Thank you for the opportunity to offer feedback. Here are Isle of Anglesey's comments.

There are 10 disused coal mines on the island, all privately owned and sitting within categories A and B (very unlikely and unlikely potential to impact public safety).

I do not keep data on abandoned quarry tips, but there are at least two within our ownership/control (Holyhead Breakwater Country Park and Twr Quarry, Holyhead). I would expect that these are also unlikely to impact public safety.
