# REQUEST FOR INFORMATION 2016-563424

We acknowledge your request for information asking the following:

"Are there any provisions in Scottish Parliament regulations for any Members to claim accommodation costs within Scotland if they do not live in Scotland? To clarify, would hypothetically, a member of the Parliament who was living in England be able to claim accommodation costs in Edinburgh and elsewhere in Scotland (as part of their duties as an MSP?)"

Your request was received on 15 July 2016 and has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

No provision is made within the Reimbursement of Members' Expenses Scheme to meet overnight expenses incurred while staying in Edinburgh by a Member whose main residence is not located in Scotland.

All members are entitled to the reimbursement of costs of overnight accommodation outside Edinburgh but within the UK when the performance of parliamentary duties prevents the member from using the member's main residence or any other residence.
