# Objectives of the Horse Welfare Board

- To achieve the best welfare outcomes possible for horses involved in British racing
- To set out a vision and multi-year plan for horse welfare, based on shared industry priorities
- To engage racing in the development of an industry strategy
- To commission new projects and initiatives that may be required to deliver the plan
- To continue to improve the safety of racehorses
- To ensure **effective use** of the sport's resources to achieve the vision
- To ensure the sport benefits from an independent perspective on horse welfare, with a clear role for animal welfare bodies
- To ensure more effective communication and engagement around equine welfare

## Outcomes

- 1. Best possible QUALITY OF LIFE
- 2. Collective LIFETIME RESPONSIBILITY
- 3. Best possible **SAFETY**
- 4. Growth and maintenance of TRUST



# Best Possible Safety

- Continued, continuous improvement of obstacle design and structure, focusing firstly on safer hurdle design and obstacle visibility
- Review of stalls design, loading procedures and jumps starting procedure to provide reassurance and address negative perceptions
- Further research into ground and going to build a common framework to be applied to racecourses and training surfaces
- Encourage continuous learning and participant engagement
