**Questions to the Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language**

**Consultation Cancellation (Revised Condition of Grants)**

**Q1 Janet Ryder:** What are the reasons for cancelling the consultation process on revised condition of grants that was due to take place in January/February 2003? (OAQ23627)

**C1 Janet Ryder:** Beth yw'r rhesymau am ganslo'r broses ymgynghori ynghylch yr amodau grantiau diwygiedig, y bwriadwyd ei chynnal ym mis Ionawr/Chwefror 2003? (OAQ23627)

**The Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language (Jenny Randerson):** The Arts Council of Wales consulted the arts umbrella bodies and used feedback from individual revenue clients to establish the terms and conditions of the new funding schemes. The new funding schemes combine Assembly and lottery funding streams, and are designed to simplify and streamline the council's processes. The conditions have not changed; they have just been combined for the first time.

**Janet Ryder:** I am sure that you know that the way in which the arts council introduced its new conditions of grant has caused considerable confusion and discontent within the sector, not to mention delays in the funding process. Many of the arts council's revenue clients have still not received their grant offer letters. This has led to the genuine possibility of redundancies and cancelled performances by some companies. As the Minister with responsibility for this area, can you give an assurance that this will not happen?

**Jenny Randerson:** At this morning's Culture Committee meeting, coincidentally, Peter Tyndall, the chief executive of the arts council answered questions on this issue. He agreed that the way in which the terms and conditions for new funding streams had been combined with a letter and documentation could have been introduced more clearly. Work is being done on that issue, and he gave a commitment that the information on funding would be available to groups by 1 April—I believe that that is the date that he gave. **Y Gweinidog dros Ddiwylliant, Chwaraeon a'r Gymraeg (Jenny Randerson):** Ymgynghorodd Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru â chyrff ymbarél y celfyddydau a defnyddiodd adborth gan gleientiaid refeniu unigol i sefydlu termau ac amodau'r cynlluniau ariannu newydd. Mae'r cynlluniau ariannu newydd yn cyfuno ffrydiau ariannu'r Cynulliad a'r loteri, ac fe'u cynlluniwyd i symleiddio prosesau'r cyngor. **Janet Ryder:** Mae'n siŵr y gwyddoch bod y ffordd y cyflwynodd y cyngor celfyddydau ei amodau grant newydd wedi achosi cryn ddryswn ac anniddigrwydd o fewn y sector, heb sôn am oedi yn y broses ariannu. Mae llawer o gleientiaid refeniu cyngor y celfyddydau heb dderbyn eu llythyrau cynnig grant eto. Arweiniodd hyn at y posibilrwydd gwirioneddol y bydd diswyddiadau ac y bydd rhai cwmniau yn canslo perfformiadau. Fel y Gweinidog sy'n gyfrifol am y maes hwn, a allwch roi sicrwydd na fydd hyn yn digwydd?

**Jenny Randerson:** Yng nghyfarfod y Pwyllgor Diwylliant y bore hwn, fel mae'n digwydd, atebodd Peter Tyndall, prif weithredwr cyngor y celfyddydau, gwestiynau ar y mater hwn. Cytunodd y gallai'r ffordd y cafodd y termau ac amodau ar gyfer y ffrydiau ariannu newydd eu cyfuno gyda llythyr a dogfennaeth fod wedi bod yn gliriach. Gwneir gwaith ar y mater hwnnw, a rhoddodd ymrwymiad y byddai'r wybodaeth am ariannu ar gael i grwpiau erbyn 1 Ebrill—credaf mai dyna oedd y dyddiad a roddodd. Ni ddylai diswyddiadau fod yn ystyriaeth.

redundancies. The arts council has had a massive uplift in its funding; revenue clients, and other applicants, should not fear problems at this time.

**Glyn Davies:** Arts council grants can be a complicated and controversial issue. At this morning's Committee meeting, the chair of the Arts Council of Wales referred to two occasions when the council and the Minister had been in dispute with regard to responsibility for awarding grants. What were those two examples?

**Jenny Randerson:** I am not aware of any dispute with the arts council with regard to the conditions of awarding grants to specific organisations. There has never been a formal dispute or anything other than the usual flow of information which exists with a body such as the arts council. I stress that the new funding streams simplify the situation for the future—from 43 different funding streams to 11. That is a considerable simplification.

**Glyn Davies:** Gall grantiau cyngor y celfyddydau fod yn bwnc cymhleth ac yn bwnc llosg. Yng nghyfarfod y Pwyllgor y bore hwn, cyfeiriodd cadeirydd Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru at ddau achlysur lle bu anghydfod rhwng y cyngor a'r Gweinidog ynglŷn â'r cyfrifoldeb dros ddyfarnu grantiau. Beth oedd y ddwy enghraift honno?

**Jenny Randerson:** Nid wyf yn ymwybodol o unrhyw anghydfod gyda chyngor y celfyddydau ynglŷn ag amodau dyfarnu grantiau i sefydliadau penodol. Ni chafwyd anghydfod ffurfiol erioed nac unrhyw beth ar wahân i'r llif arferol o wybodaeth sy'n rhedeg rhngom a chorff fel cyngor y celfyddydau. Pwysleisiaf fod y ffrydiau ariannu newydd yn symleiddio'r sefyllfa ar gyfer y dyfodol—o 43 o ffrydiau ariannu gwahanol i 11. Mae hynny'n symleiddiad sylwedol.

### **Hyrwyddo Chwaraeon Lleiafrifol Promoting Minority Sports**

**Q2 Brian Hancock:** What steps is the Minister taking to promote minority sports in Wales? (OAQ23615)

**C2 Brian Hancock:** Pa gamau y mae'r Gweinidog yn eu cymryd i hyrwyddo chwaraeon lleiafrifol yng Nghymru? (OAQ23615)

**Jenny Randerson:** The Welsh Assembly Government continues to work closely with the Sports Council for Wales to help to promote minority sports in Wales. The sports council is this year funding 57 governing bodies and the Elite Cymru scheme, to support athletes across a wide range of sports.

**Jenny Randerson:** Mae Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yn parhau i weithio'n agos â Chyngor Chwaraeon Cymru i helpu i hyrwyddo chwaraeon lleiafrifol yng Nghymru. Mae'r cyngor chwaraeon eleni yn ariannu 57 o gyrrf llywodraethu a chynllun Elite Cymru, i gefnogi athletwyr ar draws ystod eang o chwaraeon.

**Brian Hancock:** As chair of the Newport Harriers Athletics Club, I know of the problems of finding coaches, trainers and officials to promote the sport. This situation is replicated with other sports throughout Wales, particularly netball and basketball in Cardiff and Newport. Will you consider schemes to allow individual coaches and trainers to access training in order to better promote their sports, even if that only means

**Brian Hancock:** Fel cadeirydd clwb athletau Newport Harriers, gwn am y problemau o geisio dod o hyd i hyfforddwyr a swyddogion i hyrwyddo chwaraeon. Efelychir y sefyllfa hon mewn chwaraeon eraill ledled Cymru, yn arbennig pêl-rwyd a phêl-fasged yng Nghaerdydd a Chasnewydd. A ystyriwch gynlluniau i alluogi hyfforddwyr unigol i gael hyfforddiant er mwyn hyrwyddo eu chwaraeon yn well, hyd yn oed os yw hynny

paying for the time that they must take off from work?

**Jenny Randerson:** You have raised an important issue if we are to develop all kinds of sports in Wales. We already have the Coach Cymru scheme, which has awarded £25,200 in the last financial year to support athletics coaches. I am awaiting firm proposals from the sports council for a considerable expansion of the support for coaching in all sports in Wales. That funding is earmarked for coaching in 2003-04. I will release the money after I have received the detailed proposals.

**Alun Pugh:** Minister, rock-climbing is a minority sport but safety levels are quite high. Climbers share the mountains with walkers who sometimes get themselves into difficulties. Can you give us a report of yesterday's meeting with the Wales Outdoor Activities Forum?

**Jenny Randerson:** The meeting did not take place yesterday. My diary is so full that I cannot recall when it did take place, but it was as recent as the end of last week. I can give you positive information. The forum has produced an excellent report, which is on time and has firm proposals. I thank all of the forum's members for their work. I have made an additional £40,000 available to fund its proposals. They will include the provision of improved weather forecasts for leisure users and mountaineers. We will also fund other aspects of the work, such as more noticeboards and so on. Other partners are involved, such as the Wales Tourist Board, which has produced a valuable leaflet on safety.

**Jenny Randerson:** Yr ydych wedi codi mater pwysig os ydym am ddatblygu pob math o chwaraeon yng Nghymru. Mae gennym y cynllun Coach Cymru eisoes, y dyfarnwyd £25,200 iddo yn y flwyddyn ariannol ddiwethaf i gefnogi hyfforddwyr athletau. Yr wyf yn aros am gynigion pendant gan y cyngor chwaraeon i ehangu'r cymorth hyfforddi yn sylwedol i bob math o chwaraeon yng Nghymru. Clustnodwyd yr arian hwnnw ar gyfer hyfforddi yn 2003-04. **Jenny Randerson:** Ni chynhaliwyd y cyfarfod ddoe. Mae fy nyddiadur mor llawn fel na allaf gofio pryd y'i cynhaliwyd, ond yr oedd mor ddiweddar â diwedd yr wythnos diwethaf. Gallaf roi gwybodaeth gadarnhaol ichi. Cynhyrchodd y fforwm adroddiad rhagorol, mewn da bryd ac mae'n cynnwys cynigion pendant. Diolchaf i bob aelod o'r fforwm am eu gwaith. Yr wyf wedi sicrhau bod £40,000 ychwanegol ar gael i ariannu ei gynigion. Byddant yn cynnwys darparu gwell rhagolygon y tywydd i ddefnyddwyr hamdden a mynyddwyr. Byddwn hefyd yn ariannu agweddau eraill ar y gwaith, megis mwy o hysbysyrrddau ac ati. Mae partneriaid eraill yn gysylltiedig â hyn, megis Bwrdd Croeso Cymru, sydd wedi cynhyrchu taflen werthfawr ar ddiogelwch.

## Hyrwyddo a Marchnata Treftadaeth Cymru Promoting and Marketing Welsh Heritage

**Q3 Brian Hancock:** Will the Minister make a statement on how the cultural Assembly sponsored public bodies are promoting and marketing Welsh heritage? (OAQ23614)

**C3 Brian Hancock:** A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ynghylch sut mae'r cyrff cyhoeddus diwylliannol a noddir gan y Cynulliad yn hyrwyddo ac yn marchnata treftadaeth Cymru? (OAQ23614)

**Jenny Randerson:** All cultural Assembly sponsored public bodies within my portfolio promote and market Welsh heritage as part of their functions. In addition, other bodies funded by the Assembly Government such as the Wales Tourist Board, Cadw, the Council of Museums in Wales and the Welsh Books Council have an important role to play.

**Brian Hancock:** Welsh heritage comes in a number of guises, for example, the former Navigation Colliery site at Crumlin, which has grade II\* listed buildings. I want to bring it back into use as an economic development unit, for start-ups, and as a skills and communications centre. Our waterways and canals are also part of our heritage—

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. You have had the benefit of two questions today. I do not think that we need a speech as well as a supplementary.

**Brian Hancock:** Minister, what steps are you taking to protect and develop the heritage of Wales, bearing in mind the consultative strategy document ‘Waterways for Wales’?

**Jenny Randerson:** As you know, Brian, this is not one of my responsibilities; it is not in my portfolio. For your information, Cadw has offered a grant of £45,000 towards the emergency repairs to four of the five main structures at Navigation Colliery in Crumlin in order to ensure that the buildings are wind and weather proof. Cadw has also had discussions with the site owner, the Welsh Development Agency and the local authority about future options for the site. The local authority is pursuing a possible way forward and the Assembly Government is keeping a watching brief. You should refer your question on waterways to my colleague, Sue Essex.

**David Melding:** Minister, one way of commemorating our magnificent heritage is to erect more statues. Do you not agree with me that Iolo Morganwg, the greatest Welshman in the Romantic movement, deserves to be commemorated by a major statue?

**Jenny Randerson:** Mae pob corff cyhoeddus diwylliannol a noddir gan y Cynulliad sydd o fewn fy mhortffolio yn hyrwyddo ac yn marchnata treftadaeth Cymru fel rhan o'u swyddogaethau. Yn ogystal, mae gan gyrrif eraill a noddir gan Lywodraeth y Cynulliad megis Bwrdd Croeso Cymru, Cadw, y Cyngor Amgueddfeydd yng Nghymru a Chyngor Llyfrau Cymru rôl bwysig i'w chwarae.

**Brian Hancock:** Mae sawl gwedd ar dreftadaeth Cymru, er enghraift, hen safle Glofa Navigation yng Nghrymlyn, sydd yn adeilad rhestredig gradd II\*. Yr wyf am ei adfer i'w ddefnyddio fel uned ddatblygu economaidd, i fusnesau newydd, ac fel canolfan sgiliau a chyfathrebu. Mae ein dyfrffyrdd a'n camlesi hefyd yn rhan o'n treftadaeth—

**Y Llywydd:** Trefn. Yr ydych wedi cael y faint o ddau gwestiwn heddiw. Ni chredaf fod angen arraith arnom yn ogystal â chwestiwn atodol.

**Brian Hancock:** Weinidog, pa gamau yr ydych yn eu cymryd i ddiogelu a datblygu treftadaeth Cymru, gan ystyried y ddogfen strategol ymgynghorol ‘Dyfrffyrdd Cymru’?

**Jenny Randerson:** Fel y gwyddoch, Brian nid yw hyn yn un o'm cyfrifoldebau i; nid yw o fewn fy mhortffolio. Er gwybodaeth, mae Cadw wedi cynnig grant gwerth £45,000 tuag at y gost o wneud atgyweiriadau brys i bedwar o blith y pump prif adeilad yng Nglofa Navigation yng Nghrymlyn er mwyn eu diogelu rhag y gwynt a'r tywydd. Cafodd Cadw drafodaethau hefyd â phercheneg y safle, Awdurdod Datblygu Cymru a'r awdurdod lleol ynghylch yr opsiynau ar gyfer dyfodol y safle. Mae'r awdurdod lleol yn mynd ar drywydd ffordd bosibl ymlaen ac mae Llywodraeth y Cynulliad yn cadw llygad ar bethau. Dylech gyfeirio eich cwestiwn ar ddyfrffyrdd at fy nghyd-weinidog, Sue Essex.

**David Melding:** Weinidog, un ffordd o goffáu ein treftadaeth wych yw codi mwy o gerfluniau. Oni chytunwch â mi y dylid coffáu Iolo Morganwg, y Cymro mwyaf yn y mudiad Rhamantaidd, â cherflun mawr?

**Jenny Randerson:** I would not wish to raise one of our forefathers above another. It is important that we acknowledge that we should have more public art. The Arts Council of Wales is working on a strategy on this. ‘Creative Future’ contains a commitment that that work will be done. We need to develop an ethos in Wales of celebrating our past and doing so in the very best style and presentation of the present and the future.

**Jenny Randerson:** Ni fyddwn am ddyrchafu un o'n cyndeidai yn uwch nag un arall. Mae'n bwysig ein bod yn cydnabod y dylem gael mwy o gelf gyhoeddus. Mae Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru yn gweithio ar strategaeth ynglŷn â hyn. Mae ‘Cymru Greadigol’ yn cynnwys ymrwymiad y cyflawnir y gwaith hwnnw. Rhaid inni ddatblygu ethos yng Nghymru o ddathlu ein gorffennol a gwneud hynny yn y ffordd orau osibl o gyflwyno'r presennol a'r dyfodol.

### Rhwysterau o ran Cymryd Rhan mewn Chwaraeon Barriers to Participation in Sport

**Q4 Ann Jones:** Will the Minister make a statement on overcoming the barriers to participation in sport experienced by people in the most deprived communities of Wales? (OAQ23637)

**Jenny Randerson:** The Welsh Assembly Government, working alongside the Sports Council for Wales, is fully committed to providing sporting opportunities for all. For example, the social inclusion in sport initiative, aimed at supporting the development of local sport projects, encourages participation and significantly improves access to sport for those in deprived communities in Wales.

**Ann Jones:** I hope that you agree that everyone deserves access to the best sporting opportunities. Sport has an important role to play in meeting national health targets, for example, and in improving quality of life. It can be effective in community regeneration and in cutting down on the rate of youth offending. I recently visited a get hooked on fishing initiative, which takes those likely to be young offenders and channels that ‘entrepreneurship’ into another direction. Do you agree that it is vital that we ensure that children in our most deprived communities can benefit from experiences that children in many other areas take for granted?

**Jenny Randerson:** I agree wholeheartedly. The link with health and community regeneration is important. It is important for

**Jenny Randerson:** Mewn cydweithrediad â Chyngor Chwaraeon Cymru, mae Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yn gwbl ymrwymedig i ddarparu cyfleoedd chwaraeon i bawb. Er enghraifft, mae'r fenter cynhwysiant cymdeithasol mewn chwaraeon, a anelir at gefnogi datblygu prosiectau chwaraeon lleol, yn annog pobl i gymryd rhan ac yn gwella'n sylweddol fynediad i chwaraeon i'r rhai hynny mewn cymunedau difreintiedig yng Nghymru.

**Ann Jones:** Gobeithiaf y cytunwch fod pawb yn haeddu'r cyfle i fanteisio ar y cyfleoedd chwaraeon gorau. Mae rôl arbennig gan chwaraeon o ran cyflawni targedau iechyd cenedlaethol, er enghraifft, ac i wella ansawdd bywyd. Gall fod yn effeithiol o ran adfywio cymunedau a lleihau troseddu ymhlið ieuencid. Yn ddiweddar ymwelais â menter bachu ar bysgota, sy'n derbyn ieuencid sy'n debygol o drosedu ac yn sianelu'r 'entrepreneuriaeth' honno i gyfeiriad arall. A gytunwch ei bod yn hollbwysig ein bod yn sicrhau bod plant yn ein cymunedau mwyaf difreintiedig yn gallu elwa ar brofiadau y mae plant mewn llawer o ardaloedd eraill yn eu cymryd yn ganiataol?

**Jenny Randerson:** Cytunaf yn llwyr. Mae'r ddolen gyswilt rhwng iechyd ac adfywio cymunedau yn bwysig. Mae'n bwysig i'r

the whole community, not just young people, because older people find groups of children hanging around street corners during the holidays, for example, intimidating, although their fears are not always justified. Therefore, the swimming initiative that is being piloted this Easter in 10 local authorities in Wales is important and I hope that all 22 local authorities will be involved in the initiative by the summer. To give an example, Ynys Môn local authority is not only providing swimming free of charge, but is providing buses so that children from deprived communities can access the swimming pools.

**Gareth Jones:** Un o'r anawsterau mwyaf mewn nifer o'n cymunedau, yn enwedig y rhai difreintiedig, yw'r diffyg strategaeth leol i hyrwyddo chwaraeon, drwy adeiladau canolfannau chwaraeon neu byllau nofio, er enghraifft. **Jenny Randerson:** When we are talking about large infrastructure projects—and swimming pools are expensive—it is important that work is done in partnership. The community may know what it wants and needs, but it is dependent upon outside funding, which is normally, although not exclusively, provided by the Sports Council for Wales. There are often vigorous discussions as a result of that process, but the sports council can bring its professional expertise to bear, and the local authorities can provide the local knowledge, and one hopes that, as a result, we will have a good range of swimming pools and other such large projects that require a strategic approach, throughout Wales.

**Gareth Jones:** One of the greatest difficulties in many of our communities, especially the deprived ones, is the absence of a local strategy to promote sport, through building sports centres or swimming pools, for example. Who should be responsible for planning provision, bearing in mind that individuals in the community often do not have the money to pay professional consultants to plan on their behalf?

**Jenny Randerson:** Pan fyddwn yn siarad am brosiectau seilwaith mawr—ac mae pyllau nofio yn ddrud—mae'n bwysig y gwneir y gwaith mewn partneriaeth. Efallai y gŵyr y gymuned beth yr hoffai ei gael a beth sydd ei angen arni, ond dibynna hyn ar arian o'r tu allan, a ddarperir fel arfer, er nid yn gyfan gwbl, gan Gyngor Chwaraeon Cymru. Yn aml ceir trafodaethau brwd o ganlyniad i'r broses honno, ond gall y cyngor chwaraeon ddefnyddio ei arbenigedd proffesiynol, a gall yr awdurdodau lleol ddarparu'r wybodaeth leol, a'r gobaith yw, o ganlyniad, y bydd gennym ystod dda o byllau nofio a phrosiectau mawr eraill sydd angen ymagwedd strategol ledled Cymru.

**C5 Janet Davies:** Sut y mae'r Gweinidog yn cefnogi grwpiau mam a'i phlentyn mewn ardaloedd lle y siaredir Cymraeg yn bennaf, er mwyn annog defnydd o'r iaith yn y cartref? (OAQ23612)

**Jenny Randerson:** The Assembly Government supports Cylchoedd Ti a Fi—mother and toddler groups—through Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin and the Welsh Language Board. Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin development officers and group leaders provide support to parents to further develop their child's linguistic ability outside the Ti a Fi groups. This funding will increase by 30 per cent in 2003-04 to over £1 million. The pioneering Twf project also works with Ti a Fi groups to highlight the advantages of raising children bilingually.

**Janet Davies:** The scheme could cause problems for small mother and toddler groups that operate in the private or charity sector. Can you give a commitment to supporting such small groups, which are crucial to some Welsh-speaking villages?

**Jenny Randerson:** The approach taken by the Welsh Assembly Government is not exclusive. For example, the Twf project works with Sure Start and Wales Pre-School Playgroups Association as well as Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin. Those three groups should cover every type of group in existence. Please write to me with details of a specific example that causes you concern and I will raise it with the Welsh Language Board to see if we can ensure that funding is distributed as fairly, evenly and widely as possible because the ultimate aim is to ensure that children are given early exposure to the Welsh language, however that is achieved.

**Kirsty Williams:** Parents like me who can only speak English, but who want their children to be bilingual, rely on the availability of Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin groups. However, you may be aware that the meithrin groups in my hometown of Brecon, and in Builth Wells, are severely threatened by the lack of available and suitable premises. What can you do to alleviate the situation? Will your officials meet with representatives of those groups and the Welsh Language Board to consider what can be done to ensure that there is meithrin provision available in the south of Brecon and Radnorshire?

**Jenny Randerson:** Cefnogir Cylchoedd Ti a Fi—grwpiau mam a phlentyn—gan Lywodraeth y Cynulliad, drwy'r Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin a Bwrdd yr Iaith Gymraeg. Mae swyddogion datblygu ac arweinwyr grwpiau Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin yn rhoi cymorth i rieni i ddatblygu gallu ieithyddol eu plentyn ymhellach y tu allan i'r grwpiau Ti a Fi. Yn ystod 2003-04 bydd yr arian hwn yn cynyddu 30 y cant i fwy na £1 miliwn. Mae'r prosiect arloesol Twf hefyd yn gweithio â grwpiau Ti a Fi i amlygu'r manteision o fagu plant yn ddwyieithog.

**Janet Davies:** Gallai'r cynllun greu problemau i grwpiau bach mam a'i phlentyn sy'n gweithredu yn y sectorau preifat neu elusennol. A wnewch chi ymrwymo i gefnogi grwpiau bach o'r fath, sy'n hanfodol i rai pentrefi Cymraeg eu hiaith?

**Jenny Randerson:** Nid yw ymagwedd Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yn anghynhwysol. Er enghraifft, mae'r prosiect Twf yn cydweithio â Chychwyn Cadarn a Chymdeithas Cylchoedd Chwarae Cyn-ysgol Cymru yn ogystal â Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin. Dylai'r tri grŵp hyn gwmpasu pob math o grŵp sy'n bodoli ar hyn o bryd. Ysgrifennwch ataf â manylion o enghraifft benodol sy'n peri gofid ichi ac fe'i codaf gyda Bwrdd yr Iaith Gymraeg er mwyn sicrhau y dosberthir yr arian mor deg, mor gyfartal ac mor eang â phosibl oherwydd ein nod yn y pen draw yw sicrhau bod plant yn cael eu cyflwyno i'r iaith Gymraeg yn gynnar, sut bynnag y cyflawnir hynny.

**Kirsty Williams:** Mae rhieni fel fi sy'n uniaith Saesneg, ond sydd am i'w plant fod yn ddwyieithog, yn dibynnu ar argaeledd grwpiau fel Mudiad Ysgolion Meithrin. Fodd bynnag, efallai y gwyddoch fod y grwpiau meithrin o dan fygythiad mawr yn y dref lle yr wyf yn byw sef Aberhonddu, ac yn Llanfair-ym-Muallt oherwydd prinder adeiladau addas. Beth allwch chi ei wneud i wella'r sefyllfa? A wnaiff eich swyddogion gyfarfod â chynrychiolwyr y grwpiau hynny a Bwrdd yr Iaith Gymraeg er mwyn ystyried beth y gellir ei wneud i sicrhau bod darpariaeth feithrin ar gael yn ne Brycheiniog a Sir Faesyfed?

**Jenny Randerson:** You raised this with me last summer, and I hoped that the additional funding coming through from the beginning of April would address the problem. I will ask officials to contact the Welsh Language Board, which I am sure will be happy to meet with you and representatives of the relevant groups to ensure that those problems are tackled, if not in the coming funding year, perhaps in future planning rounds.

**Jenny Randerson:** Codasoch hyn gyda mi yr haf diwethaf, a gobeithiai y byddai'r arian ychwanegol a fydd ar gael o ddechrau Ebrill yn datrys y broblem. **Jenny Randerson:** I have not been formally approached by either governing body to discuss this matter, but I am aware that it is a priority for these two major sports in Wales.

**Dafydd Wigley:** Will you join with me in wishing Mark Hughes and his team every success on Saturday? Given that neither the Welsh Rugby Union nor the Football Association of Wales are cash-rich bodies and that both urgently need a training centre for their national teams, will you take a proactive role to get both bodies together to make progress for the benefit of both our national teams?

**Jenny Randerson:** I wish our team well, and I will be in the stadium on Saturday. I eagerly anticipate a tenth victory in a row. There is eminent common sense in the two bodies sharing a training facility. That is a potential opportunity. However, a planning application has been submitted in relation to the rugby training facility, which means that I cannot discuss specific proposals. However, in terms of future direction, it is essential for the Assembly Government to do all that it can to encourage both sports to work together.

**David Ian Jones:** Do you agree that Wales's oldest and finest football club, Wrexham

**Q6 Dafydd Wigley:** What discussions has the Minister had with the Welsh Rugby Union and the Football Association of Wales with regard to providing a training centre for their international teams? (OAQ23613)

**Jenny Randerson:** I thought that the next speaker would suggest a possible home. We have not reached the basic principle of the idea yet, let alone discussing potential sites. I have visited Wrexham football club, which provides excellent facilities.

**Jenny Randerson:** The National Museums and Galleries of Wales's final report and recommendations following its consultation exercise on the future display of its art collections will be completed later this year. I look forward to receiving the museum's report and will consider its recommendations carefully in the context of future budget funding rounds.

**C7 Peter Black:** A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ynghylch ei dulliau o hyrwyddo arddangos celf fodern o Gymru ar draws Cymru? (OAQ23640)

**Jenny Randerson:** Caiff adroddiad ac argymhellion terfynol Amgueddfeydd ac Orielau Cenedlaethol Cymru yn dilyn ei ymgynghoriad ar arddangos ei gasgliadau celf yn y dyfodol eu cwlhau yn ddiweddarach eleni. Edrychaf ymlaen at dderbyn adroddiad yr amgueddfa a byddaf yn ystyried ei argymhellion yn ofalus yng nghyd-destun cylchoedd ariannu'r gyllideb yn y dyfodol.

**Peter Black:** Will you acknowledge the need for a home for Welsh modern art in Wales? In addition, following the outcome of the national museum's investigations, will you consider basing the permanent home of Welsh modern art outside Cardiff, in order to spread the benefits of that kind of display around Wales?

**Jenny Randerson:** The national museum is doing a great deal of work, and is in close consultation with the Arts Council of Wales, on the issue of displaying art. That work involves the plotting of a long and complex strategic process over the next couple of years, during which sites, costings and funding routes will be compared. However, it is important to consider the short term, as

**Peter Black:** A wnewch chi gydnabod bod angen cartref ar gyfer celf fodern o Gymru yng Nghymru? That gallery was displaying pictures which had been in the national museum a few months previously. That kind of example must be spread throughout Wales, and in the longer term, we must consider an iconic national gallery building for modern art.

**Phil Williams:** Bearing in mind the timescale of the national museum's report, will the Assembly Government make a commitment, in principle, to establishing some form of national gallery, which is adequate to display the wealth of modern art in Wales, in time to influence the final choice of the Cultural Capital of Europe 2008?

**Jenny Randerson:** The national museum's timescale means that a final decision will not be made for some years. It has not yet completed the basic work on costs and location. The proposal has been made in principle, but the museum has not yet made a decision on its own set of proposals.

**Lorraine Barrett:** After speaking to many artists, it is obvious that there is some dispute as to what constitutes modern art. Does the Minister agree that it is important to promote Welsh art in its many forms, regardless of whether or not it is modern?

**Jenny Randerson:** I did not want to take issue with Peter as to whether he meant modern art, contemporary art, Welsh art, Welsh modern art or modern art in Wales. That constituted a lengthy part of the national museum's consultation process. We could have an interesting academic debate on this subject, but this is not the right place for it.

**David Davies:** Various works of ancient and modern Welsh art are currently held in storage by the national art gallery. Rather than allowing them to languish in basements or on the office walls of one or two lucky

**Datblygu Gwledig ym Mrycheiniog a Sir Faesyfed**  
**Rural Development in Brecon and Radnorshire**

**Q1 Kirsty Williams:** What has been achieved in terms of rural development in Brecon and Radnorshire since the establishment of the partnership Government? (OAQ23600)

**The Deputy First Minister and Minister for Rural Development and Wales Abroad (Michael German):** The partnership Government has introduced a wide range of measures, which will help to promote sustainable rural communities, including those in Brecon and Radnorshire. These include support for agriculture and food processing and measures to help broaden the rural economy and tackle social exclusion in the countryside. This morning, I met representatives of the first nine successful rural community action partnerships under the 'Rural Community Action—Gweithredu Dros Gymunedau Gwledig' strategy. One of the successful partnerships covers Powys.

**C1 Kirsty Williams:** Beth a gyflawnwyd ym maes datblygu gwledig ym Mrycheiniog a Sir Faesyfed ers sefydlu'r Llywodraeth bartneriaeth? (OAQ23600)

**Y Dirprwy Brif Weinidog a'r Gweinidog dros Ddatblygu Gwledig a Chymru Dramor (Michael German):** Cyflwynodd y Llywodraeth bartneriaeth amrywiaeth eang o fesurau, a fydd o gymorth i hybu cymunedau gwledig cynaliadwy, gan gynnwys y rhai ym Mrycheiniog a Sir Faesyfed. Mae'r rhain yn cynnwys cymorth ar gyfer amaethyddiaeth a phrosesu bwyd a mesurau i helpu i ehangu'r economi wledig a mynd i'r afael ag allgáu cymdeithasol yng nghefn gwlad. Cyfarfum y bore yma â chynrychiolwyr naw o'r partneriaethau gweithredu dros gymunedau gwledig llwyddiannus cyntaf o dan y strategaeth 'Rural Community Action—Gweithredu Dros Gymunedau Gwledig'. **Kirsty Williams:** I am glad that you are in a position to announce those grants today. Many groups in my constituency are concerned with community economic regeneration. What will be done in Powys to promote the work of those groups?

**Michael German:** The community partnership for Powys put forward a bid for £150,000 per year, for three years. I am

The Powys rural community action partnership could also use this money to match-fund structural funds. It can also bid for money from other Welsh Assembly Government funds such as the village facilities and amenities fund, the post offices development fund and, after 1 January 2004, article 33 money.

Gofynnaf y cwestiwn gan fod maniffesto'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn 1999 yn dweud y byddech o blaïd i'r Llywodraeth dalu'r costau hynny, ynghyd â chostau milfeddygol a gwaredu, fel mater o iechyd cyhoeddus, yn unol â'r hyn a welir mewn gwledydd Ewropeaidd eraill. A ydych wedi gwneud unrhyw beth ynghylch hyn neu a ydych wedi anghofio'n gyfan gwbl am yr ymrwymiad hwnnw?

**Michael German:** Thank you for that question—it was, of course, about a manifesto and not about the partnership Government programme. [Interruption.] There are a few issues in Plaid Cymru's manifesto that did not appear in a Government programme—I do not think that any of them did. On the meat hygiene service, as you know, there has been a reduction in the costs for small abattoirs and that is something that I welcome.

**Glyn Davies:** As farming jobs have been lost all over Wales in the last few years, one can only suppose that the same would apply in Brecon and Radnorshire. What are you doing to prevent the situation worsening, which it will do on 1 May, when the uncertainty and shambles of the new fallen stock regulations come into being? What are you doing to prevent that disaster from happening because, as far as I can see, you are doing nothing?

**Michael German:** Glyn, you have your opinion, but those in the industry know that

**Cynog Dafis:** What is your opinion regarding meeting the costs of meat inspection? I pose the question as the Liberal Democrat manifesto in 1999 stated that you would be in favour of the Government meeting those costs, as well as veterinary and disposal costs, as a matter of public health, as happens in other European countries. Have you done anything about this or have you completely forgotten about that commitment?

the Welsh Assembly Government has taken a strong lead in dealing with this issue. It has come forward with a proposal to part-fund a scheme—as you know, the law says that it cannot fully fund the scheme, and I am sure that you would not want the Assembly to break the law. The Government has said that it wants to engage the industry in order to find the other part of the funding. It has met with the industry and the ball now firmly lies in the court of others. The Assembly Government has done the right thing and has done the work on this matter.

**Q2 Eleanor Burnham:** Does the National Assembly have any provision to pay compensation to non-GM farmers for the contamination of their crops by genetically modified organisms? (OAQ23665)

**C2 Eleanor Burnham:** A oes gan y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol unrhyw ddarpariaeth i dalu iawndal i ffermwyr nad ydynt yn tyfu cnydau GM, os yw eu cnydau'n cael eu halogi gan organebau a addaswyd yn enetig? (OAQ23665)

**Michael German:** The Assembly's policy, as set out in the partnership agreement, 'Putting Wales First', is to operate the most restrictive policy possible, within the context of European Union legislation, on the future development of genetically modified crops in Wales. In relation to liability, I am awaiting the report of the independent Agriculture and Environment Biotechnology Commission, due to be published in May 2003, on issues of liability relating to genetically modified organisms. Specifically, it is considering whether the existing liability regime is sufficient, whether it needs revision, and whether there are other ways of addressing the issues raised. I will be considering the issue further in the light of the commission's report and ongoing EU negotiations in relation to wider environmental liability. However, my view, in principle, is that the polluter should pay.

**Michael German:** As I have said, the principle is that the polluter should pay. I believe that that is right. The issue of co-existence will, as I recently reported to the Assembly, come to the fore in the next six months. The commission has called a meeting of stakeholders across the European Union to discuss co-existence in late April 2003 and the Welsh Assembly Government will be represented at that. The stakeholder meeting will be held with the staff of the European Commissioner for Agriculture and Fisheries in order to try to find a way through these difficult issues.

Our policy is clear: we want the most restrictive policy possible, and liability should fall upon those who cause the trouble.

**Jocelyn Davies:** We are all aware that liability in relation to GM contamination is being decided at EU level. As you said, the Assembly's policy is clear: the polluter should pay. Will you give us your assurance that you will not support the UK line unless it fully protects our organic and conventional growers?

**Michael German:** It is always my intention to support the National Assembly's view. The Welsh Assembly Government has taken a strong stance, and it has found support in many quarters. At the moment, I understand that people have only seen a leaked copy of the document that the commission will be issuing. However, the document that I have seen puts far too much emphasis on economic aspects. We have to consider the purity of organic and other farm produce and protect the industry. The Assembly has taken

**William Graham:** In the hope that further documentation will not be lost, would you outline who it is that advises you on the safety of GM crops and current research in this controversial area?

**Michael German:** I have just reported to you that the Agriculture and Environmental Biotechnology Commission and the other scientific commissions of the UK Government advise us. We do not have a separate scientific facility in Wales, though there is scientific debate on this in Wales, which is part of the ongoing public debate on genetic modification. There was a recent conference at the Institute of Grassland and Environmental Research in Aberystwyth, which was very well attended and to which Welsh scientists contributed. We will take into account all three strands of the full public debate when it comes to a conclusion at the end of September.

### Tagio Defaid a Geifr Sheep and Goat Tagging

**Q3 David Davies:** Will the Minister make a statement on the new sheep and goat tagging procedures? (OAQ23599)

**Michael German:** The individual identification of sheep and goats comes into force on 1 April 2003. Farmers are required to individually identify all animals born on the holding from this date. They are also required to individually identify any animals born on the holding and not currently identified. These requirements apply equally to pet animals. However, these measures should not be confused with the European Commission's double tagging proposals.

**David Davies:** You seem to be adding to the confusion, Minister. Could you tell us briefly and simply whether all new-born sheep and goats born on a farm and not moved anywhere have to be tagged or not? Will they have to be tagged immediately? Will inspectors who find new-born lambs without tags be able to levy a fine on the farmer?

Since they are completely unworkable, do you condemn these proposals out of hand? When will you have an idea of what is forthcoming? I believe there are more regulations on the way on this matter. What will they mean for farmers and when are they likely to be introduced?

**Michael German:** I will take your last point first. The industry is generally in favour of the UK proposals. The difficulties lie in the European Union proposals. The industry, the UK Government and the Assembly Government find that there are severe practical difficulties in operating the EU proposals. That debate continues.

With respect to your first point, the regulation applies to lambs or kids born from 1 February 2003 onwards. The EU requirement is to identify the sheep and goats as soon as possible after birth. Farmers should therefore take the opportunity to identify animals when they are first gathered for routine procedures. They must be identified before leaving the holding on which they were born, or before their first birthday. That is the regulation that applies to them.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** Mae'r Gweinidog yn tanbrisio'r broblem drwy ddweud bod anawsterau ymarferol. Two fora have been held in Wales, one in Brecon on 11 March and the other in St Asaph on 24 March. Both were attended by the farming unions and

Double tagging would create huge problems for them. Does he intend to do more than just state that there is a problem, and will he ensure that these regulations are changed?

**Peter Rogers:** I listened to your remarks carefully, Minister. This is a bureaucratic decision taken in Brussels without any understanding of tagging ewes and lambs and without common sense. Is not traceability based on containing disease in this country? Given the outbreak of foot and mouth disease here, would it not be better for the European Union to put a greater emphasis on the British Government taking action to stop meat imports entering this country, to check at ports and to ensure that swill is properly prepared for animals? That would be a far better means of containing disease than traceability and tagging measures.

**Michael German:** I am grateful to you for your question. The European Union has not yet taken a decision on this, and we have an opportunity to make the position of the Welsh Assembly Government and the UK Government clear. It is wrong to say that the decision has been taken; it has not. That is why we have consulted on this matter and are taking the issues forward. On the matter of illegal meat imports, I will make a statement in my report to Committee next week. It is too complicated a matter to discuss at this stage in Plenary; it will be better that I give a detailed report on the recent Veterinary Laboratories Agency analysis to the Committee next week.

**Q4 Ann Jones:** What action has the Minister taken to ensure decent health and welfare standards for farm animals in Wales? (OAQ23595)

**C4 Ann Jones:** Pa gamau y mae'r Gweinidog wedi eu cymryd i sicrhau safonau iechyd a lles boddhaol ar gyfer anifeiliaid fferm yng Nghymru? (OAQ23595)

**Michael German:** In January, I launched a consultation document on the preparation of a comprehensive strategy for animal health and welfare, including farm and companion animals. A wide range of meetings is underway to develop the strategy, which we plan to publish later in 2003.

**Ann Jones:** I welcome the launch of that health and welfare strategy consultation document, which aims to build a shared vision with stakeholders and has a commitment to develop a sustainable future. The strategy has the potential to provide a clear direction for the development of future policies and the revision of existing measures. It could also increase the transparency of Government actions and be a mechanism to move towards better public information and advice. Do you agree that such an outcome can only be achieved if it is accompanied by clear target outcomes and a realistic timetable for their achievement?

**Michael German:** That is absolutely right. If you set an impossible target it will be missed. We are considering a 10-year period and over that time we hope to substantially raise the levels of animal health and welfare in Wales. That amount of time is necessary to allow people to adjust. However, setting out the direction in advance makes it clear that this will benefit everyone.

**David Davies:** Do you agree that, instead of implementing ever higher standards of health and welfare for animal rearing in Wales, we should ensure high standards of animal health and welfare across the whole of Europe? It is impossible for farmers in Wales to compete if we continue to allow meat that has not been reared to the same standards that we expect from our farmers to be imported.

**Michael German:** My remit does not run to managing the French, German and other EU members—[*Interruption.*] He said outside the United Kingdom. We continually consider the issue of a level playing field within the European Union. It is right that the European Union should impose standards across the

**Michael German:** My most recent discussion was with Tesco on Monday. The Welsh Development Agency's Food Directorate and the agri-food partnership are continuously pursuing opportunities on my behalf with all supermarkets in Wales to promote and encourage the supply of home-produced products.

**Michael German:** Fy nhrafodaeth ddiweddaraf oedd yr un gyda Tesco ddydd Llun. **Janet Ryder:** Supermarket chains often say that the barrier to using local produce is problems with the logistics of supply and of quantity and quality. What are you doing to overcome these problems, many of which are connected to road infrastructure and transport problems, in order to aid the industry for which you have responsibility and to develop a positive future for it?

**Janet Ryder:** Mae cwmniau archfarchnad yn aml yn datgan mai'r rhwystr rhag defnyddio cynnyrch lleol yw problemau gyda logisteg cyflenwi a maint ac ansawdd. **Michael German:** Consistency of supply and quality of supply are issues that vex supermarket chains. We need to be able to produce the product to time, in sufficient quantities, and to a consistent quality, and the Welsh Development Agency's Food Directorate is addressing this. I was pleased to note this week that eight of Wales's cheese manufacturers have formed a co-operative. That includes our largest manufacturer, South Caernarfon Creameries, as well as smaller cheese manufacturers in Wales. We hope that up to 40 manufacturers will join this co-operative so that we can work together to ensure that we achieve consistent standards. That must also happen across the

Do you agree that Wales produces some excellent food and that our future must lie in the development of a vigorous export market to distribute our produce to hundreds of millions of consumers outside Wales, in addition to the 3 million at home?

**Alun Pugh:** Mae Janet Ryder yn gywir: mae'n bwysig bod archfarchnadoedd lleol yn gwerthu danteithion lleol ac yr wyf yn siŵr ei bod yn gweld eisiau ei phwdin pys brodorol, a'i chwrw Newcastle. **Michael German:** The export market is crucial. Several months ago I met all of the consultants who promote Welsh food on our behalf across Europe. Their response to my question as to what more I can do in my role to assist the export of Welsh food products, was to say that more products are needed. We need variety, innovation, good packaging, and changes in design. Consistency and quality are the watch-words. I am pleased to tell you that the largest ever number of Welsh exhibitors attended the international food exhibition this week in London. The Welsh food awards have gone a long way to contributing to the successful development of Welsh products. I do not think that England has been as successful with its products.

**Michael German:** Mae'r farchnad allforio yn hollbwysig. Sawl mis yn ôl cyfarfûm â'r holl ymgynghorwyr sy'n hyrwyddo bwyd Cymru ar ein rhan ledled Ewrop. **David Ian Jones:** Do you agree that the 'Welsh-reared' logo is valuable and is a unique selling point for Welsh produce? In terms of logistics, do you agree that supermarkets should be commended for sourcing their meat and other products, as far as possible, from local suppliers? One such supermarket is Tesco at Llandudno Junction, which sources its Welsh lamb from Mr John Owen of Llwydfaen, Glan Conwy, whose farm is five miles away as the crow flies.

I hope that the ‘Wales: the True Taste’ awards, of which I spoke, will contribute to an increase in the amount of Welsh products being sourced by supermarkets in Wales and beyond, and ensure that its high quality is recognised. We have had considerable success in Wales, with small companies growing rapidly through the use of the ‘Wales: The True Taste’ logo.

#### Lleihau'r Bwlch Cyflog Narrowing the Pay Gap

**Q1 Ann Jones:** What assessment has the Minister made of the success of narrowing the pay gap between men and women in Wales? (OAQ23644)

**The Business Minister (Carwyn Jones):** The report ‘Wales Leads the Way: Close the Pay Gap Campaign’ was presented to the Committee on Equality of Opportunity on 20 March. This details and assesses the successful campaign to narrow the pay gap run by the Assembly in partnership with the Equal Opportunities Commission and the Wales Trades Union Congress over the past year.

**Ann Jones:** I recommend that report to everyone who is in employment or seeking employment; it is a way to tackle the scourge of unequal pay. We cannot allow the pay gap to continue for another generation. Do you agree that the only way to ensure that we do not stand still on this matter—or allow everyone else to catch up with us before we move ahead—is to have a committed budget line to ensure that campaigns such as that to promote equal pay continue in the next Assembly?

**Carwyn Jones:** Although it is not possible to make that commitment today, I agree with your point. It is not enough to run a year-long

**Q2 Ann Jones:** Will the Minister make a statement on the promotion of equal pay audits in Wales? (OAQ23645)

**Carwyn Jones:** The ‘close the pay gap’ campaign in Wales produced kits to deliver equal pay audits and promoted those kits through a series of events. You will be aware, Ann, that the Assembly has led the way and has won a Castle award for its pay audit.

**C2 Ann Jones:** A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar hyrwyddo archwiliadau cyflog cyfartal yng Nghymru? (OAQ23645)

**Carwyn Jones:** Cynhyrchodd yr ymgyrch ‘cau’r bwlch cyflog’ yng Nghymru becynnau i ddarparu archwiliadau cyflog cyfartal, a hyrwyddodd y pecynnau hynny drwy gyfres o ddigwyddiadau. Byddwch yn ymwybodol, Ann, fod y Cynulliad wedi arwain y ffordd ac wedi ennill gwobr Castle am ei archwiliad cyflog.

**Ann Jones:** The fight for equal pay is not over—we must keep on fighting. I thank you, Minister, for the excellent way in which you have carried this campaign forward. Do you agree that, although businesses prefer to take a voluntary route towards equal pay, we must work with them to ensure that they take up the kits and equal pay audits? We must take businesses with us and work with them to ensure equal pay across Wales. That should be done voluntarily, and in partnership with businesses, rather than being compulsory—unless that becomes necessary.

**Ann Jones:** Nid yw'r frwydr dros gyflog cyfartal drosodd—rhaid parhau i frwydro. Diolchaf i chi Weinidog, am y modd ardderchog yr ydych wedi datblygu'r ymgyrch hon. A gytunwch, er bod yn well gan fusnesau gymryd llwybr gwirfoddol tuag at gyflog cyfartal, fod yn rhaid inni weithio gyda hwy i sicrhau eu bod yn defnyddio'r pecynnau a'r archwiliadau cyflog cyfartal? Rhaid inni fynd â busnesau gyda ni a gweithio gyda hwy i sicrhau cyflog cyfartal ledled Cymru. Dylid gwneud hynny'n wirfoddol ac mewn partneriaeth â busnesau, yn hytrach na bod yn wirfoddol—oni fydd angen gwneud hynny.

**Carwyn Jones:** We must stick with the voluntary route at the moment. We have had some success in communicating the need for equal pay audits to local government, the health service and other public bodies in Wales. The private sector is a harder nut to crack. Some larger companies have shown interest and have conducted equal pay audits, but we have some way to go in terms of convincing small and medium-sized enterprises of the benefits of equal pay. Those benefits include a happier workforce that feels it is being treated fairly and equally. That work must continue. We acknowledge that there is still some way to go, but that should not be a disincentive to us.

**Carwyn Jones:** Rhaid inni lynn wrth y llwybr gwirfoddol am y tro. Cydnabyddwn fod rhywfaint o waith i'w wneud o hyd, ond ni ddylai hynny ein gwangalonni.

**Janet Ryder:** You seemed to imply that the Assembly has achieved some success with the NHS and local government in implementing equal pay audits. However, in a meeting of the Committee on Equality of Opportunity last week, the Welsh Local Government Association gave a presentation that clearly showed that local government—which, along with the health service, is the biggest employer of women in Wales—had not made progress on its equal pay audit. How will the Minister work proactively with local government to ensure that it undertakes these audits and can indicate to the Assembly what kind of financial burden it will face in delivering equal pay for the many women that it employs?

**Carwyn Jones:** The 'close the pay gap' campaign held a session for local government. That was primarily for officers, although some elected members were present. Like you, I heard what the WLGA's representatives said last week, and it caused me some concern. It is essential that pay audits are conducted. To cite financial problems as a reason for not conducting a pay audit is not a good excuse and could not be used in court. I encourage the WLGA to work with the Assembly and the Assembly Government so that we can find a way forward, in partnership, to ensure that more equal pay audits take place in local government.

**Carwyn Jones:** The website for the National Assembly has been extended and improved in recent years and its use is encouraged wherever appropriate in our publications and correspondence. The launch of the Assembly's publication scheme, in November 2002, was the latest step in

Do you also agree that, in order to improve participation in politics through the Assembly's website, we must address the 55 per cent of adults who, according to a recent Welsh Consumer Council survey, do not use the internet? Will you promise to work with the Minister for Economic Development to improve internet services and make broadband available across Wales?

**Carwyn Jones:** I will. The Minister for Economic Development has a passion for information technology, and I am sure that he is addressing this. The older a section of the population is, the less likely it is to use the internet and information technology. You are right that we now have a far more open and democratic system of government than we have ever had, and it is right that people should have as much access to information as possible.

**Phil Williams:** A gytunwch y byddai gwe-ddarlledu pob cyfarfod Pwyllgor a Chyfarfod Llawn, gan gynnwys hen gyfarfodydd Pwyllgor a Chyfarfodydd Llawn, yn rhoi'r mynediad gorau i bobl Cymru i waith y Cynulliad? **Carwyn Jones:** Gwnaf. Mae'r Gweinidog dros Ddatblygu Economaidd yn frwd am dechnoleg gwybodaeth, ac yr wyf yn siŵr ei fod yn mynd i'r afael â hyn. Po hynaf yw adran o'r boblogaeth, y lleiaf tebygol ydyw o ddefnyddio'r rhyngrwyd a thechnoleg gwybodaeth. **Phil Williams:** Do you agree that webcasting every Committee meeting and Plenary session, including previous Committee meetings and Plenary sessions, would provide the people of Wales with the best access to the Assembly's work? Do you also agree that it is important to have broadband throughout Wales to allow webcasting to provide an adequate standard of video information of the Assembly's meetings?

**Carwyn Jones:** On webcasting, the ISDN technology is not good enough at present for people to be able to watch anything for more than 10 or 15 minutes, because of some kind of time lag. I understand that the situation regarding broadband is different, and the Minister for Economic Development has carried out a great deal of work on extending broadband throughout Wales, although there is some way to go on that. However, we are doing well compared with some other parts of Britain.

**Brian Gibbons:** Nonetheless, Minister, do you agree that a stranger visiting the National Assembly website is unlikely to repeat that experience? The design of the website is counter-intuitive, and the search engine is hostile to yielding any useful answers. Do you believe that the website's design is crucial if we are to allow the Welsh public to engage with the Assembly's activities?

**Carwyn Jones:** I believe that I am right in saying that the website is a matter for the Presiding Office rather than the Government. However, as far as the Government is concerned, we will seek to promote as much openness as possible. I hope that your points on the website being difficult to access and hostile in answering questions are not aimed at any Minister.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. It might be helpful for me to indicate that I can only claim possession of the smallest possible part of the Assembly website.

**David Davies:** Minister, one sure-fire way to encourage more people to use the website is audience participation. Why not allow people to vote on Assembly projects, such as the £50 million allocated for a new building, or the £15 million allocated to reorganising the health service, or the millions of pounds allocated to what your own press officials call 'Welsh embassies'? I guarantee that, if you allow people to express an opinion on those and many other matters, many people from Monmouthshire would be quick to log on.

**Carwyn Jones:** That is what the people of Monmouthshire have told you. I am sorry that they deem you, as their elected representative, so inadequate that they want access to the Assembly themselves.

**The Presiding Officer:** Question 4 (OAQ23650) is withdrawn.

**Q5 Peter Black:** What guidance is the Welsh Assembly Government issuing to Assembly sponsored public bodies on advertising their meetings and opening them to the public? (OAQ23646)

**Carwyn Jones:** We encourage ASPBs to make their meetings open to the public wherever possible, and public notices frequently appear in the press about these meetings. However, many discussions by ASPB boards, particularly about commercially confidential or staff matters, need to be held in private.

**Peter Black:** Despite the many reforms that have been carried out through the ASPBs since the advent of the Assembly, most people are still ignorant of what they do, when they meet, and how they operate. Is it possible to evaluate whether a code could be drafted for ASPBs to consider how they could be more open and accessible to the public?

**Carwyn Jones:** Our ASPBs are required, where possible, to follow the approach to openness set out in our Code of Practice on Public Access to Information, and ASPB officials will receive training on our code and on implementing the Freedom of Information Act 2000. We expect ASPBs to follow the example that we have given.

**Glyn Davies:** Where your guidance indicates to ASPBs that they should be open to the public and that that should be maximised, will it also include the advice that they should make sufficient Welsh language translation equipment available for members of the public to use at meetings?

**Carwyn Jones:** It is good practice to make translation facilities available at meetings. They should also be adequate for the purpose otherwise there is little point of them being

It is not easy to set quantifiable and empirical targets for that, but the turnout at the forthcoming elections will be one indicator.

**David Melding:** Do you agree that when Ministers deny Assembly Members official documents, the matter should be referred to an independent source in order to assure that no abuse of practice is taking place? Do you also agree that the reformed office of an ombudsman would perhaps be suitable to deliver such a service?

**Carwyn Jones:** I am not aware that any such situation has arisen.

#### Strwythur ELWa yn y Difodol The Future Structure of ELWa

**Alun Cairns:** Will the Minister make a statement on the future structure of ELWa? (EAQ23911)

**The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson):** I notified the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee last year that Hugh Rawlings had completed his review of the senior staff structure of the component councils of ELWa. I indicated to the Committee, and to the chairs of the National Council for Education and Training and the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales, that I was minded to accept the recommendations. That had to be subject to

**Y Gweinidog Dros addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes (Jane Davidson):** Hysbysais y Pwyllgor Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes y llynedd bod Hugh Rawlings wedi cwbllhau ei adolygiad o strwythur staff uwch cynhorau cyfansoddol ELWa. the two councils working out the practical details for the way ahead. It remains important that HEFCW and the national council work together closely. Maintaining a continuum from further education to higher education has vital benefits for access and learning. However, the existing model of a joint secretariat for both councils is not well adapted to current needs. The range and scope of what the Assembly requires of the national council and HEFCW have grown vigorously and substantially since the inception of ELWa. It is essential that the councils are in a position to deliver. Pre-eminently, this means that the existing split responsibility at the most senior level will end. I have agreed with the councils that the full-time chief executive and finance director posts should now be put in place. Existing postholders have a legal right to opt for either council. I understand, although I have not received formal confirmation, that existing postholders will continue to serve the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales. As the employers, the councils will announce the specifics shortly.

**Alun Cairns:** ELWa is a £500 million quango that was created two years ago. There were no standing orders and no internal financial rules. There have been £2.2 million in irregular payments and an advance grant of £4 million that contravened Government accounting procedures. Some £1.5 million were transferred from the training budget to pay for redundancies. Four directors have been disciplined; there are suggestions of conflicts of interest in relation to the advance payment of £4 million, and now the need for an extra £3 million to prevent redundancies in April 2003. Is this not a sad indictment of the Minister that her management of ELWa, the biggest quango in Wales, has been wholly inadequate? Is the restructuring of ELWa at this time not awfully convenient, bearing in mind all those scandals for which she accepts no responsibility?

**Jane Davidson:** Being accused of restructuring ELWa ‘at this time’, as if there

**Alun Cairns:** Mae ELWa yn gwango £500 miliwn a grëwyd ddwy flynedd yn ôl. Nid oedd ganddo reolau sefydlog na rheolau ariannol mewnol. Gwnaed £2.2 miliwn o daliadau afreolaidd a rhoddyd grant ymlaen llaw o £4 miliwn a oedd yn groes i weithdrefnau cyfrifo’r Llywodraeth. Trosglwyddwyd rhyw £1.5 miliwn o’r gyllideb hyfforddi i dalu am daliadau colli swyddi. had been no precursor to this proposal, is extraordinary. I remind Members that I addressed this issue in a letter to members of the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee in July last year. In that letter, I stated that I would commission Hugh Rawlings to carry out a review. This followed the Committee's review of higher education in Wales, which had demonstrated that Assembly Members were interested in taking a much greater hands-on role in the delivery of the higher education agenda than had been envisaged when the education and training action group for Wales was established.

For that reason, it seemed right to review whether the structure of the ELWa national council and the ELWa HEFWC was appropriate to deliver the huge agenda of post-16 education and training and a huge agenda in the university sector, which was identified by the Committee. That letter was sent to Members in July, and I received no questions relating to it. In November, I gave a full report, which included the text of the Rawlings report identifying the issues, to Committee members, and I told Members 'at that time' that I was minded to accept the report's recommendations; Members did not comment. Is it not interesting that you comment now because you did not use the proper Assembly procedures in Committee? I was committed then to deliver this outcome. However, as I am not the statutory employer of the chief executive or of the finance director of either organisation, it then became a matter for the two councils as to whether they would deliver this agenda.

**Mick Bates:** We will all welcome the review, if you can then demonstrate a more effective delivery of our agenda. I want to highlight the effectiveness of the delivery so far in terms of ELWa's shortfall in the funding of post-16 education. How will this review improve the effectiveness of the delivery of that fund? On Monday night, I attended a meeting of a governing body at which it projected a £30,000 shortfall in its post-16 funding. If we are to split this responsibility, as the review suggests, we also need

assurances that the shortfall in Wales, which appears to be £10.9 million, will be met through implementing this review.

**Jane Davidson:** I am happy to comment on ELWa's delivery at both national council and higher education funding council levels. In the two years since ELWa was established, over 25,000 young people have started work-based learning; some 5,380 adults have begun work-based learning; more than 900 started the new modern skills diploma for adults, exceeding the target of 700; training need analyses for businesses was 70 per cent above target, with 1,329 businesses availing of those services, and there were 305 innovation development fund projects. That was in the first year. In the second year, the number of trainees in work-based learning was 14 per cent over target. The number of organisations that gained Investor in People recognition was 10 per cent above the target. The number of companies supported by workforce development was 5 per cent above the target. Learners from the poorest Welsh wards on work-based learning programmes have surpassed their target by 43 per cent, and learners on work-based learning programmes through the medium of Welsh have surpassed their target by 107 per cent. That is what ELWa has delivered. In terms of sixth-form funding for schools, specifically raised today, we are, and will continue to be, in dialogue with the Welsh Local Government Association and ELWa over funding for our schools.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** Minister, one major criticism of ELWa has been that a decision was taken—and we do not know where it was taken—over the new body having no shadow period. The recommendations of the original education and training action group for Wales, chaired by Peter Hain, and the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee, ably chaired by my colleague Cynog Dafis, were to secure a shadow period but, for some

Do you also accept that the reason for the difficulties in obtaining information from you is because you have consistently confused your role as an accountable Minister with the role of the National Audit Office and the Audit Committee? Their audit role is entirely separate, as was clarified in the Chamber yesterday. It would have been far better had you been open and transparent about your involvement with ELWa at an earlier date, to ensure that Assembly Members and the public were fully aware of which decisions you took in your capacity as Minister.

Do you accept that the National Audit Office's disclosure, subsequently considered by the Audit Committee, of financial irregularities—and they were irregularities—amounting to more than £2 million, is deeply embarrassing for the biggest quango in Wales? Do you also accept that the NAO's disclosure concerning the payment made to Avanti in relation to the Pop Factory is also deeply embarrassing, because substantial sums of money were clawed back? In relation to that project, do you accept that the information you have given me does not satisfy my request, made in my original question and in my point of order yesterday? The information I asked you to provide was that which ELWa gave you, upon which your submission was based. Do you agree that I should be given that information, and not what you have given me, which does not satisfy that Standing Order?

Minister, there is now no alternative but to split ELWa. Managerially, that seems to be the only sensible way forward. In your answer, I could find neither an acknowledgement that mistakes and errors were made, nor that you, as Minister, were accountable for those mistakes and errors, and that you should apologise accordingly.

**Jane Davidson:** Substantial preparatory work was completed before the council came into being on 1 April 2001. That preparatory work on the council started in November 2000, so there was a time between November and April before the council was fully established.

During ELWa's first year, it operated as 'business as usual'. It did not change any decisions of its forerunner organisations and carried out its responsibilities to ensure that business as usual was the watchword. It delivered that successfully.

On your second point, your allegations about openness are extraordinary. Let us look back at my actions in terms of my concerns about ELWa's procurement practices, and my reporting to the Committee. I reported the possible control failures concerning ELWa to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee on 22 May 2002. The chairman of the national council—ELWa wrote to us in March 2002 saying that she had commissioned an independent review, so that ELWa could give us correct and proper information about whether or not it was concerned. That review reported to the council in early May, following which I reported at the earliest possible opportunity, which was to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee on 22 May. At that time, I confirmed my intention to press ahead with a review by a senior Assembly official; this would overview what was happening and determine whether or not there was a problem that we needed to address. I wrote to the chairs of both ELWa councils at that time. On 26 June, when Adam Peat had completed his report, I conveyed that to the Committee. In July, I wrote to Committee members advising them that I had commissioned a review of ELWa's senior structure, to be conducted by Hugh Rawlings. I also wrote to the chairs of the ELWa councils at that time, enclosing the terms of the review. In November I reported to the Committee that the Auditor General would be reporting on procurement procedures. I also reported in November that I was minded to accept the Rawlings recommendations.

Therefore, there were many occasions on which Committee members could have questioned me about issues relating to ELWa. There is no point shaking your head, Ieuan. They could have done so. In looking back, I am sure that you are concerned that your Members did not take advantage of those opportunities. They could have taken advantage of the opportunity following my letter to all Committee members on the Rawlings review, when I reported on that review to Committee, or when I reported to the Committee on the Peat report.

The overall conclusion of the Peat report, as mentioned in the Auditor General's report, spelt out clearly that there were

'currently no evident weaknesses in the control environment within ELWa'.

That was as of July. Members must remember that we are discussing action that took place between April 2001 and March 2002. It was important for me to have confidence from a senior Assembly official that there were no problems in terms of the control environment.

Compliance with the control environment is clearly a different issue. We do not know yet what happened in terms of the Pop Factory. You speculate as to what happened, as do other Members, but the council is getting on with its job and is carrying out a proper investigation. When that investigation has been completed, we will know of the concerns and the measures that the council will take to address those concerns. You should ask Plaid Cymru Committee members why they did not question me on these matters over the five-month period during which I reported the issues to Committee.

On your last point, I have fully complied with the requirements of Standing Orders. I would have been happy to give you the brief given

The same Standing Order applies to the further information that you seek—the information is the responsibility of ELWa, which has not yet consented to its disclosure. I am in discussions with the national council on that. However, that is explicitly covered by the Standing Order. I state that clearly: I have fully complied with Standing Orders, I have always determined to be open with the Assembly and I will continue to do so.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. This is an urgent question, not a statement. Several Members have indicated that they wish to ask questions. I appeal for brief questions and answers.

**Ieuan Wyn Jones:** I want to clarify your response to my earlier question about this information. Are you saying that you accept that you have not yet provided all the information that I requested, in my question and in my point of order yesterday, because ELWa has not yet decided to release the submission that it gave to you?

When can we expect announcements about our plans as they would give a clear lead to land-based further education sectors, which do not currently know—

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. This is an urgent question on the structure of ELWa. Funding practice decisions do not arise from this question.

**Karen Sinclair:** ELWa's indecision causes many problems.

**The Presiding Officer:** That should be pursued with the Minister through other means.

**Jane Davidson:** You stated that members were entirely happy with what I was doing in Committee and yet all the questions over the past weeks have related to the information that I gave to the Committee over a period of five months. I confirm that I have never made a statement to the Committee about the Pop Factory because that was ELWa's responsibility and it was dealing with that. It only became a matter of concern for us in terms of proper governance and proper delivery of Government accounting rules when we were led to understand that rules set by the Assembly may have been breached.

The important issue for Members is that because good governance and proper procedures are in place, we can be certain of ensuring that organisations comply properly with public accounting rules. I am confident that what I have announced today, in terms of the separation of functions between the chief executive and finance directors of the two organisations, will enable us to deliver a greatly improved service in terms of the two huge education and lifelong learning agendas.

I will outline why we have tabled an amendment to increase the personal allowance from the proposed £17.80 to £20. All the parties here want to look at the funding of personal care. The Labour Party, the Liberal Democrats and Plaid Cymru have called for free personal care: we are calling for an inquiry by the Health and Social Services Committee. However, there is no doubt that, were we to raise the level of allowances and look at the rules and regulations that apply to various charging policies, we could go a long way towards exempting people from paying for personal care, especially those whose income is well below average. Although that is often the case, such people must still pay various charges. In this case, we are considering people in residential care. At present, the disregarded sum is £16.80. All personal expenditure in the week—on gifts, stationery, haircuts and so on—must come from that sum. The Minister proposes an increase of £1, which is considerably above inflation, and I welcome that. However, we should set

this allowance at a reasonable level. Setting it at £20 should be a first step. We should then look to raise it further, but given the amount of expenditure that would be required, I propose £20 initially. That would be a good start, though it would not finish the job. I call on the other parties to honour the commitments they have made in this regard and vote for our amendment.

**Kirsty Williams:** David is right that we need a wholesale review of these charges. The majority of Members accept the principle of free personal care as outlined by the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly. I am heartened because I know that many organisations representing the needs and views of older people acknowledge that, in accepting that principle, this Government has gone a long way. We do not have the powers of the Scottish Parliament, but David Melding is right: we cannot use that as an excuse to not move this agenda forward. We have power over these allowances, which gives us an opportunity to alleviate the cost of care for many people, who, as David said, are currently paying these costs out of limited resources.

I am glad that David acknowledged that the increase proposed today is well above inflation. I understand that, for the first time, we are breaking the link with England. Until now, we have always gone in train with England and our allowances have always been the same as in England. My understanding is that this allowance is more generous than those in England and Scotland. For the first time, the Assembly has decided to break that link and act independently in a way that recognises the needs of older people in Wales.

David is right to challenge us. I welcome the chance to debate the Liberal Democrats' proposals in this regard with David over the coming weeks. It is incumbent upon us to consider our personal stances. The Liberal Democrats' proposals go much further than this proposal and I welcome the opportunity to debate them with David over the coming weeks, and, hopefully, to take action when the Assembly returns on 2 May.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** On Kirsty Williams's comments, is it not strange that the Liberal Democrats say that they propose to go further than the amendment and yet they are not prepared to vote for it? If you were discussing this with rational people, you would expect them to vote for it, would you not?

**David Lloyd:** I am grateful for that intervention, which was enlightening, as always. We look forward to contributions from the Liberal Democrats in various hustings over the coming weeks. To cut to the chase—

**Glyn Davies:** Do you share my surprise that Rhodri Glyn Thomas was surprised that the Liberal Democrats should say two confusing things at the same time?

**David Lloyd:** That was a well-made point and I am sure that Rhodri Glyn has heard your comments and is suitably chastened. This is a modest increase. The cost benefit analysis shows that the increase would cost £1.8 million. This is about how we value our elderly people. I ask Members to vote in favour of the amendment.

**David Davies:** Presiding Officer, with your great political experience, you must be aware that it is the oldest rule in the political book to say that you will vote against a proposal because you want something better. The Liberal Democrats have done that today. They have the opportunity to join members of the Conservative Party and of Plaid Cymru to effect a real improvement in the quality of care for old people. The choice is theirs: vote

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** Electioneering was inevitable. I did not expect that we would get through the afternoon without it, and we have not. The Conservatives' amendment proposes that the allowance be increased to £20 per week, which is an increase of 19 per cent on the current year's allowance. No more people would benefit under the amendment's proposals than would benefit under the regulations that I have tabled, although it would mean that those who benefit would be better off. However, 19 per cent far exceeds what is allowed in the Assembly's budget for local government cost increases, and the £1.8 million additional cost would have to be found from other approved Assembly budgets to compensate local government. The regulations that I am proposing would increase the personal requirement allowance for 2003-04 by £1, from £16.80 to £17.80 a week. That is an increase of nearly 6 per cent, as David Melding has acknowledged, and is around one and a half times the rise in average earnings. That is a great step forward. This increase begins to mark out a different path for Wales, and is higher than the increase proposed in England. For the first time, as Kirsty said, the link with the allowance set by the Department for Work and Pensions will be broken. I commend these regulations to Members and will not support the amendment.

**David Lloyd:** I propose the following amendment in my name and the names of Jocelyn Davies and Geraint Davies. Amendment 1: in regulation 2(3) delete '£20,000' and insert '£25,000'.

Our amendment proposes to delete the £20,000 capital line and replace it with a £25,000 capital line. This is an annual debate; Members will recall that a similar debate was held this time last year. It follows on from the debate on personal allowances, and also tries to address the issue of free personal care for the elderly within the confines of the Assembly's powers. It is distressing when elderly people must sell their homes to fund their long-term residential and nursing care.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** Are we expecting another principled move by the Liberal Democrats? Will they go further and vote against the amendment this time?

**David Lloyd:** As always, I am pleased to receive an intervention from Rhodri Glyn. We await events.

Evidence presented to the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly showed that the current system demands that people of modest means make themselves poor before they are entitled to assistance from local authorities. Increasing the public subsidy by means of our amendment will give greater assistance to people in a complex and inconsistent system. Furthermore, research conducted by the Joseph Rowntree Foundation has shown that, in many cases, authorities do not monitor an individual's assets, so that many people may continue to be charged the full cost of care when they are entitled to some state help.

The National Assembly can further demonstrate its commitment to people in residential care today by adopting the Plaid Cymru recommendation. The capital limits are relatively low; even the sum proposed in our amendment—£25,000—is relatively low, bearing in mind the considerable increase in house prices in Wales over the last three or four years. The Minister's proposed increase

**Peter Black:** It seems that whatever the Government proposes, you are determined to try to trump it with a different figure. You refer to the rise in house prices. However, £25,000 would make little difference in that regard. If you are going to do this properly, do you not believe that you need to have a proper investigation and consider a much more substantial figure, such as £60,000?

**David Lloyd:** I am glad that you intervened at that point, Peter, because that is what the Minister said in reply to the debate on this a year ago. We have deferred to a proper study, by Professor David Bell of Stirling University, which acknowledged that many homes in Wales are of lower capital value than those elsewhere in the United Kingdom. There are proportionately more homeowners in low value homes in Wales, and therefore more homeowners would be unduly disadvantaged in Wales. That research is supposed to be ongoing. Therefore, your intervention is timely but, as a member of the Government, you should have been aware of that research.

What is your response to that commissioned policy review, Minister? Will we have another delaying tactic, as suggested by your colleague, Peter Black, or will we have a meaningful response? I agree that £25,000 is not a lot, but the Assembly does not have the relevant powers. Our proposal will cost £3.2 million. When we set this limit of £25,000 a year ago it was a third of the average house price in Wales of £75,000. That seemed to be a meaningful level when we researched this with Westminster colleagues. There would be room for manoeuvre, but it looks as if even this will be voted down. I am disappointed by that, because we are talking about justice for

**David Melding:** I am pleased that you have been able to call me, Presiding Officer. Much has been made of the fact that the Plaid Cymru amendment to this motion, and our amendment to the preceding motion, draws on the budget and will result in considerable extra expenditure. It has been suggested that these figures have been plucked from the air and have not been properly accounted for. However, when the Health and Social Services Committee considered the proposed budget, the opposition parties raised these points and informed the Minister that we would seek to make these amendments in Committee, which we did, and that we would then seek to make them in Plenary. Therefore, as far as we are concerned, if we had been in control of the budget as governing parties, we would have committed to increasing resources in order to implement these amendments.

I was interested to hear the Deputy Minister for Local Government say that a capital disregard of £60,000 would be more appropriate. That was announced with a great flurry at the Liberal Democrat conference in Swansea this weekend. I find it strange that they will have to wait a whole year, since these regulations are annual events, before they can attempt to put into place £60,000. Let me tell the Deputy Minister that £25,000 is closer to £60,000 than £20,000 is: I know that maths is not his forte. The amendment takes us closer to the Liberal Democrats policy, and it is strange that they will vote against it.

**Cynog Dafis:** I wonder, David, whether you are not being unfair. Lembit Öpik made an appeal for no-one to attack the Liberal Democrats at any time. They are obviously looking for an easy ride over the next month.

**David Melding:** They have announced all their policies. No wonder they do not want to be attacked. If I had to defend those policies,

It is better to do this properly, rather than approve a half-measure such as you are proposing today.

**David Melding:** If £25,000 is a half-measure, then the £20,000 that you are going to vote for is presumably an even lower estimate. You need to go on a logic course, though while we are talking about the Liberal Democrat manifesto, logic is not likely to be the prevailing principle. We support this amendment.

**Kirsty Williams:** Presiding Officer, I suspect that, had you called the Minister next and not allowed me to speak, I would have been accused of running scared of the comments from the political parties on either side of me. My colleagues must make the distinction between what you are able to put in a partnership agreement and what is the stated policy.

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. One at a time. We are all very excited about the election; probably more excited than the electorate.

**Kirsty Williams:** I suspect, Presiding Officer, that your observation is right. Hopefully, however, policies of that kind will ignite interest in what the National Assembly can do.

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** Dai's amendment proposes to raise the upper capital limit by a further £5,000, a total increase of 32 per cent on the current limit. This amendment came to Committee after the budget planning round. It had not been raised while the Health and Social Services Committee had the opportunity to express its views on the budget planning arrangements. The change would not exempt any more people from paying towards their care than is the case under the regulations that I have tabled.

**David Melding:** I thought the Minister would be gracious enough to acknowledge that I raised this when we looked at the budget initially. I told her that it would be a priority for the Welsh Conservative Party.

**Jane Hutt:** These are budget planning priority issues. We estimate that this would cost an additional £2.6 million; that is a total of around £3.2 million for local authority budgets. As you recognise, we would need to make good, as the Assembly has agreed upon the budget, the additional spend for local government through a special grant by adjusting other Assembly programmes to pay for it. It is true that part of the cost for local government would, in effect, replace the benefit of the attendance allowance, which ceases to be payable when people receive public funding towards their care. That is a substantial issue in terms of the changes that we want to make. Scotland found that to be true in terms of new free personal care arrangements. The regulations that I am proposing will mean increases of 4.3 per cent

and 5.3 per cent in the lower and upper capital limits respectively. That is well above inflation, as Dai recognised, is above the rise in average earnings, and is affordable within the Assembly's budget. It also allows for cost rises in local government expenditure. Therefore, the resulting capital limits will be higher than those enforced for 2003-04 in England and Scotland. That shows that we are marking out our own distinctive path in Wales.

In response to Dai, David and Kirsty, it is important that we examine ways of easing the pressure on people to sell their homes to pay for care. Studies are currently being undertaken to consider the details of the implications and costs involved in increasing the capital limits beyond those in the proposed regulations. We know that older people in Wales have relatively high levels of capital assets but low levels of income. The strategy group for older people is considering that. The regulations before the Assembly today will help people moving into care homes by allowing them, in certain circumstances, to make their own additional payments if they wish to be housed in more expensive accommodation than that usually funded by local authorities. The regulations also give more help to people who do not wish to sell their homes during their lifetime to pay for care by allowing local authorities to take a charge on their property. That is also a significant step forward, which we have not discussed today in terms of the regulations before us, but which will make a substantial difference to people in that situation. We are taking a distinctive path and the further research that has been commissioned will inform us in terms of future budget planning rounds.

they should be targeted at those with qualifications that are no higher than GSCE or NVQ level 2. However, we are concerned that that should not be set in stone. issue was commercially confidential, which we respected at the time.

The broader concern about ILAs is, given the mess that ELWa is making of so much else, whether the Minister is really confident that those systems are in place? Everyone has acknowledged, and is pleased, that the situation that arose in England did not arise here. We were extremely fortunate. I have little confidence that such a situation could be avoided this time—unless the Minister takes greater political responsibility for ensuring that robust systems are in place.

**Brian Gibbons:** One of the more attractive features of this is that there is no upper age limit for people eligible to apply under the ILA programme. Evidence gathering for the older people strategy in Wales found that a main criticism was that older people were being excluded from the opportunity of lifelong learning. The regulations appear not to impose an upper age limit. I want further assurance that those courses for which older people may use their ILAs will not be limited to those with a vocational bent. If older people want to engage in activities, which may be regarded as self-improvement in the most liberal sense of the word, I want confirmation that the ILA accounts will allow them to do so.

**The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson):** I know that you welcome the targeting of those on the lowest incomes and with the lowest qualifications, and that will remain under review. Sadly, however, the money that we have put in place now will not be enough to assist all those with low qualifications or low income over the next year, which is the period during which these regulations will apply.

I specified the relevant types of education and training in my statement to Members. All learning must be accredited by an external awarding body or meet standards determined by the Wales credit framework team. All courses must have clearly defined learning outcomes, level descriptors, learning hours and levels of tutor support. We are, therefore,

We are considering three levels of targeting: we will pay the full £200 to those on income support and who have learning lower than level 2; 80 per cent of course costs will be paid to those on working families tax credit, disabled person's tax credit, housing benefit or council tax benefit, whose learning is at level 2 or below; and we will pay 50 per cent of course costs, up to a value of £100, to the highest prior learning attainment of level 2 or below. Those are the three specified categories.

**Helen Mary Jones:** Will you clarify that? If too many applications are at the higher end, will people have to go on a waiting list? If more eligible people request individual learning accounts than there is money available to pay for, what system will be implemented? Will applicants have to wait, as people are having to wait for modern apprenticeships? What will happen?

**Jane Davidson:** We have allocated £2 million in this year's budget and over the next three years for individual learning accounts. Should they become so popular that we need to review the budget, we will do so in concert with ELWa. These accounts are focused on learners and on improving qualifications, which is key for all Assembly Members and not just the Welsh Assembly Government.

ELWa has run the individual learning accounts in Wales in an exemplary way. That is why we held on to individual learning accounts for longer than anywhere else in the UK. With a belt-and-braces approach—even in a climate of much mist and allegation—we are confident that the individual learning accounts are run in a robust fashion, which is down to ELWa. That means that we are

My audience at the launch was a group of older learners, who were all talking about the importance of such initiatives and looking forward to the results of the Assembly's commitment to lifelong learning for the future.

The supplementary budget takes on board adjustments to our resources as a result of the Chancellor of the Exchequer's pre-budget statement on 27 November last year. This is in addition to transfers to and from other Government departments, as well as changes within the budget itself and other changes of a technical nature.

As Members will know, this supplementary budget does not reflect the Chancellor's budget, which will not take place until 9 April this year. It will therefore be for the incoming Assembly Government to consider whether there is a need for an in-year motion to allocate any additional moneys for the forthcoming financial year.

Mae hyn yn ychwanegol at unrhyw gyllid a drosglwyddir rhwng adrannau eraill y Llywodraeth, yn ogystal â newidiadau yn y gyllideb ei hun a newidiadau eraill sy'n dechnegol eu natur.

Fel y gŵyr yr Aelodau, nid yw'r gyllideb atodol hon yn adlewyrchu cyllideb y Canghellor, na chaiff ei chynnal tan 9 Ebrill eleni. Felly Llywodraeth nesaf y Cynulliad fydd yn ystyried a oes angen cynnig mewnblywyddyn i ddyrrannu cyllid ychwanegol ar gyfer y flwyddyn ariannol i ddod.

In overall terms, the Assembly budget has been reduced by over £119 million for 2003-04, nearly £84 million for 2004-05 and over £78 million for 2005-06. Before anyone gets excited about that, this is a Treasury requirement. The reduction is of a technical nature, and involves resource budgeting.

Elsewhere, the main external transfers include the following. From the Department for Work and Pensions, there is a consequential of over £109 million for 2003-04, and, for the following two years, £122 million and nearly £132 million respectively. This is to cover the increased costs of pensions in the national health service. Also from the Department for Work and Pensions, will be a transfer of £23 million in 2003-04, rising to £27 million in 2005-06, for Supporting People. This funding has been classified as annually managed expenditure. In addition, small transfers from the Home Office in relation to Supporting People will be added to our departmental expenditure limit. Also in relation to the DWP, £8.8 million has gone the other way due to a transfer of the responsibility for providing funding to local authorities for the administration of council tax and housing benefit.

From the Home Office, over £2 million is to be transferred from 2003-04 to 2005-06 for prison healthcare. This is a provisional figure and is subject to review, given that a timetable for the full transfer of responsibility to the NHS in Wales has yet to be determined. There is also a net transfer out of nearly £13.5 million in relation to police funding, which reflects the curious triangular flow of resources between the Assembly, the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister and the Home Office in this regard.

**Edwina Hart:** O'r Adran Addysg a Sgiliau, ychwanegwyd addasiad canlyniadol o ryw £6.5 miliwn i'r gronfa wrth gefn ar gyfer 2003-04 mewn cysylltiad ag ymestyn hyfforddiant cyflogwyr. Gan droi at y gronfa wrth gefn ei hun, mae wedi gostwng tua £17

2003-04 since the final budget. This leaves £35.5 million in cash and nearly £55 million on a resource basis.

I highlight an additional £8 million for 2003-04 to support the objectives of 'Reaching Higher'. This follows the extensive consultation between the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning and higher education institutions over the winter months, as trailed in my draft budget announcement last autumn. Each financial year also sees a transfer of £4 million from the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales's capital to current expenditure lines to reflect a re-profiling of capital spending, which is, of course, cost-neutral to the reserve.

Other allocations from the reserve include over £5 million to cover the costs of Assembly sponsored public bodies pay remits and pensions and an additional £3 million to cover an expected shortfall in the provision in the additional costs of teachers' pensions. The same amount will be added to the deprivation fund and there will be £2 million for additional support to police authorities. Again these are all issues which have been trailed by Ministers in previous statements, so they will come as no surprise to Members. In terms of inter-main expenditure group transfers, £32 million has been returned to the revenue support grant for future years due to the decision to postpone the transfer of funding of nursing home care from local government. A further £15 million has been transferred to the revenue support grant to cover free home care and delayed transfers of care. There have been a series of transfers relating to programmes for children and young people, resulting in a total provision of over £40 million, £44 million and £52 million respectively in each of the next three years under the Cymorth banner. A similar exercise has been conducted in relation to the Education and Lifelong Learning MEG, where budget expenditure lines are being merged to provide greater transparency. For example, a number of lines are being merged into early years and pupil support, producing total funding of nearly £19 million next year.

Er enghraifft, unwyd nifer o linellau o dan flynyddoedd cynnar a chymorth i ddisgyblion, gan roi cyfanswm o

bron £19 miliwn y flwyddyn nesaf.

The tables circulated do not include the allocations coming from uncommitted carry-forward—end-year flexibility. That information will be provided during the course of the coming financial year. However, there is one exception that I should highlight, as the need to allocate funding is particularly urgent. In my final budget speech in November, I announced significant increases for the drug and alcohol treatment fund budget for the next three years of £18 million in total. I said at the time that I would continue to consider the availability and demand for treatment and address any shortages, which indicated a particular need to invest in the Rhondda.

As a result, we have now drafted a framework model for a project that draws together the whole range of substance misuse treatment services that I wish to be implemented in the Rhondda. The project will build treatment services to ensure that clients can assess the type of treatment that will deal most effectively with their particular problems, whether through counselling services, community detoxification, supervised methadone consumption or, in the most acute cases, in-patient detoxification services. To this end, I will set aside £500,000 for 2003-04 from underspends forecast from this year. Resources for future years will be made available when the project is fully developed, by which time I would expect up to 200 additional people a year to be able to access treatment services in the Rhondda. That would enable us to help all the people who are currently on the waiting list.

I hope that all the key stakeholders in the area will now rise to the challenge and work with the Assembly to take this project from the drawing board and make it a reality so that people in the Rhondda can begin to benefit from these services as soon as possible. All the information is before Members, and I commend the motion to the Assembly.

**Janet Ryder:** You have ended on a good

However, children's services and long-term care for the elderly seem to be losing out at a time when children's services in social services departments cannot cope with the changes demanded by the Waterhouse report and when long-term care for the elderly is in great demand.

The other disappointment was the failure to fund the report commissioned by the Government into properly funding the

On 15 October 2002, the Minister announced that extra finance would be available to build new hospitals, including one in Tenby. However, in the meeting in Tenby on Monday, I learned that a health centre without beds will be built rather than a hospital. Given that Edwina Hart refused to take an intervention, could you press her to ensure that the Government adheres to the commitment that it made on 15 October?

On local government, there is little comfort for people who are facing massive council tax rises. For those lucky enough to live in Plaid Cymru areas, council taxes are not increasing greatly. For those people who must pay high police precepts—

**David Davies:** Do you believe that council tax rises are a result of council policies, or a result of National Assembly funding for local authorities?

**Janet Ryder:** It is a mixture. We have maintained all along that the money that has been allocated to local government has not covered the massive increases in expenditure it has faced this year in particular. The Minister touched upon the issue of high police precepts. A consequence of the Westminster Government's policing policies is that Welsh police forces are losing money again, which is a big disappointment. However, the biggest disappointment over the last four years has been this Government's failure to invest in housing as the spur to the whole economy. Money has been invested into homelessness strategies among other issues, but perhaps the Minister should take the Chartered Institute of Housing's advice. We have an excellent housing strategy now and, as the institute states, the Minister should now put her budget where her strategy is. If we invested in housing as the key to the whole economy, every £1 spent on housing would be repaid in the economy three or four times over. That great opportunity has been missed.

On agriculture, why has the Minister for Rural Development seemingly allowed £2.4 million to be cut from the market support schemes, at a time when the industry is facing so many crises? Perhaps it has been

On education, we have been told time and again that we have had a good educational settlement this year and that schools have done well. Why, therefore, are the same schools telling us that there will be teacher redundancies? We will have to address that interesting question in the coming weeks. It seems that front-line services—children's services, services for the elderly, ambulance services, roads, agriculture, economic development and housing—all lose out in this budget, and the only gainers are the administrative staff of the new health boards.

**Alison Halford:** I will talk briefly about the Minister's budget and the top-slicing of £11 million from police funds. I am familiar with police budgets. The truth is that the Assembly funds the police, but has no control over how the money is spent. We have already given almost £0.5 billion to police coffers in Wales. The ordinary person in Wales would be horrified to learn that we cannot guarantee value for money. That is why the idea of the Assembly controlling our police is so popular. Most Assembly Members, Ministers and even the four chief constables are in favour of it. Unfortunately, the Home Office stoutly refuses to relinquish control, which is a pity. Police funding is a riddle wrapped in a mystery inside an enigma. The numerous and increasing funding streams are shrouded in secrecy. Have police funding issues been complicated for a reason? No-one knows who is accountable for what. That is why I firmly agree with the Minister that police funding should be more open and accountable. Topslicing £11 million on a promise from the Home Office that it will give us more money is daft. Will that really happen, or is it more sleight of hand by the Home Office?

Local people are being forced to pay more for their bobbies through the back door, and no-one is questioning it, apart from the Minister, who has realised that Wales is being disadvantaged. Why do we spend hundreds

of hours scrutinising the organisations that we fund, yet allow the police to be exempt from such scrutiny? It is silly, particularly as the police service does not come cheap. In my area, complaints abound about a lack of police cover, yet local contributions have risen by almost 200 per cent since 1997. This year, we will suffer a further 33 per cent increase. It is wrong that the Assembly cannot scrutinise how this money is spent. I accept that chief constables are responsible for the operational control of their forces, but are we not entitled to have some idea of what is spent on administrative costs?

Speaking from experience, police authorities are untouchable corporate bodies. They are loyal fan clubs of the chief constable and, usually, they meekly accept his or her reports, sometimes even verbally. It is sad that they do not have the ability to check the accuracy of what they are told. This corporate club frowns on members who dare to scrutinise the overweening power of the chief constable. Unless the Assembly controls police funding, it will never control the haphazard way in which some authorities are run. The time has come to ensure that policing is devolved. I accept that the Home Secretary tried to change the management style of the police and failed. However, in Edwina, we have a Minister who should be able to control devolved policing; at least then our budgets would be open and transparent. We would all be better for it.

**David Ian Jones:** The Conservative Party notes changes to the budget, much of which, as the Minister said, are administrative in nature, consisting of movements between main expenditure groups, some of which clearly eluded Janet Ryder.

Considerable resources are being channelled towards health expenditure, specifically to revenue expenditure for local health boards. If it could be guaranteed that such expenditure would result in more satisfactory patient outcomes, then it would be hard to criticise. However, we are not, even objectively, seeing such outcomes; waiting

Hyd nes y bo'r Cynulliad yn rheoli cyllid yr heddlu, ni fydd byth yn rheoli'r ffordd ar hap y caiff rhai awdurdodau eu rhedeg. Daeth yr amser i sierhau bod rheolaeth dros yr heddlu yn cael ei datganoli. Derbyniaf fod yr Ysgrifennydd Cartref wedi ceisio newid dulliau rheoli'r heddlu ac wedi methu. Fodd bynnag, mae Edwina yn Weinidog a ddylai fod yn gallu rheoli'r heddlu datganoledig; o leiaf byddai ein cyllidebau yn agored ac yn dryloyw wedyn. Byddai hynny yn fuddiol i bawb.

**David Ian Jones:** Noda'r Blaid Geidwadol y newidiadau i'r gyllideb, y mae llawer ohonynt, fel y dywedodd y Gweinidog, yn rhai gweinyddol, sy'n cynnwys symudiadau rhwng y prif grwpiau gwariant, rhai ohonynt nad yw Janet Ryder yn amlwg wedi eu deall.

Rhoddir adnoddau sylweddol i wariant ar iechyd, yn benodol gwariant refeniw ar gyfer byrddau iechyd lleol. Pe bai modd sierhau y byddai gwariant o'r fath yn arwain at ganlyniadau mwy boddhaol i gleifion, yna byddai'n anodd beirniadu hynny. Fodd bynnag, nid ydym, hyd yn oed yn wrthrychol, yn gweld canlyniadau o'r fath'; mae rhestrau

lists continue to increase, as do waiting times. In her budget statement in October, the Minister announced that Mr Derek Wanless had been appointed to advise on a review of health and social care in Wales. We should not forget the advice that Mr Wanless gave in his report to the UK Government on the future of the NHS, which was that

'money on its own is not enough and provides no guarantee of success—it is essential that resources are efficiently and effectively used. Resources and reform must go hand in hand—both are vital. Neither will deliver without the other.'

With regard to that statement, one wonders whether increased expenditure is sensible, in the absence of the review that Mr Wanless is about to undertake.

Sir John Bourn has already voiced concerns about the proposed local health boards. We also heard about the memorandum to the First Minister from an official, which indicated that, in the official's opinion, NHS restructuring was likely to result in additional chaos, and that the cost of the exercise was still unknown. It appears that there will be additional costs to the restructuring; it will not be cost neutral, as was previously indicated. Will the Minister indicate this afternoon her current best estimate of the likely cost of the restructuring of the health service?

I would also be grateful if the Minister would indicate to the Assembly her opinion of the likely effect of increased national insurance contributions, which are due to commence at the beginning of the next financial year. Much of the increase in this budget, such as it is, will go straight back to the Treasury in the form of national insurance contributions.

One relatively small point that I feel is important, and which I would like to draw to the Minister's attention, is to do with flood protection. At a meeting of the North Wales Regional Committee earlier this year, there was an impressive presentation by a representative of the Environment Agency Wales. He said, in no uncertain terms, that, in

Bydd llawer o'r cynnydd yn y gyllideb hon, fel ag y mae, yn cael ei ad-dalu i'r Trysorlys yn syth ar ffurf cyfraniadau yswiriant gwladol.

his opinion, there was an underspend of some £2.6 million per annum in flood protection. That is a relatively small point in the context of a budget of this size, but I ask the Minister to take on board my concern that problems caused by a failure to secure flood protection measures are cumulative. If we do not spend sufficiently now, we will probably have to spend considerably more in the future to put right the consequences of the underspend. I ask the Minister to reconsider this item of the budget.

**Peter Black:** I welcome this budget, particularly the additional money for higher education, health and local government. It is a credit to the Minister that the budget is presented so transparently, that we can debate it in this way and that all the relevant information is made available to us. That is in stark contrast to the situation pre-devolution. I will refer briefly to Janet Ryder's comments on housing. I was interested to hear that the main plank in Plaid Cymru's manifesto will be a commitment to housing. Housing is important, but a balance must struck in the budget. It is easy to promise the money, but facing the reality of finding it is not so easy. We have heard that £2.9 billion needs to be spent on public sector housing. That sort of money is not available in the Assembly's budget. We must therefore consider private finance, as money cannot be taken from the health service or from education.

**David Davies:** I am astounded by this damascene conversion of a Liberal Democrat to the idea that Government coffers are not unlimited. Will you now advise the leader of the Liberal Democrats that increasing income tax by 1p will not help to pay for all the promises made in your national manifesto?

**Peter Black:** You are obviously reading different manifestos from ours, because we have never promised that. Our manifestos are costed and we have always said where the money would come from and how we would spend it.

Since 1992, we have spent more money on

the capital programme on housing. We are spending more money on the home energy efficiency scheme, on fire safety, on homelessness and a range of other issues, all of which are important in terms of the overall housing agenda. I will refer briefly to three other issues. The first is police funding. I wholeheartedly endorse Alison Halford's comments on police funding. It is iniquitous that £11.3 million is being top-sliced from our budget and returned to the Home Office for distribution by means of grants in England and Wales. Although the Welsh police forces can bid for that money, and may ultimately secure more money than would otherwise have been the case, there is no guarantee that that money will return to Wales. If it does return to Wales, it will be ringfenced or hypothecated so that it can only be spent on certain projects. We need more control over police funding in Wales and to be able to decide the crime and disorder agenda ourselves and direct the resources accordingly.

Secondly, I welcome the money in the budget for Supporting People. The £23 million will, hopefully, be adequate. However, the most important aspect of it is that it is being introduced as annually managed expenditure, which means that we can respond to the demands of the service and make adjustments as we go along. That gives us room to grow.

Thirdly, I welcome the extra resources for local government to deal with the pressures it is under. The Minister's announcement on substance misuse and the scheme in the Rhondda is particularly worth mentioning. It is important that we are now getting to grips with this agenda. We are putting additional resources into combating substance misuse. We are identifying where the money has gone over the past two years and ensuring that that money reaches treatment centres so that they can tackle this malaise which affects large parts of Wales, particularly deprived communities.

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** I call Phil Williams.

**Phil Williams:** I did not submit my name for

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** I have your name in front of me. I will cross it off the list.

**Brian Gibbons:** Thank you. I did submit my name by e-mail, I am glad to say. In response to David Ian Jones's contribution, a paper that went before the Health and Social Services Committee this morning deals with health service costs. If you read that, you will be better informed. You may not feel that all your questions are answered in it, but it addresses many of your concerns.

I never fail to be amazed by Plaid Cymru's gall. I was particularly amazed by Janet Ryder's contribution, which mentioned council tax in Plaid Cymru-run areas. A feature of this Assembly is that Plaid Cymru Members complain about services for which Plaid Cymru councils have responsibility. The main reason why those services are not delivered is probably that that Janet Ryder helpfully gave us, namely that the Plaid Cymru councillors are not prepared to take financial responsibility for the services for which Plaid Cymru Assembly Members are asking.

**Janet Ryder:** Thank you for giving me the opportunity to remind the Assembly of the tremendous debt in which years of having a Labour-run council left Rhondda Cynon Taf. The council has now successfully turned that around and, for the first time in many years, its accounts have been signed off and closed. No Labour-run council has achieved that in Rhondda for many years.

**Brian Gibbons:** That is because this Labour-led administration introduced the deprivation fund, of which the single biggest beneficiary is Rhondda Cynon Taf. Plaid Cymru failed to support that and in doing so it has also failed to give additional support to Merthyr, Blaenau Gwent, and Neath Port Talbot. The people will make their judgment.

**The Finance Minister (Edwina Hart):** I am

sure that many of us sympathise and agree with Alison's heartfelt points on police funding. I receive many questions from Members and from the public about the transparency of police funding and I feel, from the mood in the Chamber, that devolution of responsibility for the police will be a burning issue for the next Assembly.

I thank Peter Black for his contribution. He answered some of the points that I would otherwise have had to deal with. Brian Gibbons made the valuable point that some of the issues raised by David Ian Jones have been covered in the health paper that was before the Health and Social Service Committee today. You cannot put a price on democracy in the health service and we must consider that in terms of the 22 local health boards. I also read Derek Wanless's comments. He is reviewing the health service in Wales because we realise that this is not just about increasing expenditure; it is about increasing the effective use of money and examining the service's structures. I look forward to Derek Wanless's report and I hope that when we all, hopefully, return in May, we can implement the report's proposals and get an efficient and effective health service, given the money flowing through, and the changes that we need.

Local government and other bodies have debated the increase in national insurance and its impact on them. The generosity of the settlement in the total budget will allow them to accommodate this.

Sue Essex regularly raises the issue of the money available for flood protection with me, and I am sure that it will continue to be an issue in budget planning rounds. The underspends are small; I try to monitor them across the board. I do not like underspends, because they mean that you have not efficiently considered how money is spent. However, I assure you that we are acutely aware of the need for flood protection and that the Minister for Environment regularly raises the issue with me.

On Members' comments about what we have not done with regard to health and social services, the transfers in the health and social services budget are transparent. Members ask about social services; they should be well aware that the budget lines are being transferred into Cymorth, the children and youth support fund. That is a matter of record. This budget contains nothing that is not on record and that has not been discussed previously.

In reply to Janet Ryder's point about electioneering in Rhondda, I made it clear when I produced my final budget that I would make an announcement on this issue to the Assembly. Everything that I have announced in terms of higher education and other issues today was flagged up previously, as is right and proper, because I knew that I could not use the supplementary budget for electioneering purposes. I therefore put the changes on record last year. I reject your assumptions, Janet. If you were ever to get into power, you might play such games. However, I know that Labour will always be in power, and I do not play those games with money or with people's lives.

*the National Assembly for Wales welcomes the report on progress in sustainable development in 2002-03, presented by the Minister for Environment, which was emailed to Members on 19 March 2003, acknowledges the good progress made over the past year, and calls upon the Minister to publish a final report during April 2003, based upon this document. (NDM1445)*

Today, we are putting the finishing touches to the third statutory report on progress made towards sustainable development in Wales. Last week, Members received the draft of our annual report for 2002-03, which will be finalised after this debate and, as required by

Sustainable development is about ensuring a better quality of life for everyone now, and in generations to come, by seeking opportunities for simultaneous economic, environmental and social progress. I am proud of the action taken this year by, not only the Assembly, but a range of agencies and organisations in Wales, both at an international level and through practical achievements. Wales continues to lay the foundations for a more sustainable way of living and working, which will improve the quality of life for everyone in Wales, not just for this generation, but for those that will follow.

There was progress on the indicators on employment, education, crime, air quality, recycling and the Welsh language, and river quality remained good. The indicators that showed some decline—climate change, renewable energy and household waste per person—were based on figures compiled before 2002 and, therefore, do not reflect the current picture. We will have a more accurate picture next year. Our work on revising the sustainable development indicators has not yet been completed. However, we will drive that work forward in view of our obligation to renew the scheme after the election. We have reconvened the indicators working group to consider how to deal with this process. Other soon-to-be-published statistics on sustainable

development are also encouraging, particularly those on bathing water quality—a practical and symbolic indicator of the environment in Wales.

The majority of our scheme and action plan commitments has been, or is being, met. It is important that a Government responds to opportunities as well as to challenges. This year, inevitably, we have covered elements that are not in our action plan. We have exceeded all our expectations in terms of international activity: the Gauteng agreement was Wales's flagship this year. Members will remember that Rhodri Morgan signed that agreement at Johannesburg last year. Work on partnerships in Wales has also been strong; the concordat with Welsh local government was drawn up, for example.

Working with the public is also vital, and that matter was raised at the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee this morning. Public awareness is a key issue. We need to be in a position whereby people can be asked to take action and to make a contribution, so that they can make changes in their lives. They cannot do that in a vacuum. There is no point in urging people to act more sustainably unless they have the opportunity to do so. Raising awareness about waste is an obvious example of that. I have also commissioned preparatory work on a campaign based around the ecological footprint, which will be an opportunity to consider surveys of public awareness.

As regards our in-house activities, we take our responsibilities seriously. For example, in terms of green housekeeping, 70 per cent of the electricity that we buy is generated from renewable energy. We have also undertaken important work on mainstreaming sustainability. 'Well Being in Wales', a health document adopted by the Assembly last December, clearly highlights the contribution that the health service in Wales can make to sustainable development, bearing in mind that it is Wales's largest employer.

To summarise, we have learnt a great deal

since the scheme was created two and a half years ago. We are happy to share our experience and to listen to others. It is pleasing that our efforts are being recognised elsewhere. Jonathan Porritt, the chair of the Sustainable Development Commission, wrote last summer in the sustainable regions newsletter:

‘If anyone agrees with *The Economist’s* recent conclusion that sustainable development is ‘a rather woolly concept’, all very well in theory but impossible to put into practice, I’m putting them on the first train to Cardiff.... That’s not to say that Wales has all the answers to its serious and complex challenges.... But it does seem that Wales is trying to tackle these issues with gusto and tenacity, in a holistic, long-term way, looking for the mutually reinforcing economic, environmental and social benefits sustainable development requires.’

That is a telling remark. Jonathan Porritt is right—we do not have all the answers, but we are pursuing the sustainable development agenda seriously. I consider it a distinguishing feature of the Assembly.

Time is short, but I will mention a few key practical examples, because there are important practical examples behind the theory and the words. On transport, the concessionary fares scheme is about to be extended to men aged over 60. That is a good example of a social policy and a transport policy coming together, not only giving pensioners the opportunity to travel freely, but improving public transport in Wales. The waste strategy and dealing with waste sustainably are imperative. We are considering the supply and development of the markets. Brian Hancock gave us a good, practical example in Committee this morning of small and medium-sized enterprises in Wales that are already developing environmental products.

Tir Gofal is widely recognised, certainly at the European level, as an important sustainable agri-environmental scheme. The environmental development fund, or the

Mae hynny’n sylw grymus. Mae Jonathan Porritt yn iawn—nid yw’r holl atebion gennym, ond yr ydym yn mynd ar drywydd yr agenda datblygu cynaliadwy o ddifrif. Credaf ei fod yn nodwedd amlwg ar y Cynulliad.

Mae amser yn brin, ond crybwylaf ychydig o enghreifftiau ymarferol allweddol, gan fod enghreifftiau ymarferol pwysig y tu ôl i’r ddamcaniaeth a’r geiriau. Ar drafnidiaeth, mae'r cynllun tocynnau mantais ar fin cael ei ymestyn i ddynion dros 60 oed. Cydnabyddir Tir Gofal yn helaeth, yn arbennig ar y lefel Ewropeaidd, fel cynllun amaeth-amgylcheddol cynaliadwy pwysig. Mae’r gronfa datblygu economaidd, neu’r

sustainable development fund, has supported over 220 projects in national parks and areas of outstanding natural beauty, such as the Brecon Beacons Solar Club. There are many important initiatives on the ground. Cymru Ar-lein—Online for a Better Wales is a major initiative. Our business and environment action plan, recently launched by Andrew Davies, means that we are working with business, and puts us at the forefront of sustainable development. That gives us a stronger environmental goods and services business sector, and a much stronger green brand image on the world stage.

The Wales Tourist Board's 10-year strategy, 'Achieving our Potential', includes specific initiatives, such as the green sea partnership, which involves over 40 public, private and voluntary organisations, and the publication of a 'greening your business' guide. Integrating sustainable development into procurement is also important and we need to ensure that the Welsh procurement initiative comes through. Finally, on social housing, innovative work has been done through the social housing innovation programme, and on Rethinking Construction. These are just some of the huge number of examples of practice backing up the theory.

I will not support the amendments. We should not short-change ourselves in Wales. We have made big strides in two and a half years, including in the last 12 months, and we are starting to make a tangible difference. We have laid excellent foundations for the Assembly to build upon. Jocelyn, I think that I have explained that the legal situation means that we cannot publish the report until the end of the financial year. Therefore I will not support amendment 3. I will listen to Members' comments with great interest.

Mae Plaid Cymru yn cymryd datblygu cynaliadwy o ddifrif. Yr wyf wedi fy argyhoeddi bod y Gweinidog yn gwbl ddiffuant yn ei hymrwymiad i ddatblygu cynaliadwy. Fodd bynnag, yr ydym wedi cyflwyno'r gwelliannau hyn oherwydd nad oes unrhyw beth yn yr adroddiad hwn sy'n ein galluogi i weld beth yn union y mae'r Llywodraeth wedi ei gyflawni ar ddatblygu cynaliadwy. Mae gan y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol ymrwymiad statudol i ddatblygu cynaliadwy. Un o'r pethau mwyaf cynhyrfus ynglŷn â Deddf Llywodraeth Cymru 1998 yw bod yr ymrwymiad hwnnw wedi ei osod arnom. Plaid Cymru takes sustainable development seriously. I am convinced that the Minister is totally sincere in her commitment to sustainable development. However, we have tabled these amendments as there is nothing in this report that enables us to see what exactly the Government has achieved on sustainable development. The National Assembly has a statutory obligation as regards sustainable development. One of the most exciting aspects of the Government of Wales Act 1998 is that it imposes that commitment upon us. At one time, it was almost unique, but by now other political institutions have followed that lead and have assumed the same statutory obligation.

If we are to take sustainable development seriously, it must be central to everything that this institution does. That is the weakness and the failure on the Government's part. The Minister has referred, quite appropriately, to several individual schemes that have been put forward in the name of sustainable development. However, if we are serious about sustainability, it is not possible to tag it on to a policy area—it must be central to that policy area. The Minister for Economic Development may have introduced elements of sustainable development in one part of his area of responsibility, but the range of policies that he introduces are not sustainable. Economic development is not considered in terms of sustainability, as it is based on economic growth. We have to ask whether that is considered in a sustainable way, and the simple answer is 'no'. It is possible to refer to schemes that are accepted by local authorities, but Best Value, which is central to local government, completely undermines sustainability. I will refer to the section on the Welsh language, which underlines the weakness in the way that this Government approaches sustainable development. Linguistic growth is important, but if you want to make a language sustainable, you need more than just growth. You have to create the opportunities for people to use the language every day, and that is not in the policy at this time. There are good elements, but we are looking for sustainable development to underpin everything this Government does. That just does not happen at present.

**David Davies:** I propose amendment 4 in the name of Jonathan Morgan. Delete

*acknowledges the good progress made over*

term rather than for the long-term solution.

I will not apologise for proposing these amendments. Although we note that some steps have been taken, there is no evidence in the report that enables us to welcome what has been achieved. There is nothing in it that shows that. We are not even persuaded that the Minister has succeeded in persuading her colleagues to accept that sustainability should be fundamental to the development of policies—there are no indications of that. We call for a full report and a full set of indicators so that we can evaluate what the Government has achieved. They must also show clearly how sustainability is central to the Government's policies. We call for an attainable series of targets in key policy areas and a mechanism that will enable us to evaluate the way in which sustainability contributes towards policy development.

I begin by expressing my commitment to preserving the environment for future generations, repeating, as I often do, that the Conservative Party will not hesitate to support the Government when it introduces stronger environmental legislation that will be of practical use. he likes statistics—measured the environmental dimensions and gross domestic product per capita of countries such as Tanzania and Ethiopia, and placed those two near the bottom of the league both in the measurement of GDP per capita and in the environmental indices measuring quality of life. North American and western European countries came out near the top—and it is interesting to note that Canada was placed far ahead of the USA. The reason for those results is that it is only as countries get wealthier that they can afford to apply evermore stringent environmental standards. However, if the standards applied are so stringent that they begin to damage the economy, limit growth, or strangle the ability of businesses to make the profits that fund the taxes that pay for the legislation, the environment will undoubtedly suffer more.

**Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** It is often said that the Conservative Party knows the cost of everything, but the value of nothing. You have patently proved that during the last three minutes. You cannot buy a clean environment; you must develop policies to create one. When the Conservative Party decides to start defending and supporting such policies, you can start talking about sustainable development.

**David Davies:** You have just revealed the fundamental weakness in your political outlook. You can, and must, buy a cleaner environment. Yes, policies must be developed, but they must also be paid for. It is precisely because we can afford a cleaner environment that we have a better environment than many other countries in the developing world.

I wonder what stereotypes are conjured up by the following images: a multinational corporation, such as Esso, a voluntary organisation, such as Friends of the Earth, and a government body, such as the Environment Agency. I know what you think. You view the multinational as a large, faceless organisation run by businessmen who are only interested in generating vast profit. [ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Yes.'] It is fine that you feel that way, as it proves my

**David Davies:** I do not wish to have a running debate with you. No doubt, you also see pressure groups as being run on tiny budgets by dedicated idealists, and government organisations as being run by impartial and unbiased professionals. The reality is far more complicated than that. All those groups have their own vested interests. The multinationals have a vested interest in protecting their profits. However, we often forget that their directors are human beings, just like everyone else. They have families; they want to leave a legacy for future generations.

Larger pressure groups often have a budget of millions, and they also have a vested interest. The more people are concerned about the environment, the more likely they are to write out the cheques that pay the salaries—and, in some cases, large salaries—of the staff of these voluntary groups. Government organisations, such as the Environment Agency—which, overall, does a good job—also have a vested interest. The more they can talk up the problems, the more they can demand more funding from the relevant Minister.

That is not to attack any of those organisations, specifically or generically. In fact, I am a member of an environmental pressure group, Surfers against Sewage. I believe that such groups have played a hugely positive role in highlighting environmental problems, just as the Environment Agency has played its part in solving those problems. However, to unquestioningly swallow every statistic, to pass legislation as a result of scare stories, and to swallow all of the stereotypes—as you clearly have—is tremendously naive. If we are to become a respected institution, we must guard against knee-jerk legislation.

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. You must wind up.

### **Dadl Fer Short Debate**

#### **Rhaid Cadw Dyffryn Wysg i Genedlaethau'r Difodol Fedru ei Fwynhau The Usk Valley must be Preserved for the Enjoyment of Future Generations**

**David Davies:** I am grateful for the opportunity to introduce a short debate. I will allow contributions by Janet Davies, Eleanor Burnham and, if there is sufficient time, Kirsty Williams. If anyone else is interested in speaking, I will try to fit you in.

About a year ago, it became apparent that the Usk valley faced a potential threat from the possibility of sand and gravel extraction, or, in other words, quarrying. This became apparent from the consultation on the draft 'Minerals Technical Advice Note (Wales)—

Tua blwyddyn yn ôl, daeth yn amlwg bod Dyffryn Wysg yn wynebu perygl oherwydd y posiblirwydd o echdynnu tywod a graean, neu, mewn geiriau eraill, chwarelu. Daeth hyn yn amlwg o'r ymgynghoriad ar y Nodyn Cyngor Technegol ar Fwynau (Cymru)—

Aggregates', which required large areas of the Usk valley to be set aside for future sand and gravel extraction. [Interruption.]

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. Members are allowed to talk in the Chamber, and procedural arguments and discussions can take place, but they must be conducted quietly.

**David Davies:** Twenty-nine sites are listed, and they run through the Usk valley in the Monmouthshire County Council area and are also in parts of the Brecon Beacons National Park. It has been suggested that between 100,000 and 500,000 tonnes of sand could be extracted from these sites annually. The matter was discussed by Monmouthshire County Council, and local people quickly formed an action group to fight against these proposals. I spoke at a public meeting in June 2002, and was delighted with the strength of support for protecting the Usk valley that came from people from all over the county.

The current situation is that the vast majority of sand and gravel used in south Wales comes from dredging that takes place in the Bristol channel. The background to the decision to consider extraction from the Usk valley stems from an understandable concern over the effect that the current dredging in the channel is having on sand movement on beaches across south Wales.

I am more familiar than most with these beaches, particularly those that run from Nash Point to Langland Bay, as I have been surfing off them on a weekly, and sometimes daily, basis for the last 14 years. From my own observations, there appears to be some sand loss, particularly from Rest Bay and Porthcawl. However, many other factors could be responsible for this.

The whole of the Bristol channel area is subject to an extremely strong tidal pattern. The River Severn has the second highest tidal range in the world, and as a layman I can appreciate that strong tides, combined with waves that can regularly reach the beaches at heights of 10ft or more at certain times of the

**David Davies:** Rhestir naw safle ar hugain, ac maent yn rhedeg drwy ddyffryn Wysg yn ardal Cyngor Sir Sir Fynwy ac maent hefyd mewn rhannau o Barc Cenedlaethol Bannau Brycheiniog. Awgrymwyd y gallai rhwng 100,000 a 500,000 o dunelli o dywod gael eu hechdynnu o'r safleoedd hyn bob blwyddyn. Trafodwyd y mater gan Gyngor Sir Sir Fynwy, ac ni fu fawr o dro cyn i'r bobl leol sefydlu grŵp gweithredu i wrthwynebu'r cynigion hyn. Anerchais gyfarfod cyhoeddus ym mis Mehefin 2002, ac yr oeddwn yn falch iawn o weld maint y gefnogaeth tuag at ddiogelu dyffryn Wysg gan bobl o bob rhan o'r sir.

Y sefyllfa bresennol yw y daw'r rhan fwyaf o dywod a graean a ddefnyddir yn ne Cymru o dreillio sy'n digwydd ym Môr Hafren. Mae cefndir y penderfyniad i ystyried echdynnu o ddyffryn Wysg yn deillio o bryder dealladwy ynglŷn â'r effaith y mae'r treillio presennol ym Môr Hafren yn ei gael ar symudiadau tywod ar draethau ar draws de Cymru.

Yr wyf yn fwy cyfarwydd â'r traethau hyn na'r rhan fwyaf o'r bobl, yn arbennig y traethau sy'n rhedeg o Nash Point i Fae Langland, am fy mod wedi bod yn syrffio arnynt yn wythnosol, ac weithiau'n ddyddiol, dros yr 14 mlynedd diwethaf. O'r hyn yr wyf wedi'i weld, ymddengys bod rhywfaint o dywod wedi diflannu, yn arbennig o Rest Bay a Phorthcawl. Fodd bynnag, gallai llawer o ffactorau eraill fod yn gyfrifol am hyn.

year, will inevitably have an impact on sand movement.

However, I do not pretend to be an expert. All the expert advice that I have heard suggests to me that, if there is sand loss across all those beaches—it is a bit of an ‘if’—it could be due to a number of reasons. One way of getting expert opinion would be to undertake a further study, and that is why I fully support the bid made by Cardiff University’s school of engineering, which has a world-renowned expertise in measuring the different factors that affect sand movement around coastal areas.

If sand loss can be shown to be the result of dredging—that is a big ‘if’—there are three options. The first would be to stop sand and gravel extraction everywhere, but that cannot be done because we need sand for building purposes. The second option would be to stop dredging and rely on land-based extraction. The third option would be to replace the sand artificially, which is a relatively common and inexpensive procedure that is carried out on beaches around Europe and even in the UK.

If we have a problem, I would have thought that the last option would be the obvious course of action. However, the Assembly has instead opted to assume that there is a problem and then decide, without sufficient information, that the only way to solve the problem—which may not even exist—is to take the drastic course of action of putting in place a mechanism that would allow quarries to be set up throughout the Usk valley. Quite rightly, these proposals have been strongly resisted by the local authority and by the Brecon Beacons National Park. They will use the Assembly’s own regulations to argue against setting these areas aside. Paragraph 13 of ‘Minerals Planning Guidance (Wales)’ states that safeguarding areas requires that:

‘the location and quality of mineral is known, and that the environmental constraints associated with extraction have been considered.’

Neither of those two stipulations have been

met. The location and quality of material has not been properly documented. Of the 29 sites that are earmarked for being set aside, there is no bore-hole data for 15 of them. I have also been informed by experts, such as Professor Ron Bridle from Cardiff University's school of engineering, that the sand that could be extracted from the valley area is likely to be coarser and of a poorer quality, and therefore of less use to the building industry, than the sand that comes from the ocean—it depends upon the amount of movement and rubbing of particles that takes place.

On environmental constraints, despite all of its debates on sustainable development, the Assembly does not seem to care enough, because the Usk Valley is, without doubt, one of the most beautiful parts of Wales. Parts of the affected area lie within the national park, and the Usk river is a candidate for special area of conservation status. The valley is designated a special landscape area. Therefore, it should come as no surprise that tourism is the single biggest industry in the area in terms of generating employment and revenue.

If quarrying were allowed, all of those jobs would be under threat, as would the quality of life of everyone living in the area. The quarries would form a scar running the length of the valley. When I met representatives from Hanson plc to discuss how the effect could be mitigated, they accepted that, given the valley's topography, it would be difficult to hide the visual intrusion caused by the quarrying. There would also be noise, not only from the workings and explosions, but also from hundreds of lorries travelling up and down roads, some of which are already falling apart. Our valley would be polluted by dust and particles and our tourism-based economy would choke on the fumes, dust and noise.

At least one potential applicant has met me to discuss a proposed planning application. I am reliably informed that one large company is interested. There would currently be no grounds for considering such an application. However, if these areas were set aside for quarrying, a refusal of an application by the

local planning authority—the council or the parks, which certainly would refuse it—would lead to an appeal to the Assembly. The applicants would argue that setting aside these areas would be a good reason—a presumption, if you like—for allowing extraction to take place. We have all seen what happens at these public inquiries: an expensive barrister well-versed in planning law would be appointed by the large companies interested in quarrying and no-one could guarantee the outcome.

If these areas are left out of the unitary development plan, the Minister must accept that there will be no quarrying. However, if local authorities are forced to include them in the UDP, there may be quarries. We must assume that, at some point, there almost certainly will be. On behalf of everyone living in Monmouthshire, and those who care about our rural environment, I ask the Minister to reconsider this issue. Do not safeguard any parts of the Usk Valley for future quarrying developments, but safeguard it for future generations to enjoy.

**Janet Davies:** I thank David for allowing me to speak in this debate. We all agree that the Usk valley is beautiful and should be preserved for future generations. However, it is dangerous to set up the Usk Valley against the Gower when it comes to sand and gravel extraction because there are problems for both areas. We are not sure about the effects of extraction in the Bristol channel, but care must be taken on that.

It is crucial that we reduce the use of sand and gravel. People who want to build patios in their gardens and who want new roads should be aware that the effect is to increase the need for sand and gravel. We should use recycled materials wherever possible, accepting that it is not always possible. I agree with most of what David said. There is overkill on the number of safeguarded areas, and we should minimise that amount. Other factors are contributing to the degradation of the landscape in other areas of the Usk valley. The big plastic banners that were used

**Eleanor Burnham:** I am not an expert on the Usk valley, so my contribution will be brief. It is interesting to hear a Tory talking about these issues. I sat here in amazement because I thought that he would take a different slant, but I was badly briefed. However, it fascinates me that, in this pre-election period, the Tories are jumping up and down and talking about sustainable development. I apologise for not contributing to the previous debate on sustainable development, but the Assembly is upholding it. Sue Essex has piloted many excellent schemes, and I have no doubt that she will use her judgment and experience to ensure that the problems of the Usk valley and of the Bristol channel, which are just as worrying, are eliminated.

**Kirsty Williams:** I declare an interest. My husband owns 200 acres of agricultural land alongside the river Usk. I share David Davies's concerns. The community councils in Llangynidr, Talybont-on-Usk, and Cradoc are deeply concerned about what these proposals could mean for those parts of the national park. It is incomprehensible that an area, which is included in the national park because it is important, should be exposed to developments of this kind. My constituents are worried. When this was discussed previously, I asked the Minister to write to the community councils in my constituency that were concerned about this issue. She undertook to do that, and I would be grateful if she would confirm whether or not she did so.

**The Minister for Environment (Sue Essex):** I am in a strange position here. I understood the title of this short debate to encompass a much wider issue. David, you concentrated on sand and gravel and, because we have had various discussions on that subject, I thought that you would want to raise wider issues relating to the Usk valley. I

hope that you will accept that I consider the sustainable development of the Usk valley in a much broader context. I know that sand and gravel is important to you and to residents, but there are so many other important factors with regard to the natural environment. I will run through some of them. I can understand the sentiment behind your speech, but we must consider the key factors of the sustainable future of the Usk valley, which are not just about sand and gravel. I assure you that Government structures, decisions, policies and programmes promote, improve and protect our natural and built environment. That does not mean preserving the whole of the Usk valley exactly as it is at present; in some areas, such as Newport, action is needed to upgrade and improve its features. The Usk valley encompasses the Brecon Beacons and extends all the way down to Newport and the estuary. I took that into account when considering the geographical background.

Making our actions sustainable is not an easy task. Part of it means husbanding non-renewable resources, such as precious minerals for future generations. Like all sand and gravel areas in the UK, Monmouthshire must recognise and protect its scarce resources through the planning process. That is the nature of the sustainability. However, today I wish to celebrate, under a number of headings, the actions that the Assembly, in partnership with others, is taking to ensure that the beauty of the Usk valley is retained and promoted and can be enjoyed for a long time to come.

The geology of the Usk valley makes it special. It has been created by glaciers, with terraces cut into the side of the valley. That, combined with the agricultural input over the years, makes it a special landscape. It is domestic, yet it has a dramatic hillside setting.

Landscape conservation is imperative. I am sure that Monmouthshire's unitary development plan, and the UDPs of the surrounding area, will be protected. Nature

conservation relates to the natural environment. In the Usk valley, there are a number of sites that are important for nature conservation. These sites and the related legislation provide the local authority with a wonderful opportunity to protect the flora and fauna. All UDPs should be used to identify them and to outline appropriate policies for where development proposals might impact on their areas. There are several candidates for special areas of conservation and sites of special scientific interest. The floodplains support some bird interest, particularly the lapwing and over-wintering wading birds. Riparian habitats also protect those. You must look at the total natural environment of the Usk valley—from Brecon, and the area where the springs arise, down to the Severn estuary—to get an overall picture of the value of this unique landscape.

Access to the countryside is particularly important. If the countryside is to be protected and secured in the way that you want, people must enjoy rights of way and opportunities for access. I was pleased to hear that a Monmouthshire local access forum, among others, is being formed in the Usk valley area. These fora have an important role to play in identifying access opportunities. The Usk valley walk is 50 miles long and runs from Caerleon to Brecon. The Usk valley walk partnership, Newport City Council, Monmouthshire County Council, the Brecon Beacons national park and British Waterways have attracted funding to update and improve the entire route. If we believe in sustainability for future generations, it is crucial that people have the opportunity to enjoy access to a particularly splendid landscape. The river quality of the Usk is crucial. The Environment Agency's monitoring shows that the River Usk meets the highest water quality standards. Action is being taken to tackle threats to the quality of the river: for example, a number of sewage treatment works in the area are being improved as part of Dŵr Cymru's environment programme. Actions being taken to reduce diffuse pollution include the designation of the great spring and the nitrate-vulnerable zone. I think that either Eleanor Burnham or Janet Davies mentioned that.

Mae gwaith monitro Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd yn dangos bod Afon Wysg yn bodloni'r safonau ansawdd dŵr uchaf. Mae camau'n cael eu cymryd i fynd i'r afael â bygythiadau i ansawdd yr afon: er enghraifft, mae nifer o weithfeydd trin carthion yn yr ardal yn cael eu gwella fel rhan o raglen amgylchedd Dŵr Cymru. Ymhliith y camau sy'n cael eu cymryd i leihau llygredd gwasgaredig mae nodi ardal y prif ffrydiau a'r ardal sy'n agored i nitradau. Credaf fod naill ai Eleanor Burnham neu Janet Davies wedi crybwyllynny.

A range of issues need to be considered in addition to the particular points that David is worried about. We need to see this as a whole. Clearly the unitary development plans of all local authorities are crucial, and we need to ensure that the environment is sustainable for the future. I will listen to the points that you have raised. You have made them before and Kirsty has made them too. I will check the position with the community councils and we will continue this dialogue. Together we have to find a way to protect our natural resources in a way that respects local communities and the environment. It is not about exploitation, but defining areas and resources that we must protect for future generations. I understand that people feel worried, and we will continue to be vigilant to ensure that we get the right wording and the right approach to these and other sensitive issues in south Wales.

Deallaf fod pobl yn poeni, a byddwn yn parhau i fod yn ofalus er mwyn sicrhau ein bod yn mynegi hyn yn gywir ac yn mabwysiadu'r ymagwedd gywir wrth drafod y materion hyn a materion sensitif eraill yn ne Cymru.
