will now be dealt with in a Bill for England and Wales. As I understand it, all major changes will be amendments to the NHS Reform and Decentralisation Bill. There is therefore a danger that they will not receive the same attention as if they had been included in a specific, separate Welsh Bill, which was the original proposal for the NHS (Wales) Bill. These massive changes are the greatest overhaul to the health service since the early 1970s. That is the magnitude of the Assembly administration's proposal. It is somewhat confusing that even the First Minister seems to have lost sight of that. There was a major policy shift during the summer, when his colleague the Minister for Health and Social Services said that instead of using the NHS (Wales) Bill as the vehicle for reform, she would use amendments to the NHS Reform and Decentralisation Bill.

involved at an early stage, preferably during drafting.

It is disappointing that the NHS (Wales) Bill will not be introduced during this session, but during the 2002-03 session—time allowing, we are told. By then, it will deal with other measures, and not the major structural reforms. I acknowledge that it will try to address some important issues, particularly the future of community health councils, and I welcome that.

These reforms are likely to divide the Assembly. I anticipate that the Conservative and Plaid Cymru groups will be uncomfortable with some suggestions. We have heard that much of the national health service sector is reserved about these changes. They are particularly reserved about the abolition of health authorities, not having an all-Wales body, and having local health boards that are commissioners of primary and secondary care services, providers of primary care services, and possibly recipients of community care and mental health services in the near future. To have 22 commissioning authorities—which may well be weak, given that they currently lack capacity and that it would take time for them to develop—working against a centralised system that vests all the other health authorities' powers in the Minister for Health and Social Services, will be a mismatch and possibly even a danger. Will the Secretary of State for Wales merely accept these proposals as UK Government policy when he drives the primary legislation through the House of Commons, or will Members of Parliament from Wales and the rest of Britain be allowed to scrutinise the proposals line by line? Will they be allowed to reflect in Westminster the concerns expressed by the NHS community in Wales?

**Brian Gibbons rose—**

**David Melding:** Sorry, I did not realise that Dr Gibbons was trying to intervene. I have 30 seconds—

**John Griffiths:** First, Paul, I welcome the UK Government's priorities of prosperity, fairness and radical improvement of public services. These are the bread-and-butter issues on which governments should concentrate, as my Newport East constituents constantly tell me. They are also the Assembly's priorities, and I hope that, together with our UK Government partners, we can ensure effective implementation of well-constructed policy. Economies are subject to many influences and fluctuation, but the UK has had impressive economic stability since 1997. There are now 30,000 more people in work in Wales than there were at that time. Impressive progress—

**David Davies:** Will you give way?

**John Griffiths:** In a minute, David, once I have finished my point. Impressive progress towards the valuable goals of full employment and greatly boosting social justice has been made.

**David Davies:** I would agree that the economy has been fairly buoyant. However, is it not the case that it has been growing since about 1992? Is it not also the case that the reason the economy has been relatively successful is because the Labour Party adopted good Conservative policies and spending plans and abandoned its notions of socialism and nationalisation?

**John Griffiths:** Thankfully not, David. That is your gloss on things, which is far from reality. The Labour Government achieved

this impressive economic record and it is the Labour Government that will take it forward. The Conservatives know absolutely nothing about social justice. I will turn briefly to the atrocities in the United States of America and the commitments made in the Queen's Speech for an effective strategy to tackle world poverty, 'an early and comprehensive world trade round' and reform the United Nations' Security Council. In that regard, and with reference to amendment 2, many people have concerns about proposals to substantially increase the number of faith schools as it might lead to greater separation in schooling along religious and ethnic lines. Having said that, schools such as St Francis Roman Catholic Primary, in your constituency, Paul, provide an excellent education and have produced at least one excellent Secretary of State.

**John Griffiths:** I will take a brief intervention as I am running out of time.

**Jonathan Morgan:** Many church schools in Wales offer an excellent education. I attended a church school in Cardiff and other Members have had other such excellent experiences. We need a diverse, confident education system in Wales that offers a broad

**John Griffiths:** Derbyniaf ymyriad byr gan fod amser yn mynd yn brin.

**Jonathan Morgan:** Mae llawer o ysgolion yr eglwys yng Nghymru yn rhoi addysg ragorol. Mynychais un o'r ysgolion hynny yng Nghaerdydd ac mae Aelodau eraill wedi cael yr un profiad gwych. Mae angen system addysg amrywiol a hyderus arnom yng

range of education services supplied by a broad range of groups. Given that it is offered in England we should give it serious consideration in Wales.

**John Griffiths:** Some schools in Newport have a mix of children from many different ethnic backgrounds. Seeing them play together is wonderful. That is the model that we should develop in areas such as my constituency where there are children from different backgrounds.

These matters should be considered carefully and the Government should proceed with great caution as far as increasing the number of faith schools is concerned. We must bring different sections of our communities together and be careful not to exacerbate differences.

**David Lloyd:** As usual, I declare an interest as a general practitioner and county councillor.

Looking at the NHS (Wales) Bill, we see that it is a missed opportunity. Whichever Act or Bill is used to reform the national health service, we fail to see the bigger picture. That bigger picture is the inequalities in health statistics. With widespread poverty and worsening inequalities of income, health inequalities continue to widen. We have missed an opportunity to deal with that. That is why we proposed an amendment on free personal care—because charging fees adds to that inequality. Charging a fee for anything has a worse effect on the poor.

I am pleased that Rhodri supports the amendment on banning tobacco advertising. Smoking is also more widespread in our most disadvantaged areas. We could make these two positive contributions to do something about our health statistics, which are among the worst in Great Britain.

We do not have the powers at present to do anything about free personal care or banning tobacco advertising. As Ieuan said, that is a weakness of the Assembly.

The NHS (Wales) Bill is also a missed opportunity as regards the structures. As alluded to already, we favour an all-Wales, commissioning, arm's-length body to end the postcode lottery. People ask why should we have just one body. The reason is that we have postcode prescribing and a postcode lottery. We need an all-Wales, commissioning body that will decide what treatments will be available, and will roll them out to all the people of Wales.

We believe in streamlining bureaucracy to free up money for more patient care, but it is not at all obvious that that will happen with the proposed structural changes. We will have health economies: how will they work with consortia? These structural changes will not touch the trusts, including the acute and community trusts that were merged a few years ago. The local health groups will metamorphosise into local health boards, with no clear mechanism to deal with the trusts that are still in the community. There are grave concerns on the capacity for the new local health boards to undertake all that is asked of them, although the democratic element is welcome.

We will have 22 financial authorities, instead of five. Commissioning and providing will be carried out by the same authorities, and each will undermine the other—the same body commissioning will undermine its providing role, and as a provider it will undermine its commissioning role. We will have a strengthened, central NHS directorate in the Assembly. Will that be simpler and more accountable to patients? My colleagues in general practice ask me about primary care. GPs treat 90 per cent of patients, so where does primary care fit into these structural reforms? Will the consortia of local health boards be health authorities under another name, except with the glaring deficiency that—unlike the present health authorities—they will not be statutory and they will have ill-defined roles?

And, according to the NHS (Wales) Bill, the reallocation of resources through health authorities will kick in at the same time as we are abolishing those same health authorities. Is that joined-up thinking? No, it is too complex. It is far from simple for my patients and everybody else to understand.

**Brian Gibbons rose—**

**David Lloyd:** I am sorry, Brian, I have not got the time to take an intervention—have a coffee with me afterwards.

With all the talk of structures we must not be deflected from the core business of the NHS, which is treating patients. We need to refocus on the capacity to treat patients: beds, nurses and doctors. We need that refocus on the current level of funding, because the big picture shows that UK spending on health, at 7.6 per cent of gross domestic product, is less than the European average of 8.6 per cent of GDP. That means that we end up with half the European average number of beds and doctors, which is why the NHS is under immense pressure. We need to tackle the underlying health inequalities and the undercapacity in the system to deal with illness.

Let us not be deflected by talk of structural changes from the basic issue: that we need to treat more patients. Let us not lose track of an all-Wales commissioning body, nor of the core business of the NHS, which is to make our people's health better.

**Eleanor Burnham:** The Liberal Democrats commend the continued commitment to devolution, but there are a few, forgotten key areas that are crucial to the future of Wales.

Again the Government has failed with regard to environmental issues. Local government all over Wales has struggled to deal with waste in their communities. The Queen's Speech indicates only a vague intention of doing anything about the environmental

However, the Liberal Democrats believe that we still need an environmental responsibility and efficiency Bill to place clean energy and environmental standards at the heart of Government.

The second area where the Government has disappointed Wales is the growing transport problem. We are pleased that the draft legislation is in place to implement Lord Cullen's recommendations for rail safety. We welcome the changes that have been made to Railtrack since the Queen's Speech, but there is still more work to be done. Assembly Members who travel from north to south are testaments to this constant frustration. Public transport in Wales is still plagued by inefficiency and ineffectiveness. Customers want better value for money; they no longer want to be subject to appalling train delays, cancellations and insufficient connections between north and south, to which I referred. I welcome the fact that the Tory party has finally admitted that the privatisation policies were botched, and we especially welcome the change that has been made by the Labour Government in working to correct the problems with Railtrack.

The Queen's Speech also fails to mention the largest problem faced by Wales in the past year—the foot and mouth disease. The Liberal Democrats would have included an Ombudsman Bill to safeguard the rights of farmers and an agriculture bill to reduce regulatory burdens to reduce bureaucracy. We need a full public inquiry into the foot and mouth disease crisis to examine its effects and prevent future outbreaks. As Mike German indicated earlier, we will support the main motion. However, the Government cannot continue to ignore these key issues that are so important to Wales. It is our responsibility to concentrate on resolving these issues. The Government should be judged on its success in these areas.

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Thank you, Eleanor, for your succinct speech and those important points. I hope, David, that you will do the same.

**David Davies:** I will make one point. We have heard many worthy comments today about the health service from Members of all parties. However, we have not heard anything about the safety of NHS staff. Every year, doctors and nurses and other health workers suffer verbal and all too often, physical abuse as they go about their work. For too long, this has undermined the morale of a group of people who do a difficult and demanding job. It is also unfair on these who are forced indirectly to wait longer for treatment because of the actions of that small minority. A red card scheme is being implemented in England, which balances the duty to provide healthcare with an obligation to protect doctors and nurses from unacceptable behaviour. The scheme in England is being endorsed by health authorities, by those working in the health service and by the Prime Minister. Nothing is being done in Wales. The safety of NHS staff must be of paramount concern to political leaders, whether in Westminster or Cardiff. It is disappointing that there was nothing about this in the Queen's Speech. I urge the Secretary of State for Wales to take this matter on board and ensure that in future Queen's speeches, reference is made to this and something is done to protect NHS staff from the unacceptable behaviour of a small minority.

**Lorraine Barrett:** The most important Bill that a Government publishes is probably the Finance Bill to enact the measures contained in the budget. That Bill will enact the changes in the taxation regime needed to fund public spending and to ensure proper management of the economy. In this Labour-led Assembly, we have seen the importance of sound financial management of the economy and we have also seen the benefits. We know how important budget and finance decisions are for Wales. Let us not forget that the July 2000 spending review was excellent news for Wales. The increases in public

The failings of the present arrangement, as Ieuan Wyn Jones said, are becoming increasingly obvious. To have effective government you must be able to move through the stages, from policy development to legislation and then action. That is how to deal with the bread-and-butter issues that John Griffiths mentioned. This is not a constitutional dream, but effective government. If you want to achieve your objectives, you must be able to act in such a way. The pattern that we currently have makes that tremendously difficult. It is complex and one is continuously hindered by lack of powers.

On education, I noted in Paul Murphy's original statement that there could be a specific education Bill for Wales. I would like to know whether that is still a possibility, and if not, why not. We as a party welcome some of the elements in the Government of Wales document 'The Learning Country'; for example, the fact that it rejects specialist schools. I hope that the Government of Wales will persevere in that, even though the legislation would allow for such schools, if the Government were to change its mind. However, the paper is far from being a comprehensive programme for reforming the education system. That would require changing the institutional pattern that we have. The danger is that we might miss the boat in terms of other changes. And when will the boat pass by again? This again emphasises the need for a Bill on full legislative powers.

On the Communications Bill, here is an important opportunity for the Government of Wales to show that it can influence. First, it is vital that Wales has representation on the new regulatory body, the Office of Communications—Ofcom. Secondly, it is important that the legislation insists that Welsh programming is included in the requirements placed on the new commercial companies that will be established. We must ensure that they are broadcast during the

**Alun Pugh:** I will focus on health issues. No-one in my party is complacent about the state of the NHS in Wales. The solution is in three parts. It is partially about structures, and I support my colleague, Jane Hutt, in her plans to streamline NHS management and make it more local. This is also about money and capacity. Lorraine Barrett is correct, the extra money that Welsh Labour is putting into the health service in next year's budget will have a big impact on improved services for patients. It is particularly good to see that money providing increased training capacity at both ends of Wales. Staff shortages are a concern in many parts of Wales and we must increase the supply of trained labour to match the increased labour demands arising from increased budgets.

We know that poor housing causes poor health. We know that the rising levels of obesity in Wales are a serious cause for concern. We know that the binge drinking culture among our young people—which is not replicated in other parts of the European Union—results in a wholly unnecessary strain on our emergency services: the police and the ambulance service.

However, the lifestyle factor that has the

popular hours. That is key. It is a test of Jenny Randerson as Minister for Culture. My great hope is that she passes that test. It would be preferable that we secured those programmes, rather than reproaching her were she to fail. It is an important test and we will hopefully concentrate on that issue.

greatest impact on our nation is smoking. Smoking kills 7,000 people every year in Wales. That is equivalent to the entire population of Abergele. Medical evidence tells us that deaths from smoking are unevenly distributed in Wales and that smoking disproportionately kills the poor and the unskilled. Smoking is the primary cause of health inequality in Wales. My party, which more than any other party in this Assembly is concerned with inequality in society, needs to take account of that.

I am pleased to see the commitment to ban tobacco advertising in this parliament. It cannot come too quickly. We can learn a great deal from the examples of devolved Governments around the world in this matter. In California and New South Wales, for example, there are controls on smoking in public places. These safeguard non-smoking employees and the public from the well-documented risks of passive smoking. The Governments also provide practical support to those trying to kick the habit.

There is also an opportunity for Members to scrutinise other Bills—not simply those that relate to Wales. Don Touhig, the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, and myself will always attend such Committee sessions if we can.

**Glyn Davies:** I want to make an intervention on principle. However, I listened to what you said. Do you agree that if the Assembly is to make an effective and timely input, we must establish procedures to ensure that the Assembly is involved in discussing these Bills before they are published? If we do not do that, then it will be too late to make a contribution. Our consideration of the Queen's Speech today is too late for it to make a significant difference. There must be some procedure to enable us to discuss these issues earlier. Something must be done here, and at Westminster, so that we can work together on Bills before they are published.

**The Secretary of State for Wales:** There is much merit in that. The NHS (Wales) Bill, for example, will come forward in draft form so that the Assembly can deal with it. Where there are clauses relating to Wales in other Bills, there is a difficulty in the Assembly discussing them before the Bills are published. The fact that he mentioned public services and the importance of devolution in his speech was particularly welcome. In addition, the importance of the Assembly was underlined by the fact that the Prime Minister chose, quite rightly, to refer to the events of 11 September and the Government's determination to deal with terrorism in three different ways—humanitarian, diplomatic and military. I believe that everybody in the Assembly agrees that we will not tolerate any excuses for racism in Wales. This is not a war against Islam. I am glad, for example, that John referred to the number of Muslims in his constituency. That is replicated in other constituencies in Wales. Rhodri, and other Ministers, have done their best to ensure that we consider the Muslim communities as a part of the Welsh community.

Inevitably, parts of the legislative programme in the House of Commons have been affected by the events of 11 September. We have had to bring forward legislation to deal with terrorism and that has had an impact on the legislative programme. I am grateful to all parties in the House of Commons, which are supporting our actions on terrorism. I will mention one or two points in relation to that, since, when I was here before, those measures were not before the House of Commons or the Assembly. As far as terrorism is concerned, the measures are aimed at ensuring that terrorists cannot shelter behind our British legal system. They also allow us to stem the flow of terrorist funding and improve international co-operation in the fight against terrorism. As you know, a small number of people have quite wrongly sought to associate terrorism with the Islamic community. This legislation will extend the existing incitement law to deal with this. There are many other issues in

the Bill that will deal with terrorism. I will write to the Presiding Officer and the First Minister with the details of that legislation so that Assembly Members are aware of it.

Another issue, which several Members have touched on today, is foot and mouth disease, and the crisis that Wales has faced in relation to it, particularly in Powys and Anglesey, as well as in other parts of Wales. That is why, on 31 October, a Bill proposing amendments to the Animal Health Act 1981 was introduced. The Bill will ensure that we can deal with new cases of foot and mouth disease effectively, and can take action to eradicate scrapie from the national sheep flock. We need to ensure that we have the key powers necessary to stamp out foot and mouth disease, including the power to go onto farms, to test and to slaughter animals, and to slaughter animals on contiguous premises. It also deals with poor bio-security on infected premises, since that poses a real risk to other farmers. That is unacceptable and such irresponsibility will be penalised by the withholding of 75 per cent of compensation. The majority of farmers take great care, and will receive the same compensation as before. At present, the national scrapie plan is a voluntary arrangement for breeding resistance to transmissible spongiform encephalopathies into the national flock. Sheep breeders support it, but we need to be certain that it will be carried forward as quickly as possible. That is important for producers as well as for consumers.

Carwyn and his officials have been heavily involved in and fully consulted on this legislation so that the Assembly's interests are protected. Several Members have raised the issue, and Plaid Cymru has tabled an amendment on it. Elin Jones said that further powers on animal health should be given to the Assembly. We are aware of the arguments for this. Carwyn and others have talked about these matters. The necessary consultation will take some time, and the legislation needs to be in place quickly. As Rhodri mentioned, any such transfer can be done by a transfer of functions Order, which I would introduce to the House of Commons. I will convey the Assembly's views on this to Margaret Beckett when I return to London.

Many Members are concerned about asylum seekers, and the Assembly has raised the issue many times. Members will be aware that David Blunkett has announced a radical and fundamental reform of policy. That will involve revision of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 to create a more streamlined appeal process. Other measures include a three-tier structure of induction, accommodation and reporting; fast-track removal or integration. People will be accommodated in appropriate centres during that process. Vouchers will be replaced by autumn 2002 and all needs will be met by the accommodation centres. I am told by Jeff Rooker that the issue concerning Cardiff prison will be resolved by the end of the year. There will be much focus on the successful integration of those who are granted refugee status. We will issue a White Paper discussing whether there should be language and educational requirements for citizenship. I know that the Assembly is interested in that.

In the time remaining, I will respond to points raised by Assembly Members. The leader of the opposition, Ieuan, raised several interesting points, some of which I agree with and some of which I do not. At the beginning of his speech, he stated that he was disappointed that some Bills had not been included in the programme. As a former Member of the House of Commons, he understands that it is not always possible to include every Bill in every session. This is only the beginning of our four or five-term year of office in Parliament.

Ieuan raised the issue of free personal care for the elderly, as did Mike, and tobacco advertising, as did Alun Pugh. I am conscious that Jane Hutt has announced measures on free nursing care for the people of Wales. I believe that that is a generous package. However, the Government does not believe that making personal care free for everyone would be the most effective targeting of resources. Making personal care free for everyone including those cared for at home carries a huge cost, both now and in the

future. We do not believe that it would necessarily improve services. The system of care for older people should be based on the principles of quality, choice and fairness. We are not convinced that providing free personal care to all would advance those principles.

As I said, Ieuan also raised the issue of tobacco advertising. Ieuan and others will be aware that Lord Clement-Jones, a Liberal Democrat, introduced the Tobacco Advertising and Promotion Bill as a private member's Bill in the House of Lords on 11 July. The second reading of that Bill was held on 2 November. The Government's manifesto commitment is to reintroduce the Bill during the lifetime of the current Parliament. Lord Clement-Jones's Bill replicates the words of the Government Bill that fell. Its principles are supported. I am keeping the Assembly Cabinet informed of its progress, as I know the importance that the Assembly attaches to it.

I do not agree with Ieuan's more controversial comments on the major difference that he believes exists between Labour in the Government in London and in the Assembly in Wales. Our values are essentially the same, but the way in which we arrive at those goals may be different. That is devolution. That is what people voted for. I believe that, as long as the health service is free at the point of care, Aneurin Bevan would have agreed that change is necessary. This may include changes in structure and changes in how we deal with certain illnesses because of the advance of technology and the fact that people are living longer. The test as to whether people wanted to see a modernisation of public services according to our proposals took place at the general election, where people overwhelmingly supported the Government's view.

Mike also mentioned some of the above issues. He stated that the Government has changed its view on many issues. We have listened to common sense and to other people, as well as Liberal Democrat politicians. He said that he believed this was good. At the end of the day, people voted for

He knows that my party agrees with the euro in principle but that five tests must be applied. We are considering them at present.

**Helen Mary Jones:** You mentioned the opportunity to use England and Wales Bills as and when the occasion arises. Is there primary legislation to deal with the new Railtrack situation, and if so, might it be possible to use that to reconsider the Assembly's powers in relation to the railways? It has been a priority for the Minister for Environment, the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee and for the whole Assembly to seek more powers in relation to the Strategic Rail Authority. Therefore, if there is to be primary legislation in relation to Railtrack, would it be possible to consider our powers in relation to the SRA at the same time?

**The Secretary of State for Wales:** The Assembly has made its position clear on that, and I hope that if Sue raises it with me, I can take the matter to Stephen Byers.

Regarding the other issues raised by Nick—and I can see that I am running out of time—of course countryside issues are important. There are currently three inquiries into these issues. Legislation is not always the best way to deal with countryside problems. I accept his point on enterprise, but there are developments on regulatory impact. On making St David's Day a public holiday, this is still under consideration. Rhodri replied to a question earlier, and mentioned some of the complexities involved in it.

Alison referred to the proposals to modernise the health service in Wales, and I welcome her support for the Police Bill, and the Proceeds of Crime Bill, which will establish a Criminal Assets Recovery Agency. I have

I am grateful for his remarks on Northern Ireland, and I hope that matters will improve there. I covered the question on the NHS (Wales) Bill, except for the fact that the changes he mentioned will be in the form of clauses, not amendments, and we will have the Bill soon. John Griffiths referred to 'bread and butter issues'. I agree with him, as such matters are also important to my constituents. He also spoke about the block grant, which we welcome. He also referred to the St Francis of Assisi School, which not only educated me, but the Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Wales also.

Dai Lloyd referred to the health service. I have discussed tobacco and free personal care. It is up to the Assembly to decide how it wants to structure the national health service in Wales and it has the powers to do that. Eleanor Burnham referred to Lord Cullen and to Railtrack. I agree that the rail privatisation was botched. I remind her that Wales has a farming ombudsman and an independent appeals panel.

David Davies also referred to the national health service and I agree with his points about danger to NHS staff. I will take that back to Westminster. Lorraine Barrett referred to the comprehensive spending review, which underlines much of what the Assembly does. If you do not have the money, then you cannot implement policies to improve the lives of people in Wales. That is important.

I have already mentioned the referendum, but Cynog Dafis also referred to the difference between the Labour Party in Wales—Welsh Labour if you like—and the Labour Party in

the United Kingdom. I repeat that our values are the same, although how we achieve our goals can differ.

Finally, Alun Pugh referred again to the national health service. Many Assembly Members referred to the health service, which shows—and I return to the point made by the Prime Minister in the Assembly last week—that public services are very important to the people of Wales. The Westminster Government and the Assembly must make improving the health and education of the people of Wales one of our highest priorities. I wish the National Assembly well in its deliberations in the coming months. The Assembly and the House of Commons jointly provide services that will improve the quality of life of the 3 million people living in Wales, whom we are privileged to represent.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Nac ydywf, oherwydd maent yn trafod materion eraill hefyd. Problem Plaid Cymru yw ei bod yn pigo ar yr un grachen drwy'r amser ac yn anwybyddu materion eraill.

yn y Deyrnas Unedig. Ategaf fod ein gwerthoedd yr un peth, er y gall y ffordd y cyflawnwn ein nodau fod yn wahanol.

Yn olaf, cyfeiriodd Alun Pugh hefyd at y gwasanaeth iechyd gwladol. Cyfeiriodd sawl Aelod o'r Cynulliad at y gwasanaeth iechyd, sy'n dangos—a dychwelaf at y pwyt a wnaeth y Prif Weinidog yn y Cynulliad yr wythnos diwethaf—fod gwasanaethau cyhoeddus yn bwysig iawn i bobl Cymru. Rhaid i Lywodraeth San Steffan a'r Cynulliad sicrhau bod gwella iechyd ac addysg pobl Cymru yn un o'n blaenoriaethau pwysicaf. **The First Minister:** Before replying to the debate, I would first like to come to an agreement with Plaid Cymru, and especially Ieuan Wyn Jones and Elin Jones, as regards our definition of amendment 13, which states that the constitutional settlement is inadequate, and amendment 15, which we will support because we can deliver on it within the settlement. I believe that I touched a nerve when I said that Plaid Cymru's interest in the constitutional settlement amounts to an obsession. Working within the settlement is not an obsession. We support that. We have already begun discussions on transferring powers on animal diseases from Westminster to the Assembly. That is working within, and not outside the settlement. I do not consider that to be an obsession.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** Are you therefore saying that those members in your party who agree that the powers of the Assembly should be strengthened, and the Liberal Democrats, who also agree with that, are also obsessed?

**The First Minister:** No, because they also discuss other matters. Plaid Cymru's problem is that it is constantly picking at the same sore, and ignoring other matters.

**The First Minister:** What is also important—

**Brian Hancock** *rose—*

**The First Minister:** I have no time to give way, sorry. There is good news on animal health. The European Commission's standing veterinary committee has agreed to the lifting of the ban on lamb exports referred to earlier for those counties without problems in the current foot and mouth disease outbreak. That includes mainland north Wales and Dyfed, I believe. It is an important development today.

I am pleased with David Trimble's re-election as First Minister of the Northern Ireland Assembly. I am sure that all in this Assembly wish him well, following the recent problems in getting the devolution roadshow back off the ground.

I apologise to David Melding for any confusion that I may have shown earlier, by not being clear in my mind about health bills. The England and Wales NHS Reform and Decentralisation Bill will set up local health boards and wind-up the health authorities, and the draft NHS (Wales) Bill will deal with other matters, such as the continuation of community health councils' functions. I apologise to the Assembly for not being as clear as I should have been.

Nick also raised important points on the absence of measures dealing with rural matters. The rural matters I referred to were the market failures in agriculture that have occurred since the BSE problem. A market failure cannot be wiped away by legislation. There must be a strategy on how to rebuild Welsh agriculture—legislation has little to do with it. It is important that we continue to ensure that we work as well as we can with our colleagues in Westminster, and with the Secretary of State, in order to be as constructive as possible in terms of expanding the areas where we can help to improve public service delivery. The Queen's Speech offers us a huge opportunity to do that.

Similarly, we are getting ready for the proposals to be continued in next year's Queen's Speech, which will cover the period leading up to the election for Assembly Members. Therefore, I recommend that the voting be carried out as I suggested in my opening speech.
